Visit Tucson is committed to fostering a welcoming, resilient, and sustainable tourism future for all.



Sustainability in Planning and Operations

- Develop and implement a comprehensive three-year sustainability strategy addressing environmental, social, and economic goals.
- Review progress twice annually and communicate updates through public channels.
- Train Visit Tucson staff in sustainable travel practices, including carbon literacy.



Building Partner Capacity

- Collaborate with Green Key Global and other certifiers to provide training for hotels and industry partners, aiming to boost certification rates.
- Offer toolkits, guides, and recommended sustainability policies for tourism businesses.
- Encourage participation in existing circular economy programs (like reducing single-use products and food waste).
- Promote cultural and natural heritage preservation through education and visitor management resources.
- Engage residents and industry partners in decision-making and maintain open feedback channels.

Expanding Sustainable Experiences

- Equip meeting planners with resources for climate-conscious events, such as guides for reducing waste and calculating carbon impacts.
- Provide tourism partners with carbon awareness training and promote lowcarbon travel experiences, including car-free itineraries and plant-based dining.
- Curate and promote sustainable travel experiences and voluntourism opportunities for leisure visitors.
- Support key heritage tourism projects that focus on environmental and cultural stewardship.



Measuring and Reporting Impact

- Establish a transparent system to monitor economic, environmental, and social sustainability indicators, including community sentiment and diversity.
- Publicly report progress annually, ensuring accountability and ongoing improvement.
