1. Pope-Leighey House • Fairfax
Tour the 1940’s home designed by Frank Lloyd Wright, who is often considered America’s most famous architect.

2. Washington & Old Dominion Trail • Arlington & Loudoun Counties
This 45-mile trail, often called the skinniest park in Virginia, runs from Shirlington to Purcellville, and can be traversed by foot, bike, skates, or horseback.

3. LoCo Ale Trail • Loudoun County
Grab an Ale Trail Passport and collect stamps as you visit 30+ taprooms that vary from urban breweries to farm beer gardens and mountain-top beer halls.

4. Eden Center • Falls Church
Welcome to the largest Vietnamese shopping center on the East Coast. Experience more than 120 family-owned restaurants, bakeries, boutiques, and grocers.

5. Carl’s Frozen Custard • Fredericksburg
This cash-only local favorite has been serving frozen custard since 1947. They say the secret is in their machines, which unlike newer models, don’t pump air into the ice cream, but we’ll let you decide.

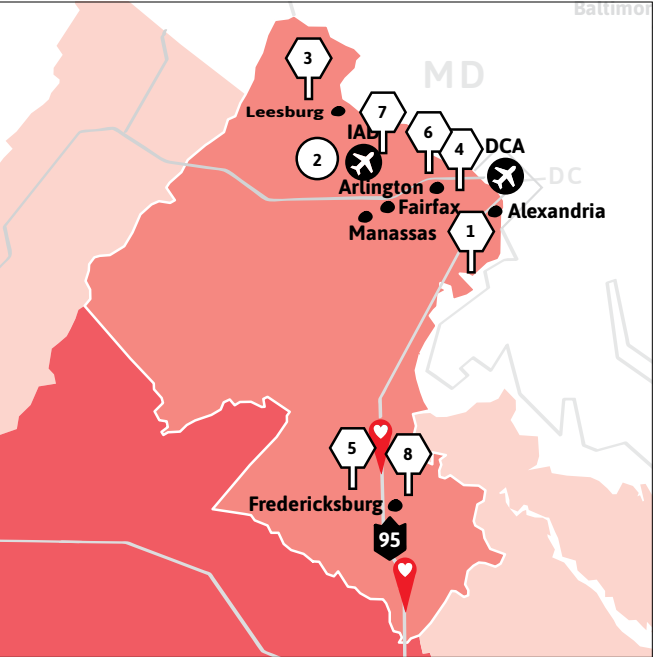

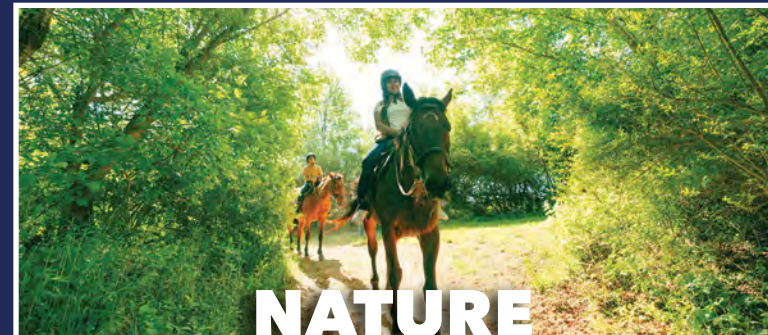
