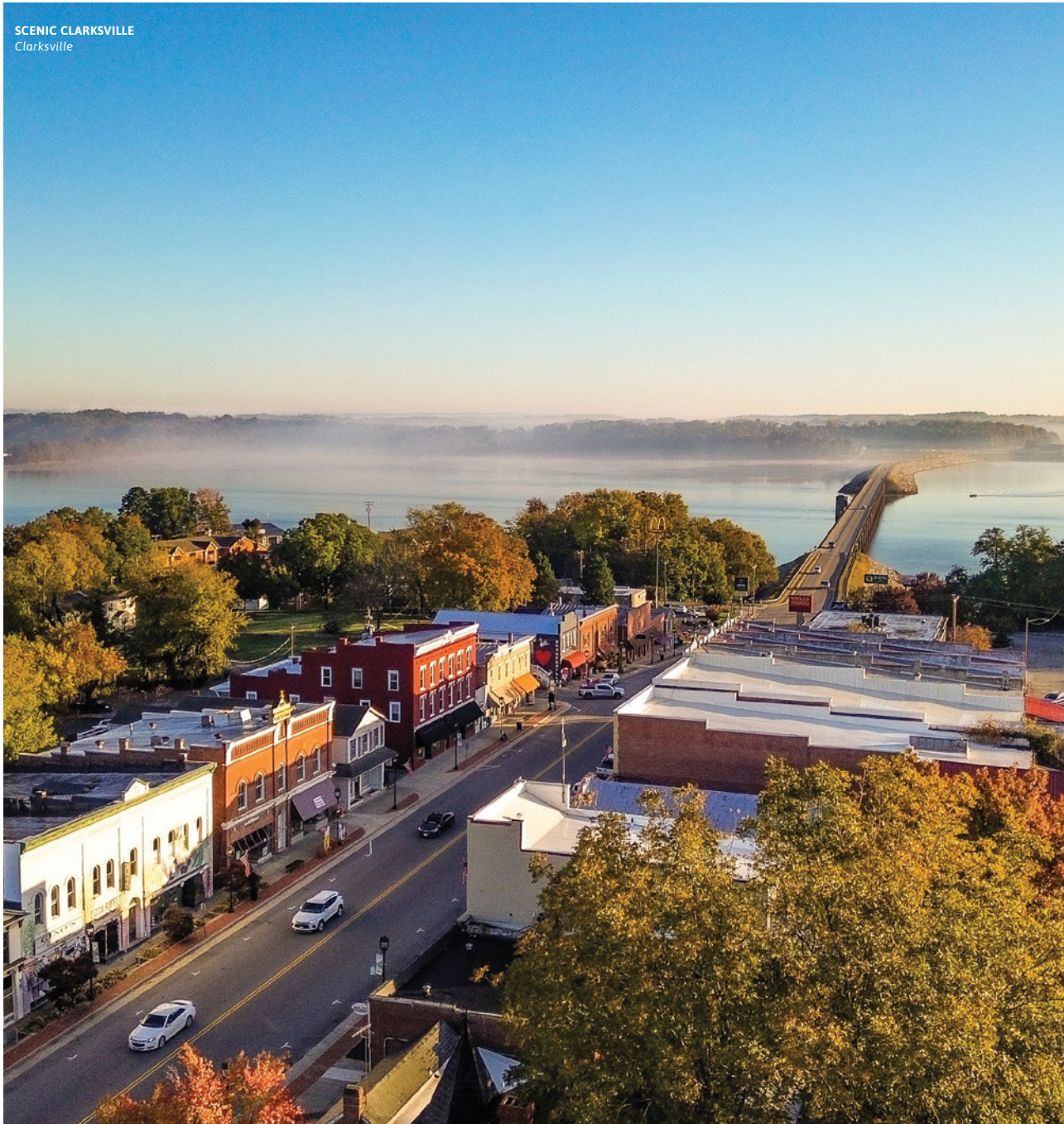
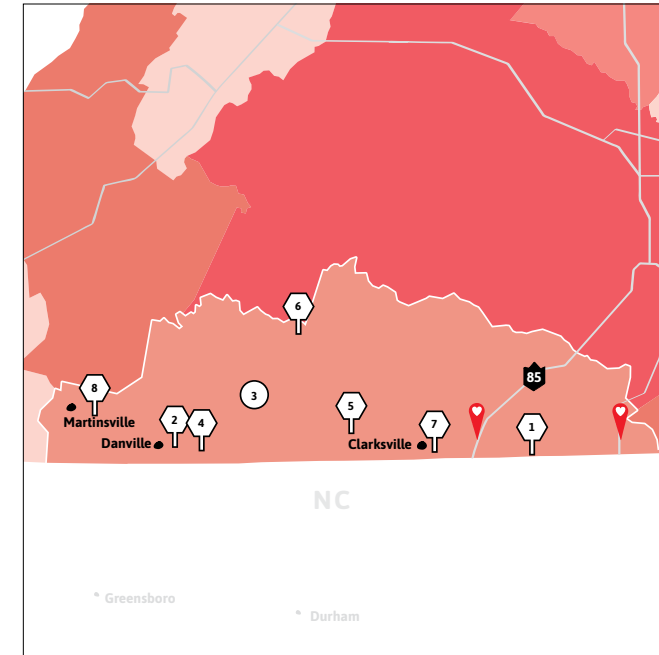


SOUTHERN VIRGINIA

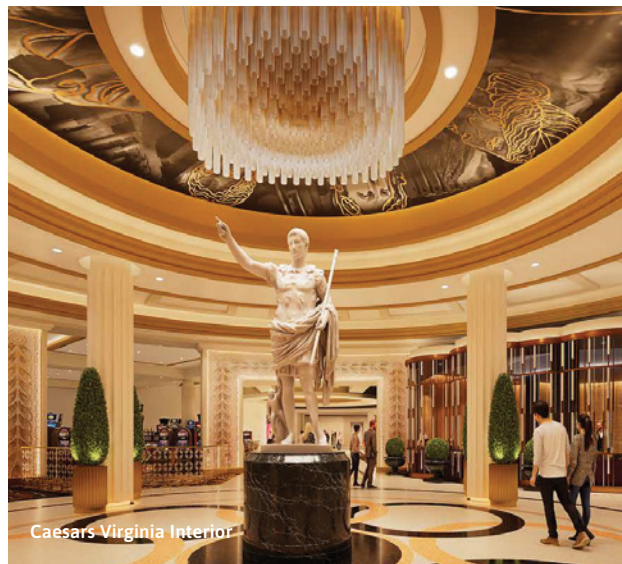

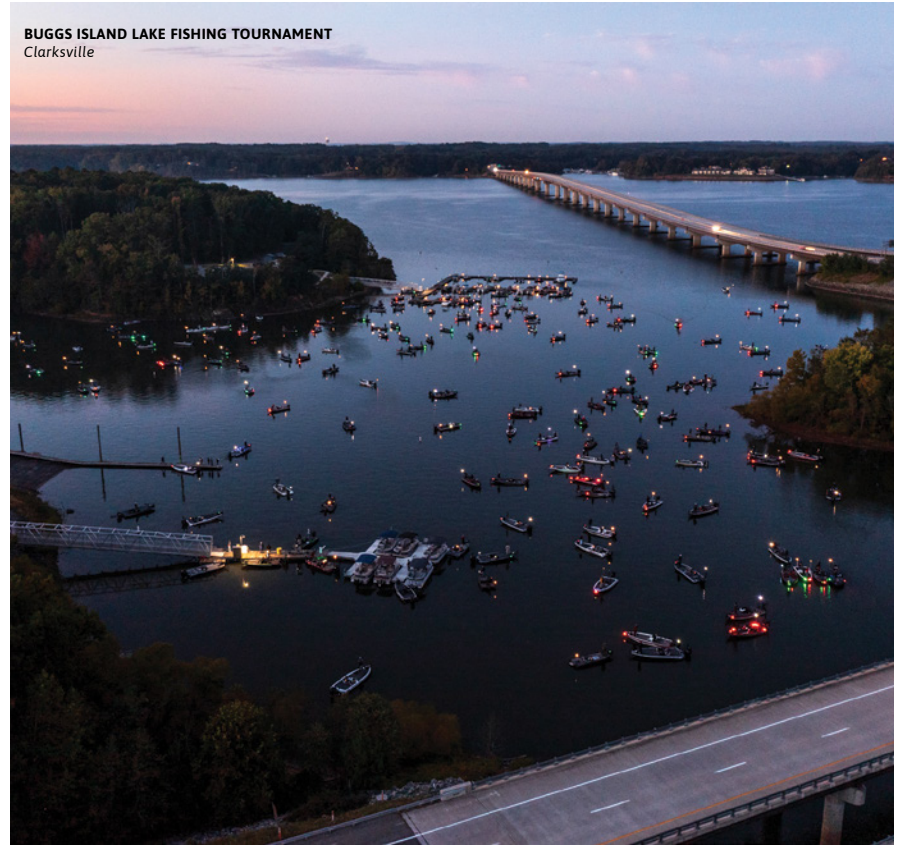

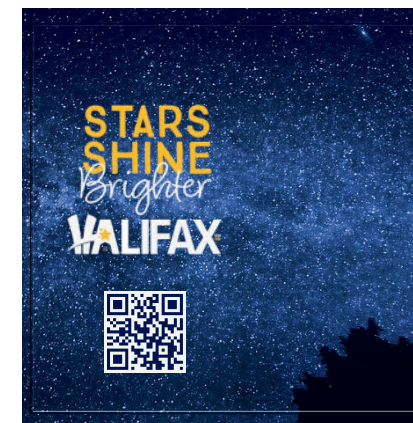
