





## EXPERIENCES THAT DEFINE THE REGION


**The Wine**  
When we think Central Virginia, we think wineries. This region holds a wealth of wine culture with views, bottles and bites to beat. From Cab Franc to Merlot, 12 Ridge's 360-degree views to Early Mountain's nationally acclaimed tasting room, there's something for everyone to sip and savor.

**Richmond's Local Art Scene**  
With a top-ranked art school at its core, it's no wonder that Richmond has a brilliant local arts scene. Just by foot, you can discover galleries, street art and art pop-ups, with many that are free for the public to enjoy. If you're in town on the first Friday of the month, don't miss RVA First Friday Art Stroll in the Arts District.


