

2. Getting Around

Virginia Airports

If you're flying in for World Pride 2025, you'll likely arrive at one of two major airports located in Virginia: Dulles International Airport (IAD) or Reagan National Airport (DCA). Here's a breakdown of what to expect at each airport and how to get around from there.

1. Washington Dulles International Airport (IAD)

Located about 26 miles west of Washington, D.C., in Chantilly, Virginia, Dulles offers the largest number of direct flights to the region for international travelers. If coming from abroad to join the celebrations, Dulles offers a spacious, modern terminal designed to handle high volumes of international passengers.

2. Reagan National Airport (DCA)

If you're flying domestically, Reagan National is likely your best option. It's located in Arlington, Virginia just across the Potomac River from Washington D.C. and is smaller and more convenient for domestic travelers. It's also known for its quick access to the city.


World Pride 2025 will likely have a significant impact on how people get around due to increased demand for transportation, potential street closures, and festivities taking place across the city and nearby areas. Here's practical advice on the main ground transportation methods:

Public Transit

Especially during World Pride 2025, public transit will likely be one of the most efficient ways to get around, as many streets may be closed for parades, rallies, and other celebrations.

Metro (Washington Metro Area Transit Authority)

- **Routes:** The Metro's Orange, Silver, Yellow, and Blue Lines serve parts of Northern Virginia, Maryland and Washington D.C. Major Virginia stops include Reston, Tysons Corner, Arlington, Rosslyn, Pentagon City, and Alexandria.
- **o Dulles International Airport:** The newest extension of the Silver Line now connects Dulles International Airport directly to downtown Washington, D.C. with stops in Virginia along the way.
- **o Reagan National Airport:** Reagan National is directly connected to the Blue and Yellow Metro Lines, making it easy to reach World Pride events.
- **Connections:** These lines provide direct access from points in Virginia to D.C. locations like downtown, the National Mall, and Union Station.
- **Cost:** Fares depend on the time of day and distance traveled but are generally affordable with a max fare of \$6.75.
- **Tip:** <u>SmarTrip cards</u> are required for each rider aged 5 and older (up to two children under age five may travel free with each fare paying adult). You can also use the WMATA app for real-time arrival information and route planning.



Bus Services

- <u>Metrobus</u>: Covers much of the area not served by the Metro and operates numerous routes between D.C. and Virginia. Routes can connect you to places not easily reachable by Metro rail.
- Fairfax Connector and ART (Arlington Transit): These local bus services are good options for getting around Virginia, connecting to Metro stations and areas beyond the immediate urban core.
- <u>Amtrak</u>: Ideal for traveling between D.C. and farther regions in Virginia (like Richmond, Charlottesville, or Hampton Roads).

Car Rentals and Driving

Driving may be more challenging during World Pride due to increased traffic, road closures, and limited parking in key areas where events are held.

Car Rentals

- **Availability:** Major car rental companies like Enterprise, Hertz, and Budget have locations in both D.C. and Virginia, including at Dulles International Airport (IAD) and Reagan National Airport (DCA)
- **Traffic Considerations:** Traffic between D.C. and Virginia, especially during peak hours, can be congested. The Capital Beltway (I-495) and I-66 are frequently busy during rush hour and finding parking in D.C. can be difficult. Be prepared for tolls on some Virginia highways like I-66 inside the Beltway and express lanes on I-495 and I-395.
- **Parking:** Street parking can be challenging in D.C., but there are parking garages available. Virginia tends to have easier parking, especially in suburban areas, but urban areas like Arlington and Alexandria may still require parking fees.

 Ride-Sharing Services
- Options: Uber and Lyft are widely available and provide convenient point-to-point service.
- **Cost:** Prices vary depending on traffic and demand, but generally, ride-shares can be expensive during peak hours. They are an excellent option for shorter trips or when public transit is inconvenient.

Biking



Biking could be one of the most convenient and flexible ways to navigate D.C. and Virginia during World Pride, as it allows you to avoid traffic and street closures.

Bike-Friendly Routes

- **Key Bridge and 14th Street Bridge:** These bridges connect D.C. to Virginia and are equipped with bike lanes.
- <u>Mount Vernon Trail:</u> A scenic, multi-use trail that runs alongside the Potomac River, connecting D.C. to Northern Virginia, with easy access to places like Arlington, Crystal City, and Alexandria.

Bike Rentals and Bike Sharing

- <u>Capital Bikeshare</u>: Available throughout D.C. and Northern Virginia, is a quick and easy way to rent bikes on an as-needed basis. There are numerous docking stations, especially in Arlington and Alexandria.
- **Private Rentals:** Companies like Lime and Bird offer e-bikes and scooters for rent, which are convenient for shorter distances.
- <u>Unlimited Biking</u>: Featuring a huge inventor high-quality bikes in a wide range of sizes to ensure comfort and safety. Unlimited Biking will arm you with all you need for your adventure, including a helmet, a color-coded map, a bike bag, and a bike lock. There are multiple store locations for different pick up and drop off options.

Water Taxi



<u>City Cruises</u>: The water taxi service offers routes connecting The Wharf to Georgetown, Old Town Alexandria, and National Harbor along the Potomac River, with scenic views and audio narration on select tours. ADA-compliant boats are available, although Georgetown Dock is not accessible for wheelchairs. Pets are not allowed, except for service dogs. Audio tours are available for download through the City Experiences app.

Reservations can be made online or at ticket booths, with advance booking recommended.

Departure times vary depending on location and day, with services starting from The Wharf at 11:45 am and departing every 30 minutes to an hour.

The docking locations include:

- The Wharf: Transit Pier, 950 Wharf St SW, Washington, DC
- Georgetown: 3100 K St NW, Washington, DC (not wheelchair accessible)
- Alexandria: O Cameron St, Alexandria, VA (behind the Torpedo Factory Art Center)
- National Harbor: 145 National Plaza, National Harbor, MD

Trip times range from 30 to 45 minutes depending on the route.

3. Top Nearby Virginia Destinations during World Pride NORTHERN VA

City of Alexandria (Northern VA)



Located on the Potomac River within eyesight of Washington, D.C, Alexandria, Virginia welcomes LGBTQI+ couples, families and friends to this historic city. Named one of Travel + Leisure's Best Places to Travel in 2023, one of The South's Best Cities 2024 by Southern Living and given a perfect score for LGBTQ equality by the Human Rights Campaign Municipality Equality Index in 2023, Alexandria is nationally recognized for its rich history and beautifully preserved 18th- and 19th-century architecture—a perfect backdrop for hundreds of independent restaurants and boutiques, a vibrant arts and culture scene, and a welcoming, walkable getaway.

• Special Stays, Deals and Packages:

Hotel Heron (valid from May 1 to June 30, 2025):

The <u>"Allies of Alexandria" package</u> includes late check-out, custom swag and a specialty cocktail on the rooftop. One dollar from each cocktail sold will go to the LGBT Meeting Professionals Association, an Alexandria-based group dedicated to empowering LGBTQ+ professionals in the meetings industry.

Hotel AKA Alexandria (valid from May 23 to Dec. 31, 2025):

The "Celebrate with Pride" package offers guests a two-night stay with perks like round-trip City Cruises' water taxi tickets to D.C., Pride accessories, cocktails and a disposable camera. A portion of the proceeds from the specialty cocktails will benefit Safe Space NOVA, supporting a safe, inclusive environment for LGBTQIA+ youth in Northern Virginia.

Morrison House and The Alexandrian (both valid from May 21 to June 30, 2025): The WorldPride package at both hotels includes drink vouchers for specialty cocktails, a welcome tote and a \$10 preloaded Metro pass to D.C. For each package sold, a \$10 donation will go to Safe Space NOVA.

Pride Events, Activities and More

On June 13, head to the free <u>Pride at Torpedo Factory Art Center</u> event to explore hundreds of artists and enjoy music and art activations celebrating Pride Month.

Head to **Port City Brewing Company** in the West End on June 14 for the **Priday Market & Drag Show** featuring a mini-market of LGBTQ+ vendors from 12 to 4 p.m., plus food trucks, local beer and a drag show at 5 p.m. A portion of beer sales will be donated to Equality NoVA.

Stay tuned for the official date of the **8th Annual Alexandria Pride Fair** where guests can enjoy an LGBTQ+ family story time, art and poetry workshops, music, refreshments and LGBTQ+ Pride swag. Plus, guests will have access to LGBTQ+ inclusive services along with free and confidential health testing and vaccines.



Arlington County (Northern VA)



Arlington sits directly across the Potomac River from Washington, D.C., in the Northern Virginia region. It is the site for the famous **Arlington National Cemetery**, established as an American military cemetery during the Civil War. Bikers can enjoy the 23-mile self-guided tour of Arlington with 12 stops to learn history along the way. **The Mount Vernon Trail** is a popular multi-use trail that follows along the Potomac from DC to George Washington's Estate.

Charlottesville (Central VA)

Harrisonburg (Shenandoah Valley)


Harrisonburg, Virginia, offers a welcoming and intimate atmosphere for LGBTQ+ travelers seeking vibrant pride celebrations without the overwhelming crowds of larger cities. A highlight of the city's LGBTQ+ events is the annual **Shenandoah Valley Pride Festival**, typically held in September at Court Square in downtown Harrisonburg, featuring music, drag performances, and a variety of vendor booths.

For ongoing community engagement the <u>Friendly City Safe Space</u>, established in November 2021, serves as a hub for LGBTQ+ individuals and allies, providing resources, education, and a sense of community. The <u>Shenandoah LGBTQ Center</u> hosts regular events, including monthly Pride Nights in collaboration with local venues like <u>Sage Bird Ciderworks</u>, fostering social connections in a relaxed setting.

Additionally, the annual Miss Gay Harrisonburg Pageant showcases regional drag talent, offering entertainment and cultural enrichment at the Court Square Theater. Local establishments such as <u>The Golden Pony</u> are known for their LGBTQ-friendly environments, providing inclusive spaces for dining and socializing.

Staunton (Shenandoah Valley)

Tucked in the Shenandoah Valley, Staunton (pronounced "Stan-ton") offers a lively yet laid-back destination for celebrating LGBTQ+ pride in a charming, small-town setting. The city's marquee event, **Staunton Pride**, returns October 11, 2025, to Gypsy Hill Park, promising a full day of music, drag, food trucks, family activities, and a vibrant vendor market. Visitors looking for a slower pace will enjoy exploring Staunton's walkable downtown, filled with LGBTQ+-friendly businesses, cozy cafés, and welcoming art galleries. Staunton Pride works year-round to foster inclusivity and visibility in the community, not just during the festival season. Locals and visitors alike can connect through smaller gatherings and pop-up events, or during the **Queens City Mischeif & Magic** weekend, or the unique **American Shakespere Center**.



Fredericksburg (Northern VA)

Fredericksburg blends historic charm with a growing LGBTQ+ scene that makes it an appealing getaway for Pride travelers looking for something more relaxed. This year's FXBG Pride Festival takes over Riverfront Park on June 28, offering live performances, community booths, and activities that highlight the city's inclusive spirit. But Pride in Fredericksburg isn't limited to just one day—ongoing programs at the FAHASS Pride Center keep the momentum going with game nights, peer groups, and educational workshops. The Fredericksburg Area Museum adds another layer with "Out and About," an exhibit running through summer 2026 that shines a light on the region's queer history. Around town, you'll find a variety of LGBTQIA+-owned and allied businesses, from vibrant salons to cozy cafés, all adding to the city's open and creative vibe. Evenings can be spent enjoying quirky events like drag bingo at Haley's Honey Meadery or catching a show at a local venue. The city's size makes it easy to explore, and its community-minded energy ensures everyone feels seen. For travelers wanting a Pride experience that's both meaningful and manageable, Fredericksburg is a hidden gem worth discovering.
