



Virginia is centrally located along the east coast of the United States and home to the two main airports serving the nation's capital, Washington Dulles International (IAD) and Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport (DCA). Connectivity to D.C. is facilitated by the Washington Metro, with the Metrorail Silver Line extension connecting to Washington Dulles International. For DCA arrivals, you're only a few stops from Alexandria via the Metro's Blue Line service.

Amtrak Virginia operates nine passenger rail routes, linking over 23 stations across the Commonwealth and providing a convenient connection to the Northeast Corridor, reaching as far as Boston.

Hop on the train for a leisurely journey featuring spacious and cozy reclining seats, ample legroom, complimentary Wi-Fi, delicious meals for purchase and convenient in-seat power outlets.
