**HISTORIC DOWNTOWN  
EDMOND FACTS**

- With her pistol tucked in her waistband and claim stakes in hand, Nanitta R. H. Daisey jumped from a moving train and was one of the first to stake her homestead claim on April 22, 1889.
- The 1889 Territorial Schoolhouse was the first schoolhouse built in Oklahoma County.
- Othello's Italian restaurant opened in 2000. It was previously the Joyland Airdome Theatre in 1924, Broncho Theatre in 1936, and the Edmond Hospital in 1947.
- Edmond has 13.4 miles of Route 66 and passes by several landmarks including the Blue Hippo, Old North, 1889 Territorial Schoolhouse and Arcadia Lake.
- Edmond's train depot was torn down in 1967. Today, cars driving under the train bridge on 2nd street pass directly underneath the footprint of the old station.
- The Edmond Ice Company opened in 1910. The Creamery building was completed in 1921. The Ice House Project preserved this historic site into a venue space, restaurants and an urban farm.
- The Edmond Armonry was built by the Works Progress Administration (WPA) using native sandstone. In 1983, it became the home of the Edmond History Museum and was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1991.
