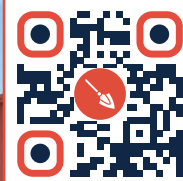

Pennsylvania Trolley Museum Unveils New Welcome & Education Center

2024 marks a milestone year for the Pennsylvania Trolley Museum, which had its beginnings in Washington County over 70 years ago when the first trolleys arrived at its site near the Washington County Fairgrounds. What started with just three trolleys in 1954, is now a collection of 52 historic railway cars, 130 active volunteers and over 38,000 visitors last year. The Pennsylvania Trolley Museum continues to expand and modernize as they embrace their mission to educate and enlighten visitors from around the world on the important history of the Trolley Era.

With the grand opening of its Welcome & Education Center late last year, the Pennsylvania Trolley Museum is poised to enter its eighth decade as a top tourist attraction and educational destination in the region. If you have not been in a while, come back. This is a whole new museum that has something for everyone from all generations.

The Welcome & Education Center is a brand new 21,000 square foot building complete with beautiful architecture, natural light and educational exhibits. A gallery displays unique artifacts that date back several decades, including trolley signage, an authentic trolley driver uniform and even the original clock from Pittsburgh's Penn Station. There are also embedded videos throughout the space that give visitors a deeper understanding of this significant time in history.

Children and adults alike enjoy the eight new interactive exhibits created in partnership with the Daniel G. and Carole L. Kamin Science Center. Try your hand at being a trolley operator in the simulator or learn about power creation in the solar panel exhibit. In addition to an experiential component, each of these multigenerational exhibits includes a

historical description to further enhance the lesson. This portion of the Museum will continue to grow as seven new simulators are added over the next year.

Be sure to stop by the 20th Century Electric Railway Foundation Theater during your visit. Sit back, relax and enjoy learning about the history of trolleys in the region on a large 8 ft x 15 ft LED screen.

During your visit, you can not miss the Trolley Display Building, which houses approximately 25 historic rail vehicles that have been lovingly restored by volunteers. Climb aboard the restored trolleys and immerse yourself in what transportation was like at the turn of the century. Filled with one of a kind camera opportunities, have your photo taken in the trolley that was featured in an episode of Mister Rogers Neighborhood or pose on the Toledo Trolley Parlor Car from 1906 complete with plush velvet seats. A new addition to the Display Building is the high-level platform that gives guests access to some newly displayed cars at the Museum, like the high-speed bullet car that ran between Philadelphia & Norristown, PA.

No visit to the Pennsylvania Trolley Museum is complete without a trolley ride. With admission, every visitor to the Museum can experience both the four-mile interurban ride and the one-mile loop excursion on one of the fully restored antique trolleys.

Educational development is the cornerstone of the Pennsylvania Trolley Museum. With a full-time Manager of Educational Programs and STEAM on staff, as well as a dedicated classroom, the Pennsylvania Trolley Museum hosts school groups, scout troops and other organizations to learn and have fun at the Museum.

Kids look forward to the STEAM-focused summer camp series held at the Pennsylvania Trolley Museum every year. The camps take place over six weeks throughout the summer and are the perfect blend of history with hands-on STEAM activities to ensure that campers have a great time and learn something, too! All camps include a behind-the-scenes tour of the Museum and a trolley ride.

The Pennsylvania Trolley Museum hosts events throughout the year to keep families entertained.

Keep an eye out for the holiday focused events throughout the year. Bring your basket to the Pennsylvania Trolley Museum in March for the Bunny Trolley. Pick a pumpkin and enjoy fall activities during the October Pumpkin Trolley. And of course, sing holiday carols during the Santa Trolley in December.

These events are not just for kids! This May the Pennsylvania Trolley Museum will host its first ever Street Fair on Volunteer Boulevard, the 1930's themed brick street between the Welcome & Education Center and the Display Building. The Street Fair will take place on May 18th and 19th with a 1920s carnival theme. Stop by to enjoy the street acts, food trucks, music and other activities.

The Anything on Wheels event, which will take place on June 8th and 9th, is also a fan favorite. Come see dozens of antique and classic cars and other vehicles, while enjoying great food, throwback music and a night photo session with the trolleys.

With so much to do at the Pennsylvania Trolley Museum, make sure this is a stop on your list in 2024. And when you visit, remember the new address is 1 Electric Way, Washington, PA.

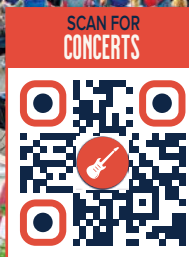

Rockin' On the Mon summer concert series kicks off with RiverFest

Nothing feels more like summer than listening to live music on the water. If spending time with friends, singing along to your favorite songs while you feel the breeze of the river is your thing, you will want to put the Rockin' on the Mon summer concert series at the Monongahela Aquatorium on your 2024 bucket list. A venue like no other in the region, the Monongahela Aquatorium is an outdoor amphitheater located right on the banks of the Monongahela River.

Built in 1969, the Monongahela Aquatorium was renovated in 2012 and the concert series was launched in 2013. Now a summer tradition in the Mon Valley, the Monongahela Aquatorium is powered by Aquatorium Innovations, an organization comprised completely of volunteers who have a passion for bringing the community together with live music.

"We are so proud to have this incredible venue in our city. Our board of directors works tirelessly to secure talent and entertainment that will drive tourism and

be an economic force in Monongahela," Tanya Chaney, President of Aquatorium Innovations said.

With bleacher seating for 3,700 guests, additional space for approximately 1,300 camping chairs, and an L-dock so boaters can dock their boats concert side and enjoy the festivities, the Monongahela Aquatorium is the focal point of summer fun in the Mon Valley.

The 2024 concert season will kick off on June 21st and 22nd with the first ever RiverFest presented by the Washington County Tourism Promotion Agency. This two-day, family friendly festival will showcase an exceptional lineup of bands, food trucks and hopefully summer sunshine. A DJ will keep the entertainment going between acts and you can challenge your friends to a round of corn hole or one of the other yard games that will be available on the festival grounds.

Weekly concerts will begin on June 29th and will take place every Saturday through August. Expect to see a blend of your favorite nationally known tribute bands and local acts grace the stage every week. Eagles tribute band 7 Bridges, Bob Seger tribute band Hollywood Nights, Beatles Tribute Band Come Together and southern rock band Six Gun Sally are just a sampling of the acts slated to headline this year. Follow the Monongahela Aquatorium on Facebook to keep up on the 2024 concert line up.

Be sure to bring your appetite when you come to the Aquatorium. Though outside food and drinks are not permitted, there are always at least two food trucks and beverage sales on site at each show.

Keep in mind that the concerts happen rain or shine, so do not let those rainy nights keep you away!

The gates open every Saturday at 6:00 and the acts take the stage at 7:30. There is a \$10 per person cover for the concerts. Tickets can be purchased in advance though monaquatorium.com and will also be on sale at the gate on show nights.

Though the concert series comes to a close at the end of August, the Monongahela Aquatorium keeps the events coming. The annual Monongahela Aquatorium Street Food Festival will take place on September 7th. Mark your calendar to stop by for a day of music, entertainment and over ten food trucks from across the region. There is no cover charge for this family friendly event.

Get in the Halloween spirit at the final event of the year at the Monongahela Aquatorium with WitchFest on October 19th. Halloween enthusiasts from all over make a trip to this unique, adult-only event that is the perfect combination of fun and eerie. Enjoy the food trucks, the music, and over 50 vendors selling their Halloween and witch-themed items. Let your inner witch out and participate in one of the highly anticipated witch themed contests. Win an award for best dressed, best hat and even best cackle. Though dressing the part is not a must, you will want to run home and grab your broom when you are dazzled by the unique costumes all around.

Whether you visit in the summer or let your spooky side out this fall, Monongahela Aquatorium is a hot spot that you will not want to miss!

ESCAPE TO THE OUTDOORS

Washington County's Parks for Every Explorer

With beautiful parks, trails and exceptional programming, get outside and enjoy nature in Washington County!

MINGO CREEK COUNTY PARK

Mingo Creek County Park, located in Eighty Four, is one of the most developed parks in the county filled with enough amenities to keep you and your family busy for days. Bring your bicycle, scooter or roller blades to cruise along the paved trail that passes through the interior of the park. On this scenic route, you will walk along the creek, pass two historic covered bridges and the kids will want to take a break to try out the ninja warrior course and the playgrounds.

If you would rather explore the wilderness, there are several wooded hiking trails, from an 11-mile trail around the perimeter of the park to smaller loops. With a permit, equestrians are welcome to bring their horses, too.

A pickleball court, a 12-hole disc golf course, a dog park, a pirate ship themed playground and a model airplane field for flying remote control airplanes and drones are just some of the other unique features you can find at Mingo.

Mingo Creek County Park hosts a full calendar of programs for little ones to adults throughout the year.

Preschoolers and school aged children get up close and personal with nature in immersive educational sessions. Examine tree bark with a magnifying glass, wade in the creek to identify aquatic critters and search for bugs and caterpillars in their natural habitats.

The summer day camps have a different focus each week and give your kids the

opportunity to spend time outdoors taking hikes, learning survival skills, panning for gold and experiencing all that nature has to offer.

The Mingo Creek Park Observatory, the largest amateur astronomical observatory in Southwestern Pennsylvania with a planetarium and two large permanent telescopes, holds Star Parties from May to November. Come view the moon, planets, and deep space objects with other aspiring astronomers.

Attend a Campfire Jam Night for an evening of acoustic music around the campfire. If you can play, feel free to bring your guitar and join the fun.

Mingo Creek County Park also hosts Yoga in the Park, speakers, group hikes, mushroom hunts, balloon blasting archery, nature trivia, bird watching and many other activities throughout the warmer months for adults and families.

Fall and winter activities such as wagon rides to see the foliage, trick or treat geocaching, a nighttime Owl Prowl to listen for owl sounds, gingerbread house decorating and a candy cane hunt round out the year of programming at Mingo.

CROSS CREEK COUNTY PARK

With entrances in both Avella and Hopewell Township, Cross Creek County Park is the largest park in Washington County covering over 300 acres and home to a 258 acre lake. Bring your boat, kayak or paddle board and spend the day on the water. A newly installed boardwalk and floating dock with three fishing piers is the perfect place to cast your line.

Your kids will enjoy the largest playground in the county on Thompson Hill as well

as the various stunts and jumps at the bicycle park. Cross Creek County Park is also home to trails and shelters for family picnics and parties.

See the leaves change colors on a wagon ride and experience the quiet of the water during the evening and morning group paddling sessions.

TEN MILE CREEK COUNTY PARK

Ten Mile Creek County Park, located in Clarksville, is known for its boat ramp and docks, and is a favorite park for anglers and kayakers in the region. Bring a picnic lunch, spend time at the playground and enjoy the day in the fresh air.

PANHANDLE TRAIL

The Panhandle Trail, which was converted from a rail bed to a recreational trail, is a portion of the Great American Rail-Trail®, the nation's first cross-country multiuse trail, stretching more than 3,700 miles between Washington, D.C., and Washington State. Spend time hiking or biking on this beautifully maintained paved trail that spans seventeen miles in Washington County.

The most popular event on the trail is the Halloween Night Walk in October. Bring your little ones to the trail in costume for some trick or treating on a luminary lit walk.

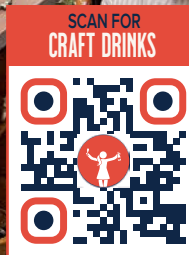

A vaulted ceiling with wood beams, two stonework bars, multiple working fireplaces and traditional décor make this Colonial 1790s style cocktail lounge the perfect place to sit back and enjoy an evening with friends and family.

Take advantage of the immersive cocktail experience and walk upstairs to the mezzanine level that overlooks the production floor. On a busy night, you may even be able to take in the sights, sounds and smells of whiskey production with a seat at a high-top table right on the production floor.

In addition to traditional whiskey cocktails, such as the classic Old Fashioned or Manhattan, Liberty Pole Spirits always keeps the bar fresh and exciting by featuring four hand-crafted cocktails, some more bourbon forward than others, that celebrate the flavors and essence of the

season. These cocktails rotate monthly, so there is always something new to try at Liberty Pole Spirits. For non-whiskey drinkers, the bar also hosts a selection of local beers on tap.

The kitchen showcases a menu of small bites straight out of colonial times. Embrace the historical ambiance and try some tavern-themed appetizers and desserts like chicken and lamb pies, bacon flatbreads and apple dumplings.

FACTS TO KEEP YOU COVERED

- The primary reason for covering bridges was to protect the structure from the environment.
- All of these covered bridges were listed on the National Register of Historic Places on June 22, 1979.
- Pennsylvania has 197 covered bridges still standing statewide.
- Approximately 20 Kingpost truss covered bridges still stand in the United States, including eight in Washington County.
- The exterior of all but one of Washington County's 23 covered bridges are painted red, taken from a formula derived from a natural insect-proof oxide in the local soil.

Approx. 22 mile return trip to Washington, PA. Continue East on Old Steubenville Pike to Rt 18 South.

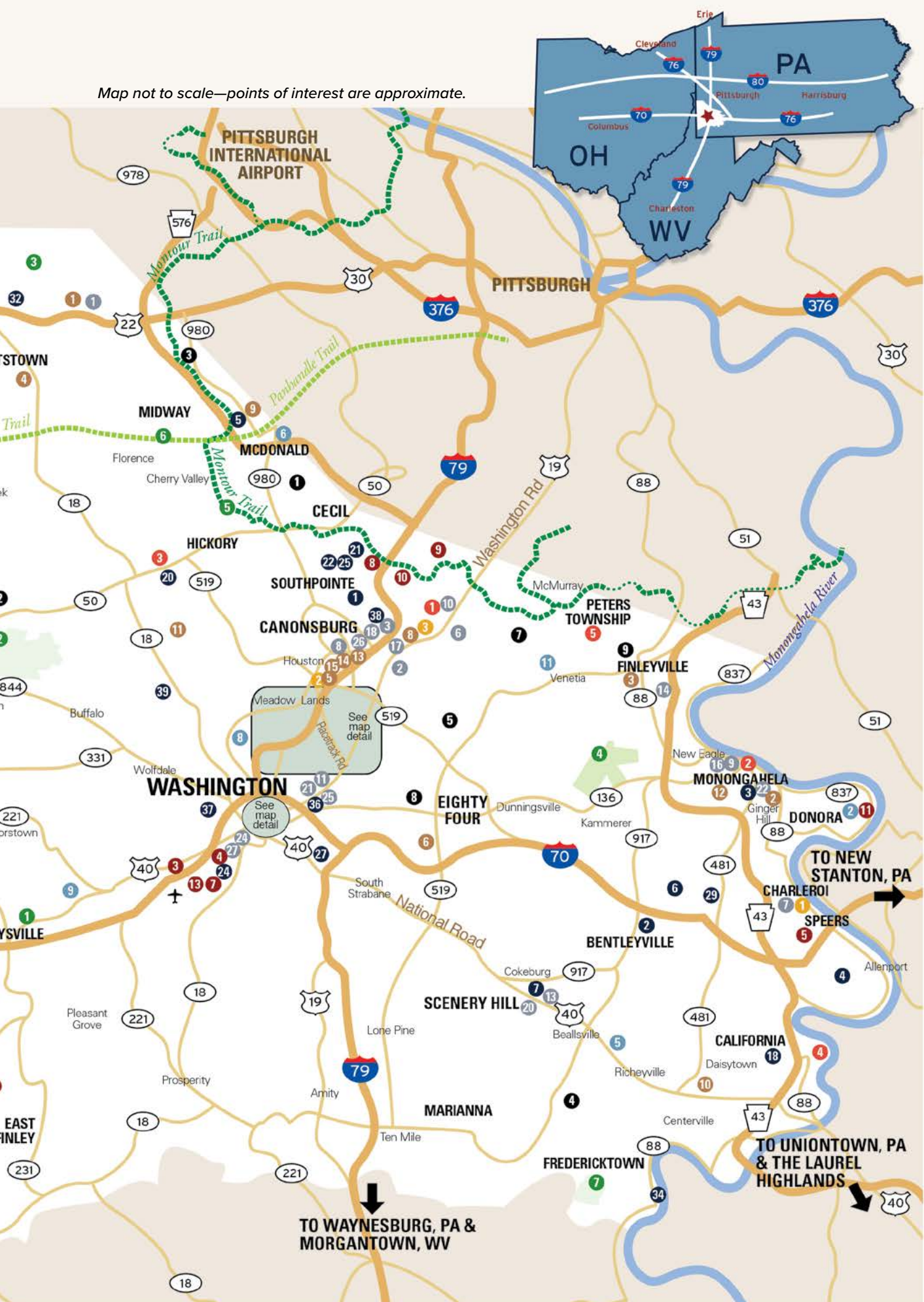

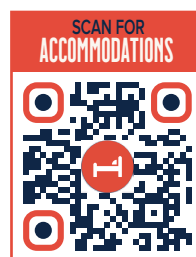
