LET FREEDOM RING

Washington County's "Bells Across PA" installation honors the county's place in America's 250-year story

American history is often taught in the interest of time – in large chunks broken down into chapters of textbooks, details glossed over in the name of neat units. What we often neglect are the small stories, locally significant yet nationally forgotten over time.

The 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence aims to shine a light on some of those forgotten stories, reminding Americans that every county and municipality is part of the fabric of our nation and has a story to tell as we celebrate this milestone – showing that the place they call home plays a pivotal role in both honoring the past and forging America's future.

Washington County is no exception. Founded in 1781 by the Pennsylvania General Assembly just five years after that landmark day in Philadelphia, the county's powerful history begins with its equally powerful namesake: General George Washington, who once led an army west to squash the nation's first

rebellion in the newly-formed county during the Whiskey Rebellion of 1791–94.

Fittingly, Washington's portrait is what most people notice first on "The American Spirit," Washington County's installation in the "Bells Across PA" statewide art series, which has placed replica liberty bells across all 67 counties in the Commonwealth in celebration of the nation's 250th anniversary. The bell was commissioned by the Washington County Chamber of Commerce and Tourism Promotion Agency not only to celebrate the milestone but to serve as a lasting symbol of Washington County's role in it.

"The American Spirit" was designed and painted by renowned Canonsburg-based artist James Sulkowski, whose Classical Realism works have been displayed in the White House, the Metropolitan Opera House in New York City and other historic institutions. His work appears in many public and private collections, including those of President George H.W. Bush, Carnegie Mellon University and the Abdul Aziz Museum in Saudi Arabia.

"The rich history, heritage and people of Washington County made the design concept for the bell both challenging and exciting," Sulkowski said during the bell's unveiling ceremony in August 2025 at the historic LeMoyné House Garden. "I was honored to be chosen to create something so important and momentous for the 250th anniversary of our country."

The bell includes depictions of iconic Washington County events and landmarks such as the PONY League World Series, Meadowcroft Rockshelter & Historic Village, the Pennsylvania Trolley Museum, the county's strong ties

to agriculture and industry, the Whiskey Rebellion and more, with the centerpiece being a large depiction of George Washington atop the Washington County Courthouse.

Two other Canonsburg residents also played a role in bringing the project from concept to reality. Sulkowski's original paintings were digitized by Mike Melone of Melone Advertising Group and placed onto the bell as vinyl overlays by John Dziak's Printscape Imaging & Graphics. Washington-based MacBracey Corporation designed the permanent wooden base for the project, making it a true community effort reflecting Washington County's storied past and bright future ahead.

"The Chamber was proud to sponsor the America250PA Bells Across PA program in Washington County and commemorate this important milestone in our country's history with this lasting symbol that highlights Washington County's contributions to 250 years of American history. This bell symbolizes the county's contributions to the development of our nation by featuring iconic highlights of our heritage and landmarks, representing our past, present, and future – all through the eyes of a renowned artist who calls Washington County home," said Washington County Chamber of Commerce & Tourism Promotion Agency president Jeff Kotula.

Following the unveiling, the Washington County Chamber of Commerce & Tourism Promotion Agency donated "The American Spirit" to the Washington County Historical Society, where it is now on permanent display for the public at 49 E. Maiden St., in Washington, Pa.

STAR LIGHT, STAR BRIGHT

From craters on the moon to distant galaxies, the universe comes into view at Mingo Creek County Park Observatory

Even though they are millions of miles away, the stars are not quite so far out of reach at the Mingo Creek County Park Observatory. Whether a seasoned viewer or one with a newfound interest in the celestial heavens, the organization behind the observatory is more than happy to welcome visitors and locals alike to its Star Parties.

Owned and operated by the Amateur Astronomers Association of Pittsburgh (3AP), the Mingo Creek County Park Observatory is the largest amateur astronomical observatory in southwestern Pennsylvania and has been hosting the public for observations of the night sky since 2005. 3AP is one of the largest astronomy clubs in the country, with more than 300 members excited to share their passion for the stars and planets with curious visitors several times a month during Star Parties, which are open to the public, free and do not require visitors to bring their own equipment unless they want to.

Upon arriving, stargazers are given a "guided tour" of the night sky inside the observatory before heading out to view celestial objects through the observatory's two massive telescopes. On clear nights, one can see individual craters on the moon, near-Earth objects and even deep space objects like nebulae, clusters, galaxies and more. The visibility of objects and differing planetary events on a month-to-month basis is all part of what makes the hobby so exciting, according to members.

After checking out the stars inside the observatory, visitors are encouraged to go outside and view the stars with both the naked eye and various portable

telescopes, speak with members and learn more about the cosmos.

Beyond curious stargazers, others often come to Star Parties for different reasons, like help with their own telescopes or advice on buying one, to ask questions about upcoming planetary events, or just to find a community with a common interest. No matter why one is attending a Star Party, 3AP is ready to welcome them with open arms and a telescope to share.

In addition to its mission of sharing the science of astronomy with the public, the organization has a greater purpose: to speak to as many people as possible about dark-sky preservation, a critical

and often overlooked natural resource pivotal to not only human activities like mapping the skies, but also in wildlife conservation, energy efficiency, circadian rhythms, and maintaining critical ecological integrity. While Star Parties are free to attend, donations towards the organization and dark-sky preservation are welcomed.

Star Parties at the Mingo Creek County Park Observatory are typically twice a month (with exceptions for weather conditions) on consecutive Fridays and Saturdays. For starting times and know-before-you-go information, visit 3ap.org, and see page 16 for the full schedule.

How locals, investors and entrepreneurs are leading the borough's revitalization effort

With just under 10,000 residents, an outsider may call Canonsburg a "small town." Residents and frequent visitors know very well it is anything but.

In addition to decades of notable history, Canonsburg is home to figures like Perry Como, Don Yencko and Bobby Vinton, internationally recognized companies like All-Clad and Sarris Candies and world-class events like the borough's Fourth of July Parade (the second-largest Fourth of July event in the state after Philadelphia's parade), the Pennsylvania Bavarian Oktoberfest, Canonsburg's Old Fashioned Christmas and more, all of which drive tens of thousands of visitors to Canonsburg each year.

In addition to its existing notoriety in western Pennsylvania and beyond, Canonsburg is also the focus of a significant revitalization effort aimed at modernizing the borough and attracting new businesses.

Recent additions in the last few years include businesses and restaurants like Good Goods Marketplace, So Blue Greek Ceramics, the Canonsburg Cake Company, Davis Diner, Smokin' Hot Candle Co., Fresh Start Café and the Canonsburg Collective, along with Grandpa Joe's Candy Shop, which helped the borough receive significant media attention when it placed hundreds of ducks throughout downtown last summer.

That is all in addition to existing locally owned businesses like Rusty Gold Brewing, Chicco Baccello,

Iceberg's Ice Cream, The Nook on Pike and Linda's Bakery that continue to help fill Canonsburg's streets with shoppers and visitors once more.

The driving force behind this concentrated effort to revive the area comes from a few passionate people, with new investors, business owners and community members all doing their part to transform the borough and show prospective residents there are plenty of ways to live, work and play right at home.

Another recent and notable addition is Midtown Market, a retail concept

featuring a mix of dining, retail shopping, entertainment and an events center planned for future development. The market is located in the former McCrory's department store at 48 W. Pike St. and is the first of its kind in the area, housing new businesses like Grandpa Joe's Soda Pop Shop, Burgess & Burgess Distillery at 1802, Major Mallard's Duckpin Bowling and MP Coney Island under one roof.

Beyond new storefronts and dining destinations, Canonsburg's revitalization efforts are also being shaped by a renewed focus on walkability, community programming and events that bring people together throughout the year. Seasonal farmers markets, pop-up vendor fairs, live music and family-friendly activities increasingly fill the borough's calendar and provide residents and visitors with more reasons to spend time downtown. Streets once defined by pass-through traffic are transforming into places where people meet, shop and connect, reinforcing the sense of community that has long defined Canonsburg while introducing a fresh energy that appeals to a new generation of residents and visitors.

This renewed momentum reflects a broader and brighter vision for the borough's future — one that promises both authentic and thoughtful growth and shows that "home" can also be a destination worth exploring again and again. As the nation celebrates its 250th anniversary, Canonsburg stands as living proof that historic towns can find new life through shared commitment, creativity and community.

The national theme of 2026 is one of celebration — celebrating heritage, identity and the places, events and people that make our county home. Beyond being the place we return to over and over again, part of what makes Washington County special is the unique events and attractions found only in our corner of southwestern Pennsylvania.

To some, tradition is everything. In Washington County, PONY Baseball & Softball may very well be included in the definition of “tradition.” The year 2026 marks the 75th anniversary of the league that has put Washington County on an international map, and those behind the league’s continued growth are celebrating big.

Originally named “Protect Our Neighborhood Youth,” the name of PONY Baseball & Softball was eventually changed to “Protect Our Nation’s Youth” as the league expanded beyond Washington County to a national and eventually an international level after its founding in 1951. Today, more than 40 countries host PONY programs of their own. It all comes back to Washington County once a year during the Printscape PONY League World Series when the best teams from around the world

converge on Historic Lew Hays PONY Field to compete for the championship title on the field where it all began.

This year’s World Series returns **August 7–12**, but those looking to appreciate all 75 years of PONY history should also stop by the museum at PONY’s International Headquarters in Washington next to EQT Park.

In addition to the World Series, another event of historic significance calls Washington County home: The Whiskey Rebellion Festival. The Whiskey Rebellion of 1791–94 was the first major rebellion in the newly formed United States following the Revolutionary War. It escalated to the point that President George Washington led troops to western Pennsylvania to

suppress protesters violently opposing a federal tax on whiskey. Today, the spirit of both rebellion and whiskey heritage remains strong in the region through museums and local distilleries that continue traditions passed down through generations.

As we celebrate the 250th anniversary of the birth of our nation, the Whiskey Rebellion Festival will return to downtown Washington **July 10–11** as another commemoration of our country’s early days with historic reenactments, period exhibitions, demonstrations, children’s activities and plenty of whiskey to toast the spirit of rebellion.

Our nation’s early days are also in the spotlight twice a year at the National Pike Steam, Gas & Horse Association Show, a unique showcase of the evolution of the machines and engines that helped build the nation.

Thousands head to the show each year to see history roar to life as hundreds of vintage steam engines, tractors, cars, construction equipment and other historic forms of machinery are put on display in an event that gets bigger and better every year all thanks to hundreds of volunteers with a shared passion for preserving the history of all things that go.

The National Pike Steam, Gas & Horse Association Show takes place **May 16–17** and **August 7–9** off Route 40 in Brownsville.

In addition to nationally recognized names like Sarris Candies and 84 Lumber,

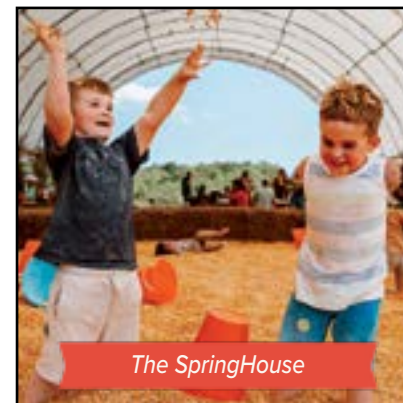

STRONG ROOTS

Local farms keep the county's agricultural heritage alive and well with festivals, fresh goods and hands-on agricultural adventures

While driving through Washington County, it is not uncommon to pass by cattle and horses grazing on rolling hills, green fields dotted with pumpkin vines or apple trees, and farm stands bursting with goods like fresh eggs, baked goods, vegetables and more.

At its heart, Washington County is farm country, and as we mark our nation's 250th anniversary, no one deserves to be celebrated more than our county's farmers who make up the backbone of our country.

As agritourism continues to surge in popularity, farms like Trax Farms in Finleyville continue to flourish by hosting events like wine festivals, craft shows and even music festivals in addition to the annual Fall Festival, Sunflower Festival and festivals surrounding pick-your-own seasons like blueberries and strawberries, all of which draw thousands to Washington County each year for some fun on this historic farm. Even when an event is not going on, visitors come from far and wide to shop for fresh goods, plants, décor and even antiques inside the farm's expansive market.

Pick-your-own experiences are at their best at nearby Simmons Farm in McMurray. First opened in the mid-1800s, this family-owned farm grows and sells so much fresh produce and other goods in its market that it eventually expanded to a second location nearby on Route 19. The farm is popular for its pick-your-own flowers, peaches, apples, pumpkins and strawberries and is also host to a bustling annual fall festival that's become a yearly must-do for visitors and locals alike.

2026 marks the 50th anniversary of The SpringHouse in Eighty Four, and the family behind the farm is celebrating half a century of success with a packed calendar. Spring welcomes the return of farm tours, where visitors can meet dairy cows, bottle-feed calves and watch milk being processed in the farm's on-site processing facility. In the fall, The SpringHouse's Fall Fun on the Farm festival attracts thousands for a full day of activities, but perhaps the most famous offering at The SpringHouse is its homestyle food and famous chocolate milk, which comes highly recommended by anyone who has visited in the past.

If one is looking for a step above the traditional farm experience, The Crafty Alpaca in Avella is the place to be. Learn all there is to know about alpacas by feeding them, petting them and even taking them on a woodland hike before stopping by the farm store to check out a wool-spinning demonstration and load up on alpaca wool socks, hats, clothing and more.

Speaking of unique experiences, Rustic Rock Maple Farm should also be on any visitor's to-do list. Late winter is peak season for this 108-acre maple farm, which harvests a whopping 77,000 gallons of maple sap per season from its 3,000 or so taps before it is boiled down into USDA-certified organic maple syrup. Visitors can take a tour of the maple farm for free from April to November to learn about the maple syrup process and its byproducts like maple sugar.

If that is not enough for a lover of all things agriculture, consider taking a trip out to Bedner's Farm & Greenhouse in McDonald to shop rows and rows of flowers or pick-your-own produce like beets, cucumbers, eggplant, zucchini and more, or stop by Shilling Hill Farm in Washington for a home-cooked meal. Take a tour of a working farm and meet all kinds of farm animals at Geary Farm in McDonald, shop for farm-fresh milk at Linden Creek Dairy Farm in Canonsburg or even take a beekeeping lesson at Bedillion Honey Farm in Hickory.



DRIVING TOUR OF COVERED BRIDGES

Washington County is home to 23 historic covered bridges, the second most of any county in Pennsylvania. To help locate these charming icons of our past, the following three tours have been compiled according to the abundance and proximity of each covered bridge. Plan a single outing or multiple excursions with these directions, which are based upon moderate road conditions and may not be the most direct routes. Please know that many of these bridges are located on narrow roads and in remote settings. Pack a lunch, bring a camera, and fuel up your vehicle to enjoy this scenic scavenger hunt throughout the beautiful countryside. Travel at your own risk.*

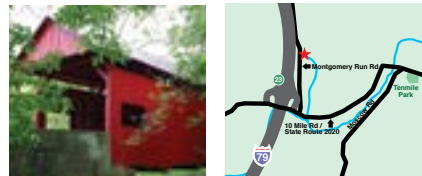

FACTS TO KEEP YOU COVERED

- The primary reason for covering bridges was to protect the structure from the environment.
- All of these covered bridges were listed on the National Register of Historic Places on June 22, 1979.
- Pennsylvania has 197 covered bridges still standing statewide.
- Approximately 20 Kingpost truss covered bridges still stand in the United States, including eight in Washington County.
- The exterior of all but one of Washington County's 23 covered bridges are painted red, taken from a formula derived from a natural insect-proof oxide in the local soil.
