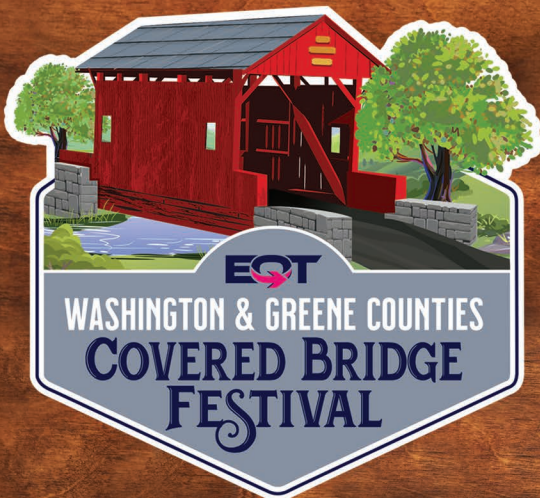

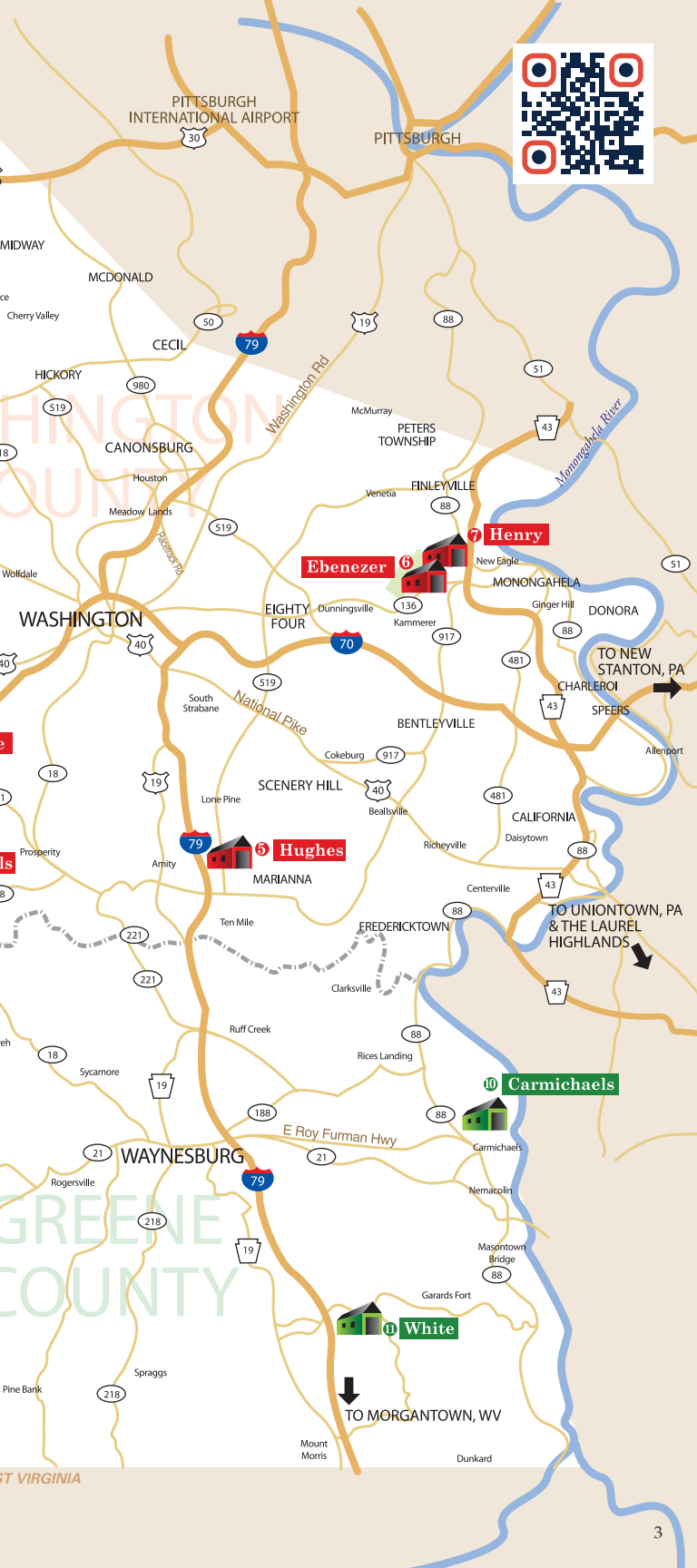

From Pittsburgh via Route 51: Take Route 51 South to PA Toll Route 43 South. Pay toll and take Exit 44. Turn right on Route 136 West. From Morgantown: Take I-79 North to I-70 East, Exit 27. Turn left and follow to stop sign. Turn right on Route 136 East. From New Stanton: Take I-70 West to PA Toll Route 43 North. Take Exit 44, pay toll and turn left on Route 136 West. From Wheeling: Take I-70 East to Exit 27. Turn left and follow to stop sign. Turn right on Route 136 East. Watch for Mingo Creek County Park signs. One-way traffic through Mingo Park. Henry Bridge traffic enters at Mansion Hill Road off Route 136. All traffic exits Chapel Hill Road.

PINE BANK BRIDGE

MEADOWCROFT ROCKSHELTER AND HISTORIC VILLAGE WASHINGTON COUNTY



ACTIVITIES: In celebration of the festival, the public is invited to tour Meadowcroft's three historic villages free of charge! This 275-acre outdoor museum includes a 19th century living history village with

a one-room school, blacksmith shop, church, log houses, and the Pine Bank Covered Bridge. This covered bridge, built in 1871, is one of only twenty surviving Kingpost truss bridges in the United States. The recent rehabilitation project for this historic bridge was recognized with a Pennsylvania Historic Preservation Award. In addition to the 19th century village, also visit the museum's recreated 16th century Monongahela Indian village to see what life was like in Western PA before European settlement and a recreated 18th century frontier trading post with Settler and Indian cabins. The Miller Museum includes exhibits of horse-drawn vehicles and equipment. Open in 2025, the exhibit "Meadowcroft Rockshelter: The Site the Rocked the World" explores the impact the Meadowcroft Rockshelter had on understanding the peopling of North America with artifacts excavated the site, featuring the 14,000 year-old Miller Point. Do not miss touring the world-renowned Meadowcroft Rockshelter National Historic Landmark, a prehistoric campsite that dates back 19,000 years (admission ticket required). The museum's new Robert Barends Center includes restrooms, a gift shop, and a video about the site. Picnickers are welcome to use the new, timber-frame pavilion and additional picnic tables located on the grounds.
