





ACTIVITIES: The public is invited to visit this 275-acre outdoor museum featuring a 19th century living history village with a one-room school, blacksmith shop, church, log houses and the Pine Bank Covered Bridge. This

covered bridge, built in 1871, is one of only twenty surviving Kingpost truss bridges in the United States. The recent rehabilitation project for this historic bridge was recognized with a Pennsylvania Historic Preservation Award. In addition to the 19th century village, also visit the museum's recreated 16th century Indian village to see what life was like in Western PA before European settlement; a recreated 18th century frontier trading post and Indian cabin; an exhibit about the barns of Western PA; as well as exhibits of horse-drawn vehicles and equipment, harness racing memorabilia and historic regional photographs. Do not miss the world-renowned Meadowcroft Rockshelter National Historic Landmark, a prehistoric campsite that dates back 19,000 years (admission ticket required). The museum's visitor center includes restrooms and a gift shop. A picnic area and pavilion are also located on the grounds.


