Little A Town Arena saddles up for big events in 2025

Sitting on top of an area overlooking downtown Avella lies a true hidden gem – one visitors and locals alike cannot stop talking about. While some may think Avella to be a quiet town, there is a place right in its heart that is set to become the region's next big draw: Little A Town Arena.

A staple of the downtown Avella scene since 2007, Little A Town is rearing to go bigger and better in 2025 with some serious down-home events. Originally known as the Avella Arena, the 12-acre property has long been a hub for equestrian and motorsport events. Its 2024 rebranding signaled a new chapter, allowing the venue to host larger and more diverse events, such as the September 2024 Bulls, Barrels & Broncos Rodeo, which drew more than 2,000 attendees.

Little A Town Arena is an integral part of Avella's growing attractions, which include dining, outdoor adventures, and rich historical experiences. Its proximity to attractions like Meadowcroft Rockshelter & Historic Village, Cross Creek County Park and Breezy Heights Tavern make it a must-see addition to any visitor's itinerary when in the area.

Little A Town Arena is committed to supporting the community through its nonprofit mission. Proceeds from the arena's events directly benefit local organizations like the Avella Volunteer Fire Department, Avella's Future Farmers of America Chapter, Avella Athletics, and the townships of Independence and Cross Creek. Past initiatives, such as the Fall Flea Market, have exemplified the arena's dedication to giving back.



The organizers behind the arena have ambitious plans for what comes next, but above all, Little A Town's future lies in the fact that it has become a well-loved home for both locals and visitors whom the arena the arena gladly welcomes to its close-knit community in Avella. By staying true to its mission of community support, Little A Town Arena continues to serve as

a pillar of local pride and a venue worth keeping your eye on.

In 2025, the arena is gearing up for its most exciting season yet. Events like Band Blast, the Little A Town Rodeo, Pow-Wow & Mountain Man Rendezvous, and Bulls, Barrels & BBQ promise to make it a year of which visitors will not want to miss even a moment.

Little Lake Theatre Company

In the summer of 1947, Will Disney and his mother Edith were travelling the Pittsburgh area searching for an area suitable for a summer stock community theatre. As they passed through Washington County, they saw a large red barn sitting on a lake. After conversing with the farmer who owned the property, Disney was able to rent and convert the property into a theatre that opened in 1949 complete with seating, a snack bar, green room, box office and more. And thus, Little Lake Theatre was born, ready to entertain the community for the next 75 years and beyond.

Today, Little Lake Theatre Company maintains that small theatre charm – but it has evolved since the 1940s. Now equipped with 135 theatre-in-the-round style seats that offer an intimate and intense way to experience the performance and a team of both dedicated volunteers and paid staff, Little Lake Theatre can produce 10 or more shows a year.

Little Lake's offerings also include children's programming and performances, summer camps and classes; apprenticeship programs and much more that make it a hub for Washington County's thriving arts and culture scene. The theatre is also committed to the philosophy that theatre is for everyone by modifying several of its performances to be sensory-friendly, with dimmed lights, reduced sound, additional staff, technology, and support for those with special needs.

Little Lake Theatre's 76th season is themed "Adventure Awaits," with shows like "The Da Vinci Code," "9 to 5 The Musical," "Agatha Christie's Murder on the Orient Express," "Finding Nemo Jr." and more all on the lineup to make for one highly adventurous 2025. Tickets can be purchased at littlelake. org or day of at the box office.

Washington Community Theatre

Founded by a group of theatre-loving Washington residents, Washington Community Theatre (WCT) has been a cornerstone of the arts since staging its first play in 1967.

WCT's mission is simple: to nurture local interest and participation in the theatrical arts and present high-quality, family-friendly performances to audiences. True to its mission, the theatre's enduring success over 56 years is attributed to a culture of mutual growth and dedication. Everyone involved—from cast and crew to directors and board members—is a volunteer, and the organization relies on donations, ticket sales, and sponsorships to maintain high-quality performances and pass the arts along to the next generation.

That next generation is the key to the theatre's success for the next 50 years. The Washington Community Theatre Kidz children's theatre program hosts workshops and other skill-building sessions to get school-aged children involved in the theatre arts. Those involved with the WCT hope that programs like this will spark life-long love of the performing arts and inspire continued involvement in the theatre.

The theatre produces two shows annually: a summer musical and a fall production. Summer performances and rehearsals are held at the Washington Community Park Pavilion, while fall productions have been held at venues like the Elks Club or First Presbyterian Church. This year's lineup includes "The Wizard of Oz" in summer and "Little Women" in the fall. The latter will be staged at Nineteen North in downtown Washington.

Old Schoolhouse Players

When you think Broadway, you likely may not think countryside. That is, unless you are at the Old Schoolhouse Players (OSP), where "Broadway in the Country" is the name of the game.

Old Schoolhouse Players is celebrating its 33rd season in 2025 with productions that will have both locals and visitors alike flocking to the Bud Allison Auditorium in Hickory, which the group has called home since its founding in 1996. What started out as simple skits has evolved into a diversely talented group that has performed more than 100 dramatic and musical productions over many successful seasons.

The group is comprised entirely of volunteers, some of whom have been with the OSP since its founding. Members are diverse in age, gender and backgrounds – some with zero theatre experience – but all find a pleasant and highly rewarding sense of community with other members of the group similarly dedicated to creating shows to rival those in downtown Pittsburgh. Even set design and scenery are highly thought out, with the OSP going so far as to build real brick walls on stage or using dry ice to create special effects.

Old Schoolhouse Players presents five shows a year, with directors carefully considering what audiences might want to see most. What is currently popular, along with prior well-performing shows, are key factors in these considerations, but the shows chosen are always suitable for all ages of theatregoer.

2025's lineup includes shows like "Once Upon a Mattress," "R&H's Sound of Music," "All Because of Agatha," and "Nuncrackers." Tickets can be purchased online at osptheater.com or day of at the box office.

HANDCRAFTED HISTORY

Celebrating 50 years of the National Duncan Glass Society

The Beginning

Long before cell phones, television and even radio, families occupied themselves with entertaining. By the early 20th Century, dinner parties had forgone the highly elaborate, multi-course dinners of the Victorian Era and become more casual, but families still strived to collect the very best and most on-trend pieces to display for their guests. High quality porcelain, bone china and elaborate pieces with floral motifs and gilded accents were all highly sought after items in a collection, but none were so prized or popular as was Duncan & Miller glass.

Duncan & Miller Glass Company

In 1865, George Duncan initially purchased a glass company whose factory in Pittsburgh's South Side neighborhood bordered the Monongahela River for easy transportation. Over the next 10 years, the company evolved and grew significantly and was eventually passed to George Duncan's son, James E. Duncan, and experienced glass maker and designer John Ernest Miller.

In 1892, the company's factory was destroyed by a fire, prompting Duncan to build a new factory on Jefferson Avenue in Washington, a location that had ample access to railroads and inexpensive natural gas to power the factory. By 1900, the company was officially formalized as the Duncan & Miller Glass Company known today.

Some of the company's most popular styles were produced between the 1920s and the 1940s, with its Nautical, Hobnail, Caribbean and Teardrop styles at the forefront as pinnacles of modern design. These styles often encompassed a unique range of frosting, etching, engraving, coloring, enamel and more incorporated into a single handmade design. Duncan & Miller's most iconic piece, however, is its signature swan – a work of art that took more than 10 craftsmen to make.

At its height, Duncan & Miller Glass was regarded as the "loveliest glass in America," with each handmade piece sometimes requiring up to 14 skilled craftsmen to make. The company evolved with the times, creating highly detailed and intricate pieces during the Gilded Era, modern and cheerful Art Deco pieces during the Great Depression, and more everyday use pieces during the post-World War II era. Pieces came in both clear glass and a vast rainbow of colors that often reflected the changes in dining trends and design.

By the 1950s, the emergence of automated glassmaking machinery and assembly lines had made Duncan & Miller's handmade glass uneconomical. The company began selling off its remaining inventory, molds and equipment to various other companies and collectors, eventually closing the Washington factory in 1955 after almost 90 years in business.

The Legacy

It has been nearly 70 years since the Duncan & Miller Glass Company closed its factory doors, but the name has hardly been forgotten in Washington County and beyond.

The Duncan & Miller Glass Museum – the largest collection of Duncan & Miller Glass in the world – opened in downtown Washington (not far from the old factory site) in 1993 with the goal of preserving the legacy of the Duncan & Miller Glass Co.

With thousands of handmade and unique pieces in its collection, visitors can easily spend an entire afternoon lost in time at the museum as they explore the history of our region's industrial heritage.

The museum also plays a larger role in telling the story of not only Washington County's industrial legacy, but the county as a hub for artisans and craftsmen of the past who dedicated their livelihoods to the furthering of art and industry. Visitors can get a sense of the work that went into these pieces and the impact Duncan & Miller glass had on the region either through guided tours or simply by browsing the museum on their own.

In addition to the museum, the National Duncan Glass Society hosts two glass shows and sales each year at the Washington County Fairgrounds, which feature antique and collectible vendors from all over the country, educational programs, exhibits and demonstrations related to its antiques and collectibles.

Gala

The National Duncan Glass Society is celebrating a landmark year in 2025 as it marks its 50th anniversary of preserving the legacy of Duncan & Miller Glass. This milestone also honors the dedication and hard work of its members and volunteers over the past five decades. The occasion was commemorated on March 22nd with a Golden Anniversary Gala at the George Washington Hotel, featuring an evening of music, dancing, professional portrait photography, and an auction with tickets to "The Wizard of Oz" donated by the Pittsburgh Ballet Theatre that helped kick off another 50 years of success and growth for the society.



TIME TRAVEL Six Must-Visit Museums

LeMoyne House

Named after prominent 19th century physician and abolitionist Dr. Francis Julius LeMoyne, the LeMoyne House is a preserved piece of the Underground Railroad and National Historic Landmark. Built in 1812, the Gothic Revival stone home was a safe stop on the Underground Railroad Network to Freedom for slaves journeying through Washington County toward Canada and freedom.

The LeMoyne House is also the home of the first crematory in the western hemisphere; as a practicing physician, LeMoyne was a fierce advocate for what he saw as a vital solution to preventing widespread disease even during a time when the practice was seen as morally unjust.

The LeMoyne House just underwent an extensive remodel in 2024, so visitors can now book a guided tour of the newly refurbished space to experience history up close.

Meadowcroft Rockshelter & Historic Village

This rocky overhang in Avella contains evidence of human inhabitation in Washington County dating back 19,000 years – the oldest site of human habitation in North America.

Step back in time at Meadowcroft
Rockshelter & Historic Village to
experience what life was like for our
ancestors in some of America's first
settlements. In addition to the Rockshelter,
the site is also home to a 16th-century
Eastern Woodland Indian Village, 18thcentury log cabin, frontier trading post
and 19th-century Historic Village, as well
as a brand-new Visitor's Center coming in
Spring 2025.

Bradford House Museum

Completed in 1788, this striking stone home reflected the social standing of its owner, attorney and businessman David Bradford.

Bradford and his family lived in the home from 1788 to 1794, after which they were driven out of the home due to Bradford's involvement in the Whiskey Rebellion. After the family fled to St. Francisville, Louisiana, the home was extensively damaged over the course of several years but was restored to its original state by the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission in 1959.

The Bradford House Museum and furnishings now reflect the year and characteristics of the time it was built. Visitors can walk through and experience the life of David Bradford and his family along with the home's history during the Whiskey Rebellion era.

Whiskey Rebellion Education & Visitor Center

In 1791, Treasury Secretary Alexander Hamilton proposed an excise tax on whiskey produced in the United States to pay off debt from the Revolutionary War and to create a source of revenue for the newly independent nation. Farmers, particularly in Western Pennsylvania, believed this tax to be wrongly targeting those who relied on sales of liquor, which was easier to ship and more profitable than the rye, corn and wheat they farmed.

With many farmers' livelihoods at stake, they revolted against this nationwide tax in a movement later dubbed the Whiskey Rebellion of 1791-1794. In response, the federal government deployed the militia to Western Pennsylvania to squash the rebellion.

Walk through the Whiskey Rebellion Education & Visitor Center to further explore the Whiskey Rebellion and its profound impact on both American history and the lives of those in Washington County.

Pennsylvania Trolley Museum

Did you know that Pittsburgh native Fred Rogers coined the word trolley? It was not until his TV show "Mr. Rogers' Neighborhood" debuted that the term "street car" changed to "trolley."

First opened in 1954, the Pennsylvania Trolley Museum is home to about 50 historic streetcars that have been meticulously restored to their original state. With its recent move to the all-new Welcome and Education Center at 1 Electric Way, the Pennsylvania Trolley Museum now has double the space to show off decades of trolley history.

Throughout the day, guests can take a ride into the past on one of the historic trolleys available for rides and even to the Washington County Agricultural Fair and the Pennsylvania Arts & Crafts Festival each year.

Duncan & Miller Glass Museum

Originally located in the Southside of Pittsburgh in 1865, the Duncan & Miller Glass Company became famous nationwide for its glassware for all occasions, such as dinnerware, lamps, vases, bowls and crystalware. Duncan & Miller glass also gained notoriety for the extensive skill and man hours required to make its pieces.

After its relocation to Washington following a factory fire in Pittsburgh, the company transformed its work to keep up with demand. Oil lamps were made in the 1950s, when many still did not have electricity, and clay pigeons and ashtrays were made during World War II.

It was not until 1993 that the Duncan & Miller Glass Museum opened in Washington with the help of countless volunteers and donors. In April 2019, the newly relocated museum opened with hundreds of handmade pieces that illustrate the company's rich history and dedication to quality on display. With so many eras to explore through colorful glass, the Duncan & Miller Glass Museum is something to enjoy regardless of age.

DRIVING TOUR OF **COVERED BRIDGES**

Washington County is home to 23 historic covered bridges, the second most of any county in Pennsylvania. To help locate these charming icons of our past, the following three tours have been compiled according to the abundance and proximity of each covered bridge. Plan a single outing or multiple excursions with these directions, which are based upon moderate road conditions and may not be the most direct routes. Please know that many of these bridges are located on narrow roads and in remote settings. Pack a lunch, bring a camera, and fuel up your vehicle to enjoy this scenic scavenger hunt throughout the beautiful countryside. Travel at your own risk.*



FACTS TO KEEP YOU COVERED

- The primary reason for covering bridges was to protect the structure from the environment.
- All of these covered bridges were listed on the National Register of Historic Places on June 22, 1979.
- Pennsylvania has 197 covered bridges still standing statewide
- Approximately 20 Kingpost truss covered bridges still stand in the United States, including eight in Washington County."
- The exterior of all but one of Washington County's 23 covered bridges are painted red, taken from a formula derived from a natural insect-proof oxide in the local soil.
