101 Free Things To Do In Tippecanoe.....



- 1. Grab your canoe or kayak and head to the Bicentennial Nature Area or one of the other waterways in Tippecanoe County.
- 2. Ride in the Tippecanoe County courthouse's cage-like 1906 elevator.
- 3. Walk, jog or roller skate on the trails around West Lafayette!
- 4. Visit the Neil Armstrong Hall of Engineering at Purdue University; check out the statue and footprints commemorating man's first steps on the moon, then see a moon rock!
- 5. Delight in Indiana's natural beauty along with over 25 sculptures created by notable Indiana artists at the Haan Mansion Sculpture Garden.
- 6. Go down to the corner of 5th and Main streets to see the "Farm Family" sculpture. Check out homeofpurdue.com and download a map of all the public art throughout the community!



- 7. Grab a partner and hit the pickleball courts at McCaw Park.
- 8. Stop at the Tippecanoe County Public Library and read a 100-year-old newspaper on microfilm.
- 9. Have an evening picnic, then take a jar and poke holes in the lid so you can catch fireflies at Fort Ouiatenon. But be sure to set them free before you go home!
- 10. Puzzle mania! Take on a Lafayette-West Lafayette puzzle challenge at jigsawplanet. com/homeofpurdue.
- 11. Fly a kite at one of our many area parks.
- 12. Meet someone special under the Bell Tower on the Purdue campus.
- 13. Explore the site of The Battle of Tippecanoe where two Shawnee brothers, Tecumseh and The Prophet, had a dream of uniting many tribes into an organized defense against the white settlers.
- 14. Collect leaves at Purdue's Horticulture Park.
- 15. Visit the Purdue art galleries to get a new perspective on life.
- 16. Hop on the free CityBus Connector and explore the Purdue University campus and downtown Lafayette!

- Swing by one of our libraries and find books to help you plan the perfect garden.
- Go biking and experience the beauty of Tippecanoe County.
- 19. Fish the Wabash River at Davis Ferry Park. Indiana fishing license required.
- 20. Hang out at Tapawingo Park in West Lafayette and enjoy being on the "banks of the Wabash."
- 21. Watch the ducks, relax and play in Columbian Park's lagoon.
- 22. Go inner tubing on Wildcat Creek.
- 23. Watch Riverfest canoe races from the Brown Street overlook.
- 24. View the exhibits at the Wells Community Center and learn all about our cultural and arts organizations through the Tippecanoe Arts Federation.
- 25. Explore Wah-ba-shik-a Nature Center at the Tippecanoe Battlefield and bird watch through the observation window.
- 26. Enjoy the Lafayette Citizens Band concerts on Thursday evenings at Riehle Plaza during the summer.
- 27. Play chess on the tables at Founders Park on Purdue's campus.
- 28. Visit any of our 50+ fabulous parks!Find out where they are by picking up a local Recreation Guide at the Visit Lafayette - West Lafayette Visitors Center.





- 29. Dance and relax on the lawn outside the Purdue Memorial Union during the Purdue Summer Concert Series.
- Take a lunch to the John T. Myers Pedestrian Bridge and watch the people as they walk across the bridge.
- 31. Meander along the marsh and through the woods at Celery Bog Nature Area.
- 32. Admire the Black Cultural Center at Purdue and then go inside to enjoy great art on display.
- 33. Mountain bike through five of our off-road dirt path trails.
- 34. Look for the gargoyles on the Courthouse Square.
- 35. Visit the Arni Cohen Memorial softball fields at Cumberland Park and enjoy a game under the lights.

- 42. Visit the Purdue Visitors Center, in Stewart Center at Purdue, and discover all the reasons we are "Purdue Proud" in our community.
- 43. Grab a racquet and a partner and play tennis at one of several area locations.
- 44. Check out the online calendar so you won't miss any of the fun things to do in our community! homeofpurdue.com
- 45. Enjoy a good old-fashioned porch swing (even without the porch) at Happy Hollow Park.
- 46. Disc golf at Murdock Park or Purdue University.
- 47. Listen to the spring concert of the Purdue Musical Organization.
- 48. Window shop downtown while observing the beautiful architecture that includes plenty of looking up!
- 49. Get a taste of the international flavor of our community by experiencing Global Fest, held each fall.
- 50. Explore over 115 pieces of public art, located throughout Lafayette West Lafayette.
- 51. Volunteer your time at an organization of your choice. Get started by calling the United Way of Greater Lafayette Volunteer Bureau.

- 52. Enjoy cheering at a Little League game or play a game of catch with a friend at Armstrong, Munger or Murdock Park.
- 53. Be prepared for lots of laughter as you sled down Murdock Park in the winter.
- 54. Check out the fountains on Purdue's campus.
- 55. Grab your hammock and chill at Purdue University.
- 56. Observe wildlife at the Ouiatenon Preserve Overlook, a National Historic Landmark.
- 57. Visit the Christmas tree at the Purdue Memorial Union in early December and enjoy the sights and sounds of the season.
- 58. Take a wagon ride through the pumpkin fields and apple trees at Wea Creek Orchard.
- 59. Find a sycamore on the banks of the Wabash while walking the Wabash Heritage Trail.
- 60. Tour our many churches on a self-guided "Houses of Worship" walking tour and count the number of spires on the churches you see.
- 61. Enjoy the spring wildflowers or the autumn colors at Clegg Memorial Garden.
- 62. Visit the Skywatch Tower Monument in Cairo (follow Salisbury Street north of West Lafayette).
- 63. Cheer on your Boilermakers at Purdue Homecoming events; Homecoming Parade, pep rally, Mackey Madness and a family friendly celebration on the Purdue Mall.



- 64. Visit the West Lafayette Library and enjoy the sights and sounds of "The Village".

- 67. Take a bird watching hike and see how many birds you can identify at the Celery Bog.

- 77. Pet a rabbit or kiss a pig at the Tippecanoe County Fair in July.
- Go green and join in the festivities downtown on the John T. Myers Pedestrian Bridge during the St. Patrick's Day Parade.
- 79. See what it was like to be a firefighter in the 1930s at the Five Points Fire Station Museum.
- 80. Learn about the scenic river, the mighty Wabash, that runs through the community and observe the unique wildlife and unparalleled views that can be found along its 18 mile scenic trailway.
- 81. Find all four hiking entrances to Happy Hollow Park.
- 82. Maneuver your skateboard on the ramps at Lafayette Skate Park.
- 83. Music demonstrations, dancing and fun! Where? Ouibache Music Festival.
- 84. Take a child to Columbian Park's playground and tell stories about your own childhood.
- 85. Enjoy the breath-taking holiday luminaria displays lining Ninth Street Hill during the holidays.
- 86. View artwork at the Round the Fountain Art Fair the Saturday of Memorial Day Weekend in May.
- 87. Cover your ears and watch the sky fill with fireworks after listening to the patriotic music on the 4th of July at the annual Stars and Stripes Concert.
- 88. View the Living Nativity Scene at Faith Church East in December.



- 89. Take your bocce set and have a great game at Ross Hills Park.
- 90. Appreciate three stages of music, outdoor food, beer and wine sales as well as street performers, sidewalk chalk and hand made hula hoops, drum circles and DJ's, belly dancers and balloon animals at recurring Mosey Down Main Street events.
- 91. Enjoy the conversation, free sights and great smells at the Farmers' Market every Saturday morning downtown Lafayette, Wednesday afternoon in West Lafayette and Thursday at Purdue from May through October.
- 92. Volunteer to walk a dog at one of our three local animal shelters. Or visit one of several local pet stores to view birds, fish and pets.
- Learn about the community's diverse culture and traditions at the Tippecanoe Latino Festival.
- 94. Stroll through the curving avenues of the Perrin neighborhood and look at the iron fences, brick sidewalks, limestone curbs and cobblestones-remnants of another era.

- 98. Take a walk on history. Go to Shamrock Park and walk the tow path of the Wabash & Erie Canal, which is a small mound on the south side of the park.
- 99. Watch a soccer game at one of the many soccer fields in the area and find out what is causing all the excitement.
- 100. Take South River Road to Fort Ouiatenon and catch the water from the pump in your hands to get a cool drink!
- 101. Find the secret bridge in the Highland Park Neighborhood. Hint: It was for children to use when going to school on foot or by bicycle.
