The Farm at Prophetstown

inside Prophetstown State Park

Offering a unique 1920s farm experience. Events/classes include; canning, blacksmithing, gardening, animal care, entertainment and crafts. Farm-to-table, multi-course dinners are served on antique china. Sustainable-agriculture is practiced and a variety of heritage breed animals are there to enjoy. Two farmhouses are open to give a glimpse into 1920s farm life, with additional buildings including a magnificent barn, a blacksmith shop, a corn crib, chicken coops and more to explore. Staff is dedicated to sharing historic agriculture, homesteading arts, and outstanding animal care. Admission-free with state park entry except for special programming.

Fort Ouiatenon Historic Park

Fort Ouiatenon (wee-ah-teh-non), named for the Wea tribes in the area, was established by the French in 1717 as a fur trading post. It was one of the earliest settlements in what was to become the state of Indiana. Archaeology and research show that the area was home to approximately 2,000 to 3,000 inhabitants during its most profitable times. The replica blockhouse, built in 1930, is open select hours (see website). The park also hosts the annual Feast of the Hunters' Moon festival in autumn. Programs and tours may be arranged through the Tippecanoe County Historical Association.



TIPPECANOE BATTLEFIELD PARK

Historic Lafayette Downtown

Head downtown and stroll the tree-lined streets with outdoor public art and beautiful turn-of-the-century architecture. Many original buildings from the late 1800s still stand, featuring a large variety of architectural facades. PUBLIC ART & HISTORIC ARCHITECTURE

Tippecanoe Battlefield & Museum

An 85-foot marble obelisk was erected in 1908 to mark the site of this National Historic Landmark for the 1811 Battle of Tippecanoe between the United States' forces, led by William Henry Harrison, and representatives of Tecumseh's Native American confederation. The museum tells the story of the battle. Guided tours and programming may be arranged through the Tippecanoe County Historical Association. Admission is charged for museum entry.

Tippecanoe County Courthouse

The Tippecanoe County Courthouse is on the National Register of Historic Places and is truly a site to see. Built in the 1880s, the courthouse was requested by the citizens to be "of permanent and durable character." Renovations over the years have ensured it will be here for many years to come. The courthouse has 100 columns, nine statues, a dome with four clock faces and a 3,000-pound bell. A 14-foot statue, depicting justice, tops the courthouse dome at a total height of 212 feet. LODGING & DINING

The historic Union Club Hotel, Purdue's only on-campus hotel, completed a comprehensive \$35 million, yearlong renovation in August 2020 where snapshots of Purdue's legacy can be found everywhere, including in the names of its three new dining concepts.

Owned by Purdue, the iconic property was built in phases and first opened in 1929 as an addition to the Purdue Memorial Union. The hotel is managed by White Lodging, one of the nation's largest hotel development and management companies. Based in northern Indiana, the company was founded by Purdue alumnus Bruce White.

The Union Club Hotel brings with it three new dining outlets for guests and the public:

- 8Eleven Bistro is a full-service modern restaurant serving breakfast, lunch and dinner.
- Boiler Up Bar, a refined cocktail lounge, honors the school's treasured traditions and iconic personalities.
- Leaps Coffee & Artisan Pastries is an energetic hub for grab 'n' go goodness, featuring a coffee and pastry counter with coffee and artisan teas.

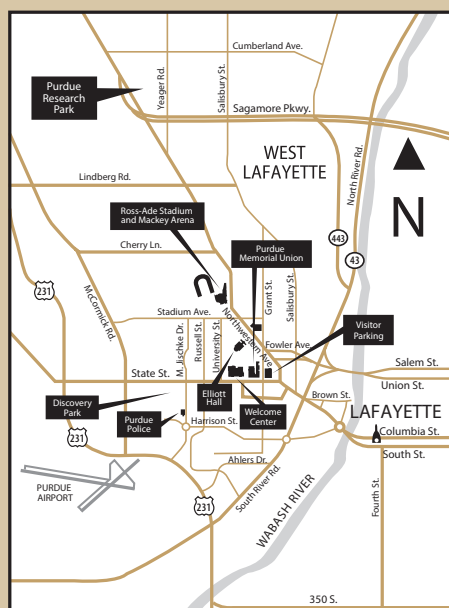

BOILERMAKER

Our “Boilermaker” nickname dates to 1891, when Purdue football players were featured in a Crawfordsville newspaper headline after they soundly defeated Wabash College.

'HAIL PURDUE'

Although University events are the most likely place for Boilermakers to join in a chorus of Purdue's official fight song, it's not uncommon to hear it somewhere on campus every day.

BOILERMAKER SPECIAL

Purdue's official mascot is the Boilermaker Special locomotive, and the first rendition of the Special was presented to the student body on Sept. 11, 1940.

PURDUE PETE

Pete is our unofficial mascot and is one of the most recognized characters in NCAA sports. Although he's undergone a few makeovers, you'll usually see him with trademark helmet and hammer, ready to cheer the Boilermakers on to victory.

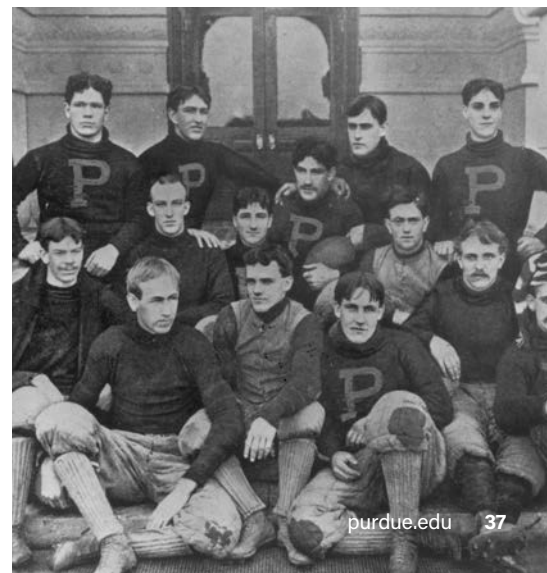
AN INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY

Purdue ranks as the No. 4 public institution in the U.S. for international student enrollment with more than 4,600 undergraduate international students and over 4,400 at the graduate and professional levels. Additionally, about 20% of our faculty was born outside the United States.

OUR UNIVERSAL PLACE IN SPACE

Purdue is called the “cradle of astronauts” for good reason. Twenty-five graduates have become astronauts, including the first and most recent people to walk on the moon. DAUCH ALUMNI CENTER

403 W. Wood St., 765-494-2727

The Dick and Sandy Dauch Alumni Center, dedicated in 2004, celebrates the history of Purdue and its alumni, serving as the primary center for more than 450,000 living alumni, including 72,000 Alumni Association members. The airy atrium houses several exhibits, highlighting University and alumni achievements.

ELLIOTT HALL OF MUSIC

712 Third St., 765-494-3920

Seating 6,005 people, Elliott Hall of Music is one of the nation's largest proscenium theaters. In 1934, Edward C. Elliott, Purdue president, envisioned a state-of-the-art music hall for the University. It was built during the Great Depression and dedicated on May 3-4, 1940. It hosts many Purdue Convocations events, such as Broadway musicals; operas; and rock, country and pop groups. It also is home to the Purdue Musical Organizations' Christmas Show.

FOUNTAINS

CLASS OF 1939 WATER SCULPTURE

This walk-through fountain, dedicated in 1989 with a gift from the Class of 1939 and known unofficially as the Engineering Fountain, is surrounded by engineering-related buildings and Hovde Hall in the heart of campus. A 10-foot protective cylinder was added over the nozzles in 2001 for safety.

JOHN PURDUE MEMORIAL FOUNTAIN

This fountain, located near University Hall, was a gift on behalf of the Class of 1894. In accordance with his wish, Purdue University benefactor John Purdue was buried near the fountain.

STONE LIONS FOUNTAIN

The Class of 1903 donated this fountain, which is located on the Oval Drive near Stanley Coulter Hall. A student-led fundraising effort restored the water connections to the fountain in 2001.

MCGINLEY FOUNTAIN

Dedicated as part of McGinley Plaza in 2009 near the Burton D. Morgan Center for Entrepreneurship in Discovery Park, this lighted, curved-glass fountain includes iconic campus images: Ross-Ade Stadium, Purdue Bell Tower, Purdue Memorial Union, Hovde Hall, Mackey Arena and Neil Armstrong Hall of Engineering.

PURDUE BELL TOWER

325 Centennial Mall Drive

The Purdue Bell Tower, which celebrated its 25th birthday in October 2020, stands 160 feet tall as an iconic campus reference point for visitors. A computerized carillon marks every half-hour and plays the Purdue fight song and the alma mater at 12:20 p.m., 5 p.m. and 10 p.m. As part of its birthday celebration in fall 2020, a time capsule was buried to recognize the milestone and this pandemic-marked time in campus and world history. That time capsule, and the one buried at its base during the 1995 dedication, will both be opened at its centennial in 2095.





HOVDE HALL

HOVDE HALL OF ADMINISTRATION

610 Purdue Mall

In 1975, Purdue renamed the Executive Building the Frederick L. Hovde Hall of Administration. During Hovde's presidency (1946-71), 80,000 men and women graduated from Purdue, and enrollment more than quadrupled. The offices of the president, provost, bursar and registrar are housed in Hovde Hall.

CÓRDOVA RECREATIONAL SPORTS CENTER

The France A. Córdoba Recreational Sports Center, known as the Co-Rec, is five floors of ultramodern fitness and wellness resources. After wrapping up a \$98 million renovation in 2012, the facility now boasts 355,000 square feet.



PURDUE MEMORIAL UNION

PURDUE MEMORIAL UNION

101 N. Grant St., 765-494-8900

Opened in 1924, the Purdue Memorial Union (PMU) commemorates the Purdue men and women who died in military service. Students of the Class of 1912 originated the "union" idea as a place to plan and conduct activities. Today, it remains a campus hub with dining, meeting rooms, recreation facilities and the newly renovated Union Club Hotel.

SCHLEMAN HALL OF STUDENT SERVICES

475 Stadium Mall Drive, 765-494-1776

Schleman Hall, home to Purdue student services and undergraduate admissions, is named for Helen Schleman, director of the first women's residence hall in 1934 and who served as dean of women, 1947-68. She championed women's rights, including terminating a curfew for women students and spearheading a freshman conference program for women.



UNIVERSITY HALL

UNIVERSITY HALL

672 Oval Drive

The only building remaining from the original six-building campus, University Hall was dedicated in 1877. Known as "The Main Building," it cost \$35,000 to complete and originally housed the Office of the President, a chapel and classrooms. It was remodeled in 1961 to house the Department of History.

WILMETH ACTIVE LEARNING CENTER

When the Thomas S. and Harvey D. Wilmeth Active Learning Center opened in fall 2017 with 27 active learning classrooms, the Library of Engineering and Science, and a grand reading room, it became an immediate academic destination daily for 5,000 students and faculty. The flexibility of the collaborative/learning/study space is showcased after classes end, when the building becomes one giant study area, open 24/7 to those who swipe a PUID card.

The splendor of the 164,000-square-foot building is the look and feel of the interior, rich with reproductions of historic photos and salvaged artifacts that memorialize the 1924 Heat and Power Plant with its towering smokestack that occupied this location for nearly 90 years. It was a source of power and heat to the Purdue campus and also a laboratory, or "active learning" experience, for engineering students.

KRACH LEADERSHIP CENTER

1198 Third St.

Dedicated in 2014, the Krach Leadership Center is a hub to help students succeed inside and outside the classroom. The center houses student resources, including academic help, leadership development programs and student organization meeting space. An Amazon Purdue site also is housed here.

MOVING IN PURSUIT OF THE *NEXT GIANT LEAP*

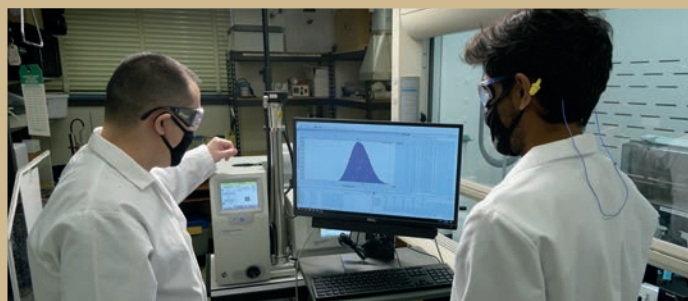

PURDUE GALLERIES

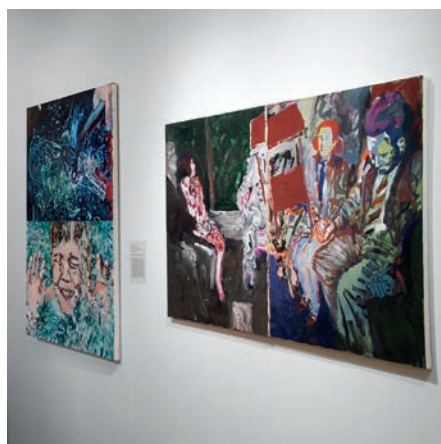

The multipurpose facility is named for Boilermaker and NFL quarterback great Drew and Brittany Brees (both Class of 2000).

ALEXANDER FIELD

Since its first game in 2013, Alexander Field has earned the reputation as one of the top collegiate baseball stadiums in the nation. It is named in honor of the late John and Anna Margaret Ross Alexander, parents of Dave Alexander, who provided the lead gift for the project. Dave Alexander was the Purdue baseball coach from 1978 to 1991.

BIRCK BOILERMAKER GOLF COMPLEX

The Birck Boilermaker Golf Complex features two public 18-hole championship courses — Ackerman-Allen and Kampen. Ackerman-Allen reopened in 2016 following a renovation designed to ensure that it is enjoyable for all to play.

The recipient of multiple Fields of Excellence awards, spectacular Folk Field soccer complex is named for Loren and Donna Folk, who were faithful Boilermakers and generously supported educational programs.

BITTINGER STADIUM

One of the finest collegiate softball facilities in the country, Bittinger Stadium opened in 2015. It is named in honor of Marvin L. and Elaine Bittinger and their family for their generosity and support of Purdue student-athletes.
