



#### **FIVE POINTS FIRE STATION MUSEUM**

1511 Main St., Lafayette, 765-429-1046

Restored to its 1937 heyday, the museum houses a 1937 Ahrens-Fox fire truck that made runs from the station for 40+ years. Historical memorabilia, photos, documents and run ledgers that tell the history of the Lafayette Fire Department can be found inside. Open Saturdays and by appointment. Home to North Central Health Child Safety Center.

### THE FARM AT PROPHETSTOWN

The Farm offers a unique 1920s farm experience with something for everyone. A large variety of heritage breed animals and heirloom gardens are there to enjoy. Two farmhouses give a glimpse into 1920s farm life, and a magnificent barn, a blacksmith shop, a corn crib, chicken coops and others. Events/classes include: beekeeping, farm tours, animal care, 1920s crafts and more. Farm-to-Table, multi-course dinners. Staff is dedicated to sharing historic and sustainable agriculture, homesteading arts and providing outstanding care to the animals. Admission-free with state park entry except for select special programs.

Picking and tasting a fresh cherry tomato, petting a chicken, finding an egg and playing with a simple toy from the 1920s. ### FORT OUIATENON HISTORIC PARK

Fort Ouiatenon (wee-ahteh-non), named for the Wea tribes in the area, was established by the French in 1717 as a fur trading post. It was one of the earliest European settlements in what was to become the state of Indiana. Archaeology and research show that the area was home to approximately 2,000 to 3,000 inhabitants during its peak period of habitation. The replica



### TIPPECANOE BATTLEFIELD

An 85-foot marble obelisk was erected in 1908 to mark the site of this National Historic Landmark for the 1811 Battle of Tippecanoe between the United States' forces, led by William Henry Harrison, and representatives of Tecumseh's Native American confederation. The museum tells the story of the battle. Tours and programming may be arranged through the Tippecanoe County Historical Association. Admission is charged for museum entry. See ad below.



### TIPPECANOE COUNTY COURTHOUSE

Tippecanoe County Courthouse

301 Main St., Lafayette tippecanoecountycourthouse.com

The Tippecanoe County Courthouse is on the National Register of Historic Places and is truly a site to see. Built in the 1880s, the courthouse was requested by the citizens to be "of permanent and durable character." Renovations over the years have ensured it will be here for many years to come. The courthouse has 100 columns, nine statues, a dome with four clock faces and a 3,000-pound bell. A 14-foot statue, depicting justice, tops the courthouse dome at a total height of 212 feet. ## THE HISTORIC PURDUE MEMORIAL UNION

The Purdue Memorial Union completed a \$47 million, 67,000-square-foot renovation of its ground floor in January 2022. The new layout provides 1,000+ interior and exterior seats, four performance stages and 12 dining venues — one of which is a sports bar co-owned by Purdue alumnus Drew Brees.

The iconic building opened in 1924, with additions like the Union Club Hotel, Purdue's only on-campus hotel, completing the building in 1929. The hotel is managed by White Lodging, one of the nation's largest hotel development and management companies, founded by Purdue alumnus Bruce White.

The Purdue Memorial Union provides 12 dining outlets for students and guests:

- **Aatish:** a halal contemporary kitchen.
- Barbecue District: featuring slow-cooked meats, regional sauces and sides.
- Boilermaker Market: a convenience store with food and beverages.
- Chef Bill Kim's: Asian-fusion food with dumplings and bowls.
- Fresh Fare: fresh flavors with an emphasis on dairyfree and gluten-free options.
- Latin Inspired by Chef John Manion: South American flavors and Latin fare from Brazil and American
- Pizza & Parm Shop: Detroit-style pizza with a caramelized cheese crust and parm sandwiches.
- Sol Toro: Mexican flavors with a modern flair.
- Starbucks: specialty coffee and pastries.
- Sushi Boss: fresh custom sushi.
- Walk-On's Sports Bistreaux: Louisiana-inspired cuisine with a game-day flair, co-owned by Purdue alumnus Drew Brees.
- Zen: build-your-own Poké and boba teas.

Snapshots of Purdue's legacy can be found throughout the building, including original outdoor fencing and railroad tracks in Walk-On's bar area, newly exposed walls from the original construction of the Purdue Memorial Union and more.



#### BOILERMAKER

In the 1890s, a newspaper referred to our winning football team as the "Burly Boiler Makers from Purdue." The nickname stuck.

#### **'HAIL PURDUE'**

Although university events are the most likely place for Boilermakers to join in a chorus of Purdue's official fight song, it's not uncommon to hear it somewhere on campus every day.

#### **BOILERMAKER SPECIAL**

Purdue's official mascot is the Boilermaker Special locomotive. The first rendition of the Special was presented to the student body on Sept. 11, 1940.

#### **PURDUE PETE**

Pete is our unofficial mascot and is one of the most recognized characters in NCAA sports. Although he's undergone a few makeovers, you'll usually see him with trademark helmet and hammer, ready to cheer the Boilermakers on to victory.


#### AN INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY

# PURDUE LANDMARKS

#### **DAUCH ALUMNI CENTER**

403 W. Wood St., 765-494-2727

The Dick and Sandy Dauch Alumni Center, dedicated in 2004, is the home of the Purdue for Life Foundation. The building celebrates the history of Purdue and its graduates, serving as the primary center for more than 600,000 living alumni. The airy atrium houses several exhibits, highlighting university and alumni achievements.

#### **ELLIOTT HALL OF MUSIC**

712 Third St., 765-494-3920

Seating 6,005 people, Elliott Hall of Music is one of the nation's largest proscenium theaters. In 1934, Edward C. Elliott, Purdue president, envisioned a state-of-the-art music hall for the university. It was built during the Great Depression and dedicated on May 3-4, 1940. It hosts many Purdue Convocations events such as Broadway musicals; operas; and rock, country and pop groups. It also is home to the Purdue Musical Organizations' Christmas Show.

#### **FOUNTAINS**

#### **CLASS OF 1939** WATER SCULPTURE

This walk-through fountain, dedicated in 1989 with a gift from the Class of 1939 and known unofficially as the Engineering Fountain, is surrounded by engineering-related buildings and Hovde Hall in the heart of campus. A 10-foot protective cylinder was added over the nozzles in 2001 for safety.

#### **CLASS OF 1894 FOUNTAIN**

This fountain, located near University Hall, was a gift on behalf of the Class of 1894. In accordance with his wish, Purdue University benefactor John Purdue was buried near the fountain.

#### STONE LIONS FOUNTAIN

The Class of 1903 donated this fountain, which is located on the Oval Drive near Stanley Coulter Hall. A student-led fundraising effort restored the water connections to the fountain in 2001.

#### McGINLEY FOUNTAIN

Dedicated as part of McGinley Plaza in 2009 near the Burton D. Morgan Center for Entrepreneurship in Discovery Park District at Purdue, this lighted, curved-glass fountain includes iconic campus images: Ross-Ade Stadium, Purdue Bell Tower, Purdue Memorial Union, Hovde Hall, Mackey Arena and Neil Armstrong Hall of Engineering.





#### **PURDUE BELL TOWER**

The Purdue Bell Tower, which celebrated its 25th birthday in October 2020, stands 160 feet tall as an iconic campus reference point for visitors. A computerized carillon marks every half-hour and plays the Purdue fight song and the alma mater at 12:20 p.m., 5 p.m. and 10 p.m. As part of its birthday celebration in fall 2020, a time capsule was placed to recognize the milestone and this pandemicmarked time in campus and world history. That time capsule, and the one buried at its base during the 1995 dedication, will both be opened at its centennial in 2095.

#### STEWART CENTER

#### 128 Memorial Mall Drive

In 1972, the Purdue Memorial Union — Hall of Music Annex was renamed the Stewart Center after R. B. Stewart, the university's treasurer. The facility serves as a dedicated meeting place for conferences, student organization meetings and departmental activities, as well as the home to the Boilermaker Station Welcome Center and the Purdue Team Store.

#### CÓRDOVA RECREATIONAL SPORTS CENTER

355 N. Martin Jischke Drive, 765-494-3109

The France A. Córdova Recreational Sports Center, known as the Co-Rec, is five floors of ultramodern fitness and wellness resources. After wrapping up a \$98 million renovation in 2012, the facility now boasts 355,000 square feet.

#### **PURDUE MEMORIAL UNION**

101 N. Grant St., 765-494-8900

Opened in 1924, the Purdue Memorial Union (PMU) commemorates the Purdue men and women who died in military service. Students of the Class of 1912 originated the "union" idea as a place to plan and conduct activities. Today, it remains a campus hub with dining, meeting rooms, recreation facilities and the newly renovated Union Club Hotel.

#### **UNIVERSITY HALL**

#### 672 Oval Drive

The only building remaining from the original six-building campus, University Hall was dedicated in 1877. Known as "The Main Building," it cost \$35,000 to complete and originally housed the Office of the President, a chapel and classrooms. It was remodeled in 1961 to house the Department of History.

#### **WILMETH ACTIVE LEARNING CENTER**

When the Thomas S. and Harvey D. Wilmeth Active Learning Center (WALC) opened in fall 2017 with 27 active learning classrooms, the Library of Engineering and Science, and a grand reading room, it became a daily academic destination for 5,000 students and faculty. The flexibility of the collaborative, learning and study space is showcased after classes end, when the building becomes one giant study area, open 24/7 to those who swipe

a PUID card. The 164,000-square-foot building is home to a variety of reproductions of historic photos and salvaged artifacts that memorialize the 1924 Heat and Power Plant, with its towering smokestack, that occupied this location for nearly 90 years. It was a source of power and heat to the Purdue campus and also a laboratory, or "active learning" experience, for engineering students.

#### **KRACH LEADERSHIP CENTER**

Dedicated in 2014, the Krach Leadership Center is a hub to help students succeed inside and outside the classroom. The center houses student resources, including academic help, leadership development programs and student organization meeting space. An Amazon Purdue site also is housed here.





It is named in honor of the late John and Anna Margaret Ross Alexander, parents of Dave Alexander, who provided the lead gift for the project. Dave Alexander was the Purdue baseball coach from 1978 to 1991.

#### BIRCK BOILERMAKER GOLF COMPLEX

The Birck Boilermaker Golf Complex features two public 18-hole championship courses designed by renowned architect Pete Dye. In 2022, the Purdue University Board of Trustees approved the naming of the new Dye Clubhouse, a state-of-the-art facility made possible by Sam and Marsha Allen and their gift of over \$20 million.

#### **FOLK FIELD**

#### 1350 McCormick Road

The recipient of multiple Fields of Excellence awards, the spectacular Folk Field soccer complex is named for Loren and Donna Folk, who were faithful Boilermakers and generously supported educational programs.

#### **BITTINGER STADIUM**

#### 1330 McCormick Road

One of the finest collegiate softball facilities in the country, Bittinger Stadium opened in 2015. It is named in honor of Marvin L. and Elaine Bittinger and their family for their generosity and support of Purdue student athletes.
