

ARGANBRIGHT GENEALOGY CENTER AND THE TIPPECANOE COUNTY HISTORICAL ASSOCIATION (TCHA)

1001 South St., Lafayette, 765-476-8411 tippecanoehistory.org

Operated by TCHA, Arganbright Genealogy Center is the destination for finding Tippeanoe County family heritage and local history.

TCHA is a non-profit organization dedicated to collecting and preserving information and artifacts relating to the history and culture of Tippecanoe County, and its residents.



THE CARETAKER'S COTTAGE

1513 N. Salisbury St., West Lafayette wlaf.lib.in.us

The Caretaker's Cottage was purchased in 2017 and restored by the City of West Lafayette. Drawing from its history archives collection and community resources, West Lafayette Public Library uses the Cottage to tell the story of West Lafayette's rich history through displays and events. Admission is free to this family-friendly facility.



FIVE POINTS FIRE STATION MUSEUM 1511 Main St., Lafayette, 765-429-1046

Restored to its 1937 heyday, the museum houses a 1937 Ahrens-Fox fire truck that made runs from the station for 40+ years. Historical memorabilia, photos, documents and run ledgers that tell the history of the Lafayette Fire Department can be found inside. Open Saturdays and by appointment. Home to North Central Health Child Safety Center.

THE FARM AT PROPHETSTOWN

at Prophetstown State Park

3534 Prophetstown Rd., West Lafayette, 765-567-4700, prophetstown.org

The Farm offers a unique 1920s farm experience with something for everyone. A large variety of heritage breed animals and heirloom gardens are there to enjoy. Two farmhouses give a glimpse into 1920s farm life, and a magnificent barn, a blacksmith shop, a corn crib, chicken coops and others. Events/classes include; beekeeping, farm tours, animal care, 1920s crafts and more. Farm-to-Table, multi-course dinners. Staff is dedicated to sharing historic and sustainable agriculture, homesteading arts and providing outstanding care to the animals. Admission-free with state park entry except for special programming.

FORT OUIATENON HISTORIC PARK

3129 S. River Rd., West Lafayette, 765-476-8411, tippecanoehistory.org Fort Ouiatenon (wee-ah-teh-non), named for the Wea tribes in the area, was established by the French in 1717 as a fur trading post. It was one of the earliest European settlements in what was to become the state of Indiana. Archaeology and research show that the area was home to approximately 2,000 to 3,000 inhabitants during its peak period of habitation. The replica blockhouse, built in 1930, is open select hours (see website). The park also hosts the annual Feast of the Hunters' Moon festival in autumn. Programs and tours may be arranged through the Tippecanoe County Historical Association.

HISTORIC DOWNTOWN LAFAYETTE

Head downtown and stroll the tree-lined streets with outdoor public art and beautiful turn-of-the-century architecture. Many original buildings from the late 1800s still stand, featuring a large variety of architectural facades. Additional things to do downtown can be found on pages 20-22.



PROPHET'S ROCK

6000 Prophets Rock Rd., West Lafayette, tippecanoehistory.org

Visit the large rock formation where the Shawnee prophet Tenskwatawa stood and riled his people into battle by singing war songs and chanting incantations during the Battle of Tippecanoe. Located at Prophet's Rock Park, west of the Tippecanoe Battlefield and Museum.



PURDUE UNIVERSITY purdue.edu

Founded in 1869 after Lafayette businessman John Purdue donated land and money to establish a college of science. The university has played a major role in the development of our community. Today, Purdue University is a world-renowned, public research university that advances discoveries in science, technology, engineering and math. See pages 57-70 for additional information.



TIPPECANOE BATTLEFIELD & MUSEUM 200 Battle Ground Ave., Battle Ground 765-567-2147, tippecanoehistory.org

An 85-foot marble obelisk was erected in 1908 to mark the site of this National Historic Landmark for the 1811 Battle of Tippecanoe between the United States' forces, led by William Henry Harrison, and representatives of Tecumseh's Native American confederation. The museum tells the story of the battle. Tours and programming may be arranged through the Tippecanoe County Historical Association. Admission charged for museum entry.



TIPPECANOE COUNTY COURTHOUSE 301 Main St., Lafayette tippecanoecountycourthouse.com

Listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Built in the 1880s, the courthouse was requested by the citizens to be "of permanent and durable character." Renovations over the years have ensured it will be here for many years to come. The courthouse has 100 columns, nine statues, a dome with four clock faces and a 3,000-pound bell. A 14-foot statue, depicting Justice, tops the courthouse dome at a total height of 226 feet. Self-guided tour brochures are available at homeofpurdue.com.

THE HISTORIC PURDUE MEMORIAL UNION

The Purdue Memorial Union opened in 1924 as a permanent memorial to the Boilermakers who served in defense of their country and as a cultural and social hub for Boilermakers and the surrounding community. It provides 1,000-plus interior and exterior seats, four performance stages and 15 dining venues — one of which is a sports bar co-owned by Purdue alumnus Drew Brees.

The Union Club Hotel is the largest hotel in the Greater Lafayette area and is managed by White Lodging, one of the nation's largest hotel development and management companies, founded by Purdue alumnus Bruce White.

The Purdue Memorial Union provides 15 dining outlets for students and guests:

BOILERMAKER

In the 1890s, a newspaper referred to our winning football team as the "Burly Boiler Makers from Purdue." The nickname stuck.

'HAIL PURDUE!'

Although university events are the most likely place for Boilermakers to join in a chorus of Purdue's official fight song, it's not uncommon to hear it somewhere on campus every day.

BOILERMAKER SPECIAL

Purdue's official mascot is the Boilermaker Special locomotive, which can be seen all over campus as well as at every home or away football game, no matter how far — it can go up to 75 mph! The first rendition of the Special was presented to the student body Sept. 11, 1940.

PURDUE PETE

Pete is our unofficial mascot and one of the most recognized characters in NCAA sports. Although he's undergone a few makeovers, you'll usually see him with trademark helmet and hammer, ready to cheer the Boilermakers on to victory.

AN INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY

Purdue has a diverse student body, with students from 127 countries. We have more than 4,000 undergraduate international students and more than 5,300 at the graduate and professional levels.

OUR UNIVERSAL PLACE IN SPACE

Purdue is called the Cradle of Astronauts for good reason. Twenty-seven graduates have become astronauts, including the first and most recent people to walk on the moon. And we have an even broader link to space exploration. Many Purdue professors and students — past and present — are deeply involved in research that advances our reach into space while improving lives on Earth.

PURDUE LANDMARKS

DAUCH ALUMNI CENTER

403 W. Wood St., 765-494-2727 The Dick and Sandy Dauch Alumni Center, dedicated in 2004, is the home of the Purdue for Life Foundation. The building celebrates the history of Purdue and its graduates, including more than 600,000 living alumni. The airy atrium houses several exhibits, highlighting university and alumni achievements.

ELLIOTT HALL OF MUSIC

712 Third St., 765-494-3920

Seating 6,005 people, Elliott Hall of Music is one of the nation's largest proscenium theaters. In 1934 Purdue President Edward C. Elliott envisioned a state-of-the-art music hall for the university. It was built during the Great Depression and dedicated May 3-4, 1940. The facility hosts many Purdue Convocations events such as Broadway musicals; operas; and rock, country and pop groups. It also is home to the Purdue Musical Organizations' Christmas Show.

FOUNTAINS

CLASS OF 1939 WATER SCULPTURE

This walk-through fountain, dedicated in 1989 with a gift from the Class of 1939 and known unofficially as the Engineering Fountain, is surrounded by engineering buildings and Hovde Hall in the heart of campus. A 10-foot protective cylinder was added over the nozzles in 2001 for safety.

CLASS OF 1894 FOUNTAIN

This fountain, located near University Hall, was a gift on behalf of the Class of 1894. In accordance with his wish, Purdue University benefactor John Purdue was buried near the fountain.

STONE LIONS FOUNTAIN

The Class of 1903 donated this fountain, which is located on Oval Drive near Stanley Coulter Hall. A student-led fundraising effort restored the water connections to the fountain in 2001.

McGINLEY FOUNTAIN

Dedicated as part of McGinley Plaza in 2009 near the Burton D. Morgan Center for Entrepreneurship in Discovery Park District at Purdue, this lighted, curved-glass fountain includes iconic campus images: Ross-Ade Stadium, the Purdue Bell Tower, Purdue Memorial Union, Hovde Hall, Mackey Arena and Neil Armstrong Hall of Engineering.





PURDUE BELL TOWER 325 Centennial Mall Drive

The Purdue Bell Tower stands 160 feet tall as an iconic campus reference point for visitors. A computerized carillon marks every half-hour and plays the Purdue fight song and alma mater at 12:20 p.m., 5 p.m. and 10 p.m. As part of the bell tower's 25th birthday celebration in fall 2020, a time capsule was placed at its base to recognize the milestone and time in campus and world history. The 2020 time capsule, and the one buried during the 1995 dedication, will both be opened at the bell tower's centennial in 2095.

In 1972 the Purdue Memorial Union's Hall of Music Annex was renamed Stewart Center after R.B. Stewart, the university's treasurer. The facility serves as a dedicated meeting place for conferences, student organization meetings and departmental activities, and it houses the Boilermaker Station Welcome Center and Purdue Team Store.

CÓRDOVA RECREATIONAL SPORTS CENTER

355 N. Martin Jischke Drive, 765-494-3109

The France A. Córdova Recreational Sports Center, known as the Co-Rec, features five floors of ultramodern fitness and wellness resources. After a \$98 million renovation concluded in 2012, the facility now boasts 355,000 square feet.

PURDUE MEMORIAL UNION

101 N. Grant St., 765-494-8900

Opened in 1924, the Purdue Memorial Union is dedicated to the Purdue men and women who died in military service. Students of the Class of 1912 originated the "union" idea as a place to plan and conduct activities. The facility remains a campus hub, featuring dining, meeting rooms, recreation facilities and the Union Club Hotel.

WILMETH ACTIVE LEARNING CENTER

340 Centennial Mall Drive

When the Thomas S. and Harvey D. Wilmeth Active Learning Center opened in fall 2017 with 27 active learning classrooms, the Library of Engineering and Science, and a grand reading room, it became a daily academic destination for 5,000 students and faculty. The flexibility of the collaborative, learning and study space is showcased after classes end, when the building becomes one giant study area, open 24/7 to those who swipe a PUID card.



UNIVERSITY HALL

UNIVERSITY HALL

672 Oval Drive

The only building remaining from Purdue's original six-building campus, University Hall was dedicated in 1877. Known as the "Main Building," it cost \$35,000 to complete and originally housed the Office of the President, a chapel and classrooms. It was remodeled in 1961 to house the Department of History.

PURDUE UNIVERSITY AIRPORT

Founded in 1930, the Purdue University Airport was the country's first university-owned airport and serves as the cornerstone of the university's long aviation history. Today, the Purdue University Airport (LAF) serves commercial airline passengers, passenger and cargo charters, and military operators. It is the "largest classroom on campus" for more than 1,000 students in the School of Aviation and Transportation Technology.


KRACH LEADERSHIP CENTER


MACKEY ARENA

900 John R. Wooden Drive, 765-494-3194

The iconic Purdue men's and women's basketball facility — host to more than 1,000 Boilermaker wins since its opening in 1967 — provides a distinct home-court advantage. Seating and amenities for fans are among the best in the country. Guy "Red" Mackey served Purdue Athletics for 46 years, including 29 as athletic director. The arena's capacity is 14,222.

ROSS-ADE STADIUM

850 Beering Drive, 765-494-3194 Named for alumnus and inventor David Ross (Class of 1893) and author and humorist George Ade (Class of 1887), Ross-Ade Stadium is the home field of the Purdue Boilermakers football team. In 2023 the stadium received a \$45.4 million renovation, increasing its capacity to 61,441 and improving the student-athlete and fan experience.

HOLLOWAY GYMNASIUM

1000 John R. Wooden Drive

The Drew and Brittany Brees Student-Athlete Academic Center includes Holloway Gymnasium, home to Boilermaker volleyball and wrestling. The gym is named in honor of Bob Holloway, a 1948 Purdue graduate and longtime athletics benefactor. The multipurpose facility is named for Boilermaker and NFL quarterback Drew Brees and his wife, Brittany (both Class of 2000).

ALEXANDER FIELD

1350 McCormick Road

Since hosting its first game in 2013, Alexander Field has earned the reputation as one of the top collegiate baseball stadiums in the nation. It is named in honor of the late John and Anna Margaret Ross Alexander, parents of Dave Alexander, who provided the lead gift for the project. Dave Alexander was the Purdue baseball coach from 1978-91.

BIRCK BOILERMAKER GOLF COMPLEX

1300 Cherry Lane, 765-494-3139 The Birck Boilermaker Golf Complex features two public, 18-hole championship courses designed by renowned architect Pete Dye. In 2022 the Purdue University Board of Trustees approved the naming of the new Dye Clubhouse, a state-of-the-art facility made possible by Sam and Marsha Allen and their gift of over \$20 million.

FOLK FIELD

1350 McCormick Road

The recipient of multiple Fields of Excellence awards, the spectacular Folk Field soccer complex is named for Loren and Donna Folk, who were faithful Boilermakers and generously supported educational programs.

BITTINGER STADIUM

1330 McCormick Road

One of the finest collegiate softball facilities in the country, Bittinger Stadium opened in 2015. It is named in honor of Marvin L. and Elaine Bittinger and their family for their generosity and support of Purdue student-athletes.

SCHWARTZ TENNIS CENTER

1324 McCormick Road, 765-494-3600 The Dennis J. and Mary Lou Schwartz Tennis Center is a 60,000-square-foot facility highlighted by the Basham Courts — six indoor and 12 outdoor courts available for public use.
