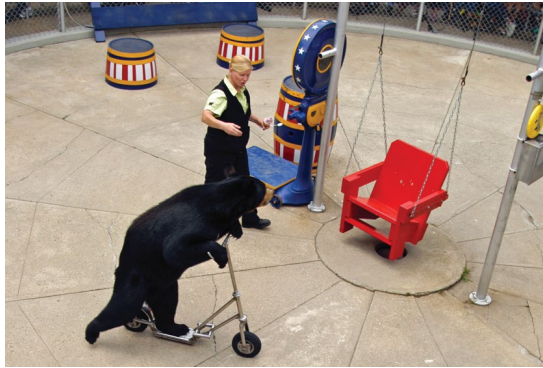

Suggested Areas for Viewing Moose

*While these large mammals can be spotted pretty much anywhere, they tend to prefer wet, muddy areas known as "moose wallows" beside the road from dusk to dawn. You may find the best way to see a moose is to join one of several moose tours in the area. **If you do see a moose, remember to keep your distance! Moose are extremely large animals and can be very dangerous.***

- Route 112 W from Woodstock to Woodsville
- Route 118 from Woodstock to Warren
- Route 116 from Easton to Franconia
- Route 3 in Franconia Notch State Park
- Route 3 from Exit 35 to Twin Mountain
- Route 2 from Jefferson to Gorham
- Route 2 from Gorham to Shelburne
- Route 302 in Crawford Notch State Park
- Route 49 from Campton to Waterville Valley
