 available at their all-new creamery. Next,
 sip wine at Grace Hill Winery, a familyowned winery located nearby.

Thursday Tours:

- Architecture & Art Tour: Attendees will discover downtown architecture and art at places like the Wichita-Sedgwick County Historical Museum, the newlyrestored Union Station and the ICT Pop-Up Urban Park. Then, those who sign up for this tour will visit Wichita's Frank Lloyd Wright Allen House.
- Wichita Aviation/Air Capital of the World Tour: Soar into Wichita's legacy as the Air Capital of the World. Iconic aviation brands Beechcraft, Cessna and Stearman were born in Wichita: and modern-day Airbus Americas, Bombardier, Spirit Aerosystems and Textron Aviation now design and manufacture aircraft and aircraft parts in the city. This tour will take you to **Exploration Place**, which showcases Wichita's aerospace experts and resources, and Stearman Field Bar & Grill, where you can rub elbows with aviation enthusiasts and watch aircraft take off and land 20 yards from you.
- Wichita Breweries/Urban Art Tour:
 This tour will take attendees on an urban art journey through downtown Wichita, Wichita's North End and

the trendy **Douglas Design District**, which is home to murals and unique shops like **The Spice Merchant** and **The Workroom**. Start the **Horizontes mural**, the "largest mural in the world by a single artist," before viewing murals in the North End and seeing the impressive Horizontes mural. Then, visit the **Douglas Design District** and a couple of breweries for tours and samples including Wichita's first taproom, **Hopping Gnome Brewing Company**, and also nearby **Central Standard Brewing**.

• Wild in Wichita Tour: This tour will begin with a visit to the **Sedgwick** County Zoo, the seventh-largest zoo in the country, for an exclusive tour. As a part of the boat ride, you ride through the same water the Elephants of the Zambezi River Valley. It's the third-largest elephant habitat in the country, and includes the world's largest elephant pool, holding 550,000 gallons of water! Also, attendees will pet and feed unique animals at Tanganyika Wildlife Park, an exotic, privatelyowned destination, which offers oncein-a-lifetime opportunities to interact with wildlife.

- Wichita Aviation/Air Capital of the World Tour: Soar into Wichita's legacy as the Air Capital of the World. Iconic aviation brands Beechcraft, Cessna and Stearman were born in Wichita; and modern-day Airbus Americas, Bombardier, Spirit Aerosystems and Textron Aviation now design and manufacture aircraft and aircraft parts in the city. This tour will take you to the Kansas Aviation Museum and then to Stearman Field Bar & Grill, an eatery at a private airport where your table is a mere 20 yards from a landing strip. You never know what aircraft will come flying in! Then, learn how airplanes are designed, built and flown at **Exploration** Place's hands-on Design Build Fly exhibit, which showcases Wichita's aerospace experts and resources. End your journey at Aero Plains Brewing, where beers are brewed at 'the crossroads of history and innovation' and the bar is made from the wing of a Beech Model 18.
- Wichita History/Old West Tour: Wichita began as a trading post on the Chisholm Trail in the 1860s, and was incorporated in 1870. It subsequently became a key destination for cattle drives traveling north from Texas to access railroads, earning it the nickname "Cowtown." Visit Old Cowtown Museum where you'll be transported in time to the 1860s in Wichita. Then, you'll head to the Historic Delano District, which sits where the Chisholm Trail once was. Enjoy lunch at Monarch in the Delano District before going on a tour at the Wichita-Sedgwick

County Historical Museum, located in Wichita's original city hall building, and end at Blade & Timber.

- Wild in Wichita Tour: This tour will begin with a visit Botanica Wichita, where you'll experience nature and the uniqueness of North America's heartland. Next, indulge in wood-fired pizzas and hand-crafted beers at Wichita Brewing Co. & Pizzeria - West. From there, visit the **Sedgwick County Zoo**, the seventhlargest zoo in the country, for an exclusive tour. As a part of the boat ride, you ride through the same water the Elephants of the Zambezi River Valley. It's the thirdlargest elephant habitat in the country, and includes the world's largest elephant pool, holding 550,000 gallons of water! Last, attendees will pet and feed unique animals at Tanganyika Wildlife Park, an exotic, privately-owned destination, which offers once-in-a-lifetime opportunities to interact with wildlife.

Saturday Tours:

- Nature Tour: Kick off this adventurous wour with lunch at Sweet Allie B's Limestone Beer Co. followed by a visit to Botanica Wichita. End this tour with exploring the area around the Arkansas River. Also try kayaking/Stand-Up Paddleboard (SUP) on the river to get an exceptional view of the Keeper of the Plains.
- Wichita Sweets Treats Tour: Come along on a culinary adventure through a selection of Wichita's sweetest kitchens and sweet shops. This tour starts with lunch at PourHouse and takes attendees behind the scenes to meet Wichita's most notable candy makers and bakers. Stops include a "national treasure" according to Alton Brown, at the Nifty Nut House. Next stops would be Dapper Doughnuts, Old Mill Tasty Shop, Cocoa Dolce and others.
- Wichita History/Old West Tour:
 Wichita began as a trading post on the
 Chisholm Trail in the 1860s, and was
 incorporated in 1870. It subsequently
 became a key destination for cattle
 drives traveling north from Texas to

access railroads, earning it the nickname "Cowtown." Enjoy lunch at **Delano Barbecue Co.** in the Delano District, which sits where the Chisholm Trail once was, before visiting the **Old Cowtown Museum** where you'll be transported in time to the 1860s in Wichita. Then, go on a tour at the **Wichita-Sedgwick County Historical Museum**, located in Wichita's original city hall building, and end at **Blade & Timber**.

Architecture & Art Tour (Wichita State):
 The tour will begin with lunch at Prost in Wichita's shipping container community, Revolutsia. Attendees will then discover art at Ulrich Museum of Art and throughout Wichita's State University's campus. After touring WSU, attendees will make their way to visit Wichita's Frank Lloyd Wright Allen House.

5–6 p.m. Return to hotel for evening refresh.

6:15 p.m. Saturday Closing Dinner:

Guests will enjoy access to the Wichita Art Museum's galleries, an outdoor terrace with a view of the city, and a lovely meal while closing remarks are made and Mark Twain Awards are presented.
