# Six Peaks Winery to Open New Tasting Room

This June, Six Peaks Vineyard in Hillsboro is set to unveil its newest tasting room. Established in the fertile soils of the Willamette Valley in 1981, the vineyard is renowned for its exceptional whites, such as Gewurztraminer and Sauvignon blanc, alongside clone-designate Pinot noir sourced from the region. The timing of the opening couldn't be better, aligning perfectly with the bustling summer season.

# **Cho Wines** Announces Opening of New Tasting Room and Winery

As of April, Cho Wines has officially opened its new winery and tasting room in the Chehalem Mountains AVA. With floor-to-ceiling windows and incredible wines, the state's first Korean-American-owned label is pouring dazzling Aligoté, Chardonnay, Pinot noir, Sparkling wines, and wines co-fermented with other fruits. Cho has received much praise lately for its charismatic owners and creative approach to winemaking.

# **Corollary Winery** Will Open a New Tasting Room in May

Focused entirely on Sparkling wine, Corollary is set to open its Eola-Amity Hills AVA estate tasting room in May. The label shows just how diverse the bubbly category is, making vineyard-designated versions, various kinds of Sparkling rosé, and extended tirage offerings. The owners acquired the 57-acre vineyard in 2022, having made their first vintage in 2017.

### **Artist Block Wine** is Opening a Satellite Tasting Room in Newberg

Introducing Artist Block's latest venture: a new satellite tasting room in Newberg that seamlessly blends fine art with vibrant wines. Scheduled for a May opening, this elegant space will embody the brand's commitment to crafting wines of integrity and creativity. It invites guests to explore their boundary-breaking approach to winemaking and art collecting. Paired with a hidden speakeasy, it promises an unforgettable tasting experience in the heart of the Willamette Valley.

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### **Antica Terra** Offers New Tasting Options

It's been a busy year for Antica Terra as the lauded wine label acquired a vineyard and is now working on a barrel hall tasting room, which is set to open in May. The hall will feature intimate tasting bays for thoughtful wine collectors. In June, the label plans to offer a tasting in the trees option wherein visitors gather around a concrete table (poured on site using materials from the land) set in the heart of the property, surrounded by natural beauty.

# **Domaine Lumineux** Debuts New Tasting Room and Name Change

Domaine de Broglie, now rebranded as Domaine Lumineux, has unveiled its latest gem: a brand-new tasting room in downtown Newberg. Housed within a picturesque Victorian building, easily accessible from the street, this enchanting space offers the choice of indoor seating amidst the movie sets of Francis Ford Coppola's latest film or the serene ambiance of outdoor seating under the shade of cherry trees. Despite the name change, the heart and soul of Domaine Lumineux remain untouched, with its dedicated staff continuing to craft exceptional wines sourced from their cherished 42-acre vineyard in the Dundee Hills AVA.

#### Lachini Vineyards to Open Mediterranean-Inspired Tasting Room

Nearing its grand opening, the soon-to-be-unveiled Lachini tasting space promises to be an extraordinary destination. Additionally, the tasting room proudly highlights works from other talented local artists.

Millet, renowned for his expertise, commenced his journey with the label last fall, complementing the managerial prowess of James Cahill from North Valley Vineyards. Don't miss their 1974 Throwback Weekend on May 25th and 26th, celebrating 50 years of grape growing with a retro-style open house, complete with a tree planting ceremony by co-founders Pat and Joe Campbell. Plus, stay tuned for the grand opening of their new event space in July 2024, promising a modern upgrade from the beloved 1981 tasting room. And for a musical treat, check out Vibes & Vines, their new outdoor music series set in the scenic amphitheater, with entry priced at just \$10.

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### **The AVP Wine Collective Incubator Program Announced**

The AVP Wine Collective is launching an incubator program aimed at cultivating the next generation of Oregon winemakers. Led by Carrie Wynkoop, Corey Schuster, and Cristina Gonzales, this initiative aims to support diversity in winemaking by providing training, resources, and expertise to two to three aspiring winemakers annually. Applicants, regardless of experience, are encouraged to apply, especially those from historically underserved communities. Selected participants will receive access to production equipment, winemaker and business consulting, community networking opportunities, and discounted production fees for one year. Applications are due by April 30, with selections announced by May 15.

# **Cristom Vineyards Plants an Orchard**

Grapes aren't the only thing Cristom is growing. The revered Salem producer has planted 40 fruit trees next to its Viognier in their Louise Vineyard. The so-called "Z orchard" is planted in nectarine, peach, pear, and apple trees, adding another layer of agriculture and biodiversity to the fertile estate.

#### Et Fille's Winemaker to Present at First Nikkei Wine Summit

More than 200 attendees are anticipated to participate in the inaugural Nikkei Wine Summit taking place this June in Los Angeles. This educational event aims to foster awareness about Japanese wine-makers, proprietors, growers, and professionals, while also engaging wine enthusiasts and community members interested in Nikkei wine. Among the distinguished participants, Jessica Mozeico, the esteemed winemaker and owner of Et Fille, will proudly represent her brand and the Willamette Valley.

#### Farm Lunch at Alloro

Alloro Vineyard now features an elegant midday lunch by former JORY chef Chris Smith. The menu is inspired by the Alloro owner's Croatian and Italian heritage. It consists of dishes sourced from the onsite farm (and within a 100-mile radius, for the things they don't grow) and paired with their treasured Pinot noir, Riesling, and Sparkling wines.

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#### **James Beard Love**

The region was just handed some more culinary praise on behalf of the James Beard Awards. McMinnville restaurant <u>Hayward</u> was nominated for Best New Restaurant while Portland restaurants <u>Langbaan</u>, <u>Lovely's Fifty-Fifty</u>, and <u>JinJu Patisserie</u> received nods. It's yet another round of critical acclaim for the Willamette Valley's robust culinary culture.

#### Nick's Italian Cafe to Return

Wine country staple and James Beard Award-winning restaurant Nick's will reopen later this year. After shocking the community by shutting down last July, the restaurant is set to come back to life. New ownership from the founders of Earth & Sea in Carlton will see that Nick's bounces back and pledges to honor the many staples on the original menu. The restaurant originally opened in 1977 and will remain in its initial location on historic Third Street in McMinnville.

#### SOMMTV Movie Streams 'Cup of Salvation' featuring the Maysara Team

Currently available for streaming on SommTV, 'Cup of Salvation' is a celebrated new wine film captivating audiences. The storyline follows a family's captivating journey to resurrect ancient Armenian wine varieties. Notably, the film includes appearances by the esteemed Momtazi family from the Willamette Valley, renowned as the proprietors of the esteemed Maysara Wines. Having fled Iran before the revolution, the Momtazi family found refuge in McMinnville, where they established their winery. Today, with a second-generation winemaker at the helm, their legacy continues to flourish.

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<u>Summit</u>. Taste straight from the barrel at pioneering <u>Ponzi Vineyards</u>, or do the same at <u>Willamette Valley Vineyards</u>, where you can even create your own wine blend.

### Mom-Made Wine for Mother's Day

Celebrate Mother's Day with a wine made by mothers. Hard-working moms are behind some of the best wines in the region; just ask Jessica Mozeico at <u>Et Fille</u>, Anna Matzinger at <u>Matzinger Davies</u>, Tahmiene Momtazi at <u>Maysara</u>, Wynn Peterson-Nedry <u>Ribbon Ridge</u>, and more. Come harvest, it's double duty as these vintners are looking after their own kiddos and the ones they're raising in the cellar.

Wine and food are meant for each other and often in plain sight, with producers reserving at least a part of their estate for a garden. The ingredients may end up in tasting room snacks or on the house restaurant's menu, destined to be paired with the right wine.
