More Flights to Wine Country

Rising interest in the Willamette Valley is fueling an increase in direct flights to its renowned wine country. The newest route connects two vibrant cities, with <u>Allegiant Air</u> now offering direct flights between Austin, Texas, and Eugene, Oregon, at the heart of the southern Willamette Valley wine region. Visitors can dive into the area's rich offerings, from the picturesque vineyards of <u>King Estate</u> and <u>Iris Vineyards</u> to Eugene's vibrant culinary scene. In addition to the Austin-Eugene route, Allegiant also offers direct flights from Santa Ana, Las Vegas, and Phoenix to Eugene.

Pigskin and Pinot

With the University of Oregon now in the Big Ten, Willamette Valley Wine Country is excited to introduce football fans to a local favorite: wine. As fans and tailgaters converge on Eugene for the games, they'll discover more than just top-tier football—they'll be treated to the region's culinary delights and outstanding wines. This college football shift pairs some of the nation's top-ranked teams with one of the world's premier wine destinations, including winery gems like Sweet Cheeks Winery, which is working with the University on various events and sponsorships.

Craft and Craft

Willamette Valley wineries have a longstanding tradition of collaboration and a deep connection to their environment, a spirit that continues to thrive today. At <u>Abbey Road Farm</u>, this is celebrated through events like the Fall Market, where wine sets the stage for a gathering of local artisans, musi-

An Off The Beaten Path Overnight

While a cozy bed and breakfast is always appealing, sometimes we crave something different. The Willamette Valley offers plenty of unique options, providing the perfect setting for an unforgettable weekend getaway. Guests can stay in a vintage luxury Airstream at The Vintages resort, where a film and wine series awaits during harvest season. For a more unusual experience, consider a night at the historic and allegedly haunted Hotel Oregon, or opt for a stay in a converted farm silo at Abbey Road Farm. If you're traveling with a group, the Atticus Hotel, The Independence Hotel, and The Dundee Hotel all offer bunk rooms that accommodate multiple guests.

Fall Colors During Harvest

Autumn is synonymous with harvest in the Willamette Valley, but the color palette afforded by the foliage can be equally captivating. The region's many deciduous trees come to life, framing vineyards in brilliant yellow and reds. The vineyards, too, change color before dropping their leaves and going dormant for the winter. Many vineyards celebrate as much, with <u>natural trails</u> through their estate and nibbles of just-picked grape clusters.

Finding Italy in the Willamette Valley

For wine enthusiasts dreaming of Italy, the Willamette Valley offers a taste of Mediterranean flair without the transatlantic journey. Alloro Vineyards brings a European touch with Pranzo, a garden-sourced lunch paired with estate wines, and Cinque Case, a five-course meal celebrating autumnal ingredients like chestnuts, curated by renowned chef Chris Smith. Ponzi Vineyards honors its Italian roots by cultivating Arneis and Dolcetto since 1994, finding the Willamette Valley's cool climate perfect for these Piedmont varieties. Apolloni is the only vineyard in the valley with estate-grown Sangiovese Grosso and produces Nebbiolo. Remy Wines, known for its estate-grown Lagrein, also sources Dolcetto, Sangiovese, Barbera, and Nebbiolo from nearby regions. Cana's Feast Winery even established the Italy in the Valley wine festival, celebrating the Northwest's unique interpretation of classic Italian wines, with the winemaker drawing inspiration from the rich traditions of the Italian peninsula.

McMinnville welcomes Björnson Vineyards to the sprawling wine scene. The Eola-Amity producer specializes in Pinot noir, Chardonnay, Auxerrois, and more, with the new tasting spot offering a more intimate alternative to its estate tasting room and vineyard. The new Davis Street location offers the same convivial atmosphere and award-winning wines.

New Ambar Estate Tasting Room

Newberg-based Ambar Estate unveiled its stunning new tasting room on June 20th. This captivating glass-walled space offers breathtaking views of the estate vines and Mt. Hood, providing a picturesque backdrop for various tastings, including food pairings and private suite experiences. Buzzing with a new radiant home in Amity, Corollary Wines is set up in a prime spot to pour its 100% sparkling offerings. The firetruck-red tasting room is a stunning piece of modern architecture, with unique open areas ideal for absorbing the surroundings. Private seated tastings are available by appointment.

New Tasting Room for Six Peaks

Hillsboro producer Six Peaks Winery will soon have a new tasting room. Visitors will be treated to estate wines, mountain views, and tasty bites at the expanded space, set to open in June next year. It's an exciting development in the emerging Laurelwood AVA of the Chehalem Mountains. Six Peaks sources fruit from that appellation and other spots in the Valley and Walla Walla.

Northern Willamette Valley biodynamic winery Lachini Vineyards has a new Tuscan-inspired villa to pour from. The Triumphant Return of Nick's Italian Cafe

Back after closing in 2023, James Beard Award-winning Nick's Italian Cafe in McMinnville is under new ownership but will keep serving its lauded recipes. The owners of Earth & Sea in Carlton took over and plan to honor many of the iconic restaurant's famous dishes. Nick's originally opened in 1977, quickly becoming a winemaker hangout and a culinary destination in the Willamette Valley. It's been a huge part of the charm of historic Third Street for generations.
