FILM

Wilmington: What's New:

• North Carolina offers a 25% rebate on qualifying expenses and purchases made by productions while in-state as its film incentive. The rebate is funded through the N.C. Film and Entertainment Grant, which currently is allocated \$31 million per fiscal year (Jul 1-Jun 30), with any unused funds carrying over from fiscal year to fiscal year. The rebate funding is now labeled recurring in the state budget and the program's sunset date was recently eliminated in an effort to make a long-term commitment to the film and entertainment industry. SHOPPING & RETAIL

- South Front II, located at 22 Greenfield Street, is a Tribute Properties development of shops and restaurants in a former industrial area. New businesses continue to open during 2019-2020.
- The Pointe at Barclay continues to add shops and restaurants (S. 17th St. & Independence Blvd./Midtown).
- Independence Mall, located on Oleander Drive in midtown Wilmington, is transforming and rebranding the shopping complex as The Collection at Independence. Sections of the mall's interior will be removed during the coming months to modernize and revitalize the property.
- River Place, a new 13-story mixed-use building with condominiums, apartments and a parking deck, along with a restaurant/bar and retail space overlooking the river, continues construction with a projected completion date of 2020.

Aquarium at Fort Fisher is planning for a \$20 million expansion and renovation project which will include updates to and renovations of existing exhibits and infrastructure to make the aquarium more modern and relevant. All improvements will be made with the goal of enhancing the visitor experience. A construction start date is dependent on funding approval.

• Fort Fisher State Historic Site: Plans are underway to develop a new two-story 20,000 sq. ft. visitor center and museum that will include new exhibits, a multi-purpose classroom, event space and a platform for offloading buses. The site also hopes to reconstruct three earthwork mounds that were destroyed by erosion and airstrip construction during World War II.
