CONVENTION DISTRICT CONNECTED BY A SCENIC RIVERWALK



Wilmington is one of N.C.'s favorite vacation destinations and a natural to become your next favorite meetings destination.

Our multiuse Convention District is located riverfront and within Wilmington's downtown River District, all connected by a nearly two-mile scenic Riverwalk that makes it easy for attendees to get around. We cater to small businesses, associations, corporations, family reunions or somewhere in between. From state-of-the-art wireless exhibit halls and elegant ballrooms to the irresistible charm of a historic home with soul stirring porch views as a special event venue option, our variety of venues is unmatched and always appealing.

For something a little more traditional but still far from the ordinary convention center, the sleek, 107,000-square-foot Wilmington Convention Center is the largest convention center on N.C.'s coast. Located downtown, it offers sweeping riverfront views and plenty of natural light that helps bring the outdoors in. Adjacent to the convention center is the Port City Marina and Pier 33. Networking and socializing becomes a breeze when it takes place on or by the water.

Other downtown meeting facilities include the historic Coastline Conference and Event Center. which retains the charm of its red brick railroad depot days while offering modern amenities. Nearby, the Hilton Wilmington Riverside offers 20,000-squarefeet of meeting space, plus an on-site Ruth's Chris Steak House. The new full-service Embassy Suites Wilmington Riverfront Hotel located adjacent to the Wilmington Convention Center provides convenient accommodations for visitors and events held at the convention center.

THE LARGEST CONVENTION CENTER ON NORTH CAROLINA'S COAST

The maritime-themed Wilmington Convention Center offers meeting capabilities up to 2,000 people and a variety of spaces. Its surroundings lead to a positive frame of mind and productivity with access to water, fresh air, and wellness and networking activities offered during breaks. Multiple nearby hotels all located within walking distance and connected by nearly two miles of Riverwalk along the Cape Fear River make it easy for attendees to get around.

CONVENTION DISTRICT MEETING AND CONVENTION HOTELS

Wilmington offers outstanding accommodations and meeting facilities. The Embassy Suites Wilmington Riverfront Hotel located adjacent to the Wilmington Convention Center offers 186 guest suites and 6,600 square feet of meeting space with a 4,000 square foot roof top bar. The Hilton Wilmington Riverside features 272 guest rooms and suites and 20,000 square feet of meeting and banquet space, while the Courtyard by Marriott Wilmington Downtown/Historic District has 124 guest rooms and suites and over 1,800 square feet of event space. The Best Western Plus Coastline Inn's 53 guest rooms and suites all boast riverfront views, along with 10,150 square feet of meeting space at the adjacent Coastline Conference and Event Center. And the Hampton Inn Downtown provides overflow rooms for meetings and conventions with 92 guest rooms and suites and a 1,222 square foot meeting room.

- Downtown location and Convention District make it less costly and more convenient for attendees to enjoy the city and off-site activities


NORTH CAROLINA'S MOST ACCESSIBLE COASTAL DESTINATION

Wilmington is located between the Cape Fear River and the Atlantic Ocean in southeastern N.C., just minutes away from three island beaches. It's convenient to get here whether traveling by car, plane or even boat, and easy to navigate once you arrive.

The major east/west interstate transportation artery I-40 leads directly to Wilmington, which is also served by U.S. highways 17, 74/76, 117 and 421. The area also features convenient access via the state's numerous interstate highways.

Pre- and Post-Vacation Ideas

- History buffs should head to Burgwin-Wright Museum House & Gardens, with its Colonial furnishings, 18th-century kitchen, and an outstanding period garden
- Explore the Victorian-era gardens and antebellum architecture at the Bellamy Mansion Museum of History & Design Arts
- Take a trolley ride through downtown's historic district with Wilmington Trolley Company
- Ride along the brick-lined streets of downtown in a Springbrook Farms Horse-Drawn Carriage
- Take a scenic cruise aboard Wilmington Water Tours or the Cape Fear Riverboats
- See real movie locations on the Hollywood Location Walk of Old Wilmington
- Tour the Battleship NORTH CAROLINA, former home to almost 2,000 men; she earned 15 battle stars for her distinguished service during World War II
- Cape Fear Museum of History & Science features the rich history, science and cultures of N.C.'s southern coast

- The Wilson Center, Thalian Hall, and many other venues offer a variety of live theater and concert performance options
- Explore Historic Airlie Gardens, encompassing 67 acres of beautiful Gilded Age gardens and lakes
- The kids will love Jungle Rapids Family Fun Park, with a water park, go-carts, jungle golf, laser tag, climbing wall, arcade and more
- Explore Cameron Art Museum, a collection of fine art, design and crafts
- Slip back into simpler times at the Carolina Beach Boardwalk, or hike through Carolina Beach State Park to see Venus flytraps in their indigenous environment
- Fort Fisher State Historic Site, site of the largest land/sea battle
 of the Civil War, and the North Carolina Aquarium at Fort Fisher,
 named one of the top aquariums in the country, are both
 located in Kure Beach
- Learn to paddleboard or surf at one of Wrightsville Beach's many camps, or end the day with a chartered sunset cruise aboard the Wrightsville Beach Scenic Tours and Water Taxi
