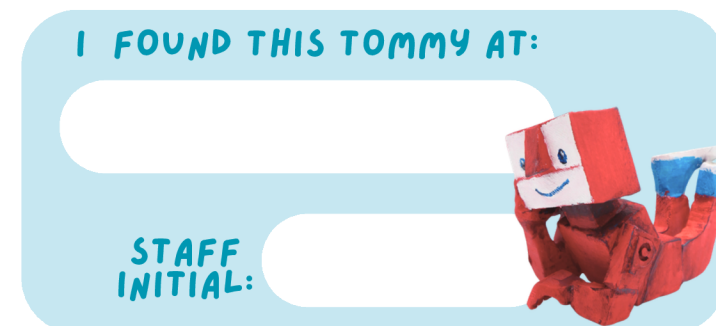
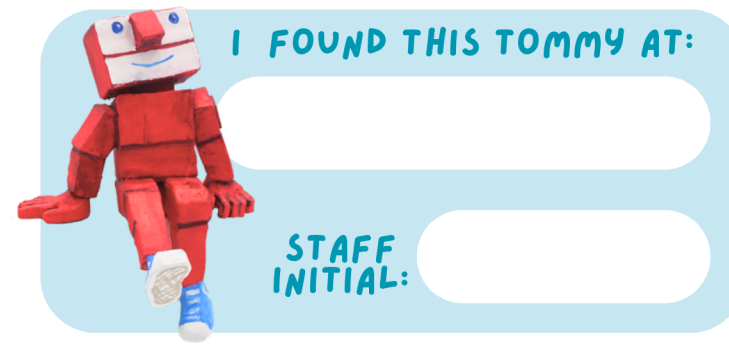
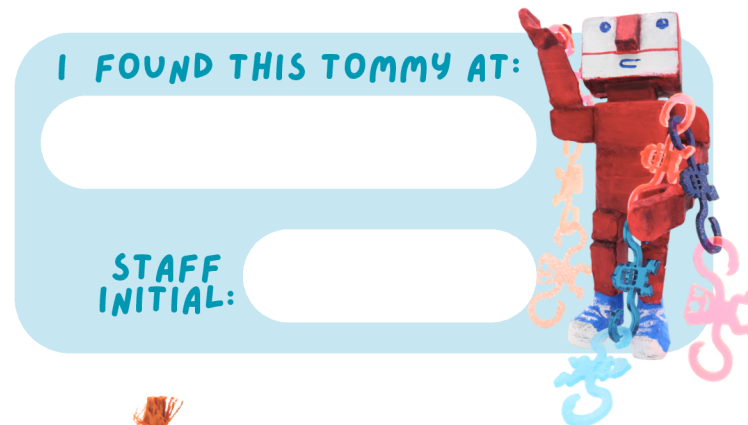
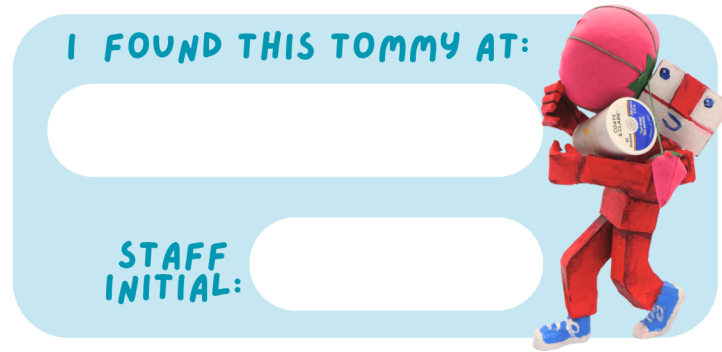
Hidden in the windows of locally owned businesses, Tommy encourages participants to step inside, discover what makes each stop special, and collect initials along the way.
