## ▶ **Boston Frostival Transforms the City Into a Winter Playground for The Whole Family**

Meet Boston is excited to announce a dynamic lineup of winter events and activations that will commence in late November and run through February. Boston Frostival programming will completely transform and reimagine winter in Boston, taking the iconic seasonal experiences that the city is known for – holiday lights, ice skating, tree lightings, games at the Garden, live theater, and more – and supplementing them with inaugural events such as drone shows over Boston Common, an experiential activation at Copley Square, a ferris wheel on the Kennedy Greenway, and an exciting wine festival featuring women-owned wineries. Other captivating winter programming such as Snowport, SoWa Village, and Winteractive, will be promoted as part of this campaign as Meet Boston strives to drive more overnight stays to the city during the colder months. .

## ▶ **Summer of 2026 Boston Takes Center Stage**

The summer of 2026 will showcase an unprecedented confluence of events that will make Boston the place to be. The excitement starts with FIFA World Cup. Boston is set to host seven matches during the tournament, with Group Stage play starting on June 11 and the last game on July 9 when Boston hosts a Quarterfinal. Boston will set up fan zones and watch parties throughout the city.

Tall Ships return to Boston Harbor on July 10 for Sail Boston. Boston is the fifth and final port in the US that will host the Sail 250 flotilla. Over one hundred majestic ships from dozens of countries will take part in a Parade of Sail through Boston Harbor, which is wide enough to provide ample viewing areas and narrow enough to afford great proximity and spectacular views. The Tall Ships are in port through July 16.

During these global events, the United States will of course mark its 250th anniversary on July 4, 2026. As America's founding city, Boston is poised to celebrate and commemorate the occasion in style with experiences in the city and across the commonwealth.

## ▶ **Boston's Culinary Evolution**

With the arrival of the Michelin Guide this November, Boston's evolution as a culinary destination is having a watershed moment. Long associated with traditional fare and exceptional seafood, the foodie culture in Boston now resembles the city itself – a melting pot of ethnic influences highlighted by Latin American, Asian, Mediterranean, and Caribbean cuisine. While New England's farm-to-table and sea-to-table pipelines have long produced some of the freshest offerings in America, the next chapter of Boston's culinary story promises to redefine perceptions. This movement is being shepherded by an array of young and up-and-coming culinary creators whose stories are central to Meet Boston's efforts to elevate the city's status as a culinary capital.

 **Atlas Hotel Allston**

(Opened Q1 2026)

246 rooms | 40 Western Ave, Boston

Recently opened in January 2026, The Atlas Hotel is a new boutique hotel located at 40 Western Avenue in Allston. Designed for curious, connected travelers, it offers 246 thoughtfully designed guestrooms and flexible meeting spaces filled with light for up to 100 people. The hotel is situated in a vibrant neighborhood near Harvard University, providing easy access to local attractions and public transportation.

 **Hotel AKA Back Bay**

(Opened Q3 2024)

225 Rooms | 154 Berkeley Street, Boston

In February Hotel AKA Back Bay completed a full redesign by Selldorf Architects, blending the building's 1926 Bostonian heritage with modern luxury. The 225-room hotel now features airy, residential-style rooms and suites, a light-filled lobby with a Murano chandelier, and a lounge/library for work or socializing. Dining is elevated at The Berkeley, a French-inspired bistro with indoor-outdoor seating and a seasonal terrace, offering classic fare with New England touches. The renovation provides a fresh, sophisticated retreat in the heart of Back Bay..

 **citizenM Hotel**

(Opened Q3 2024)

399 rooms | 408 Newbury Street, Boston

Well located in Boston, citizenM Boston Back Bay provides air-conditioned rooms, a fitness center, free WiFi and a shared lounge. The property features a bar, as well as a restaurant serving International cuisine. The property is non-smoking throughout and is located 3.2 miles from Central Square Theatre.



### **Four Seasons Boston**

196 rooms | 200 Boylston Street, Boston

The Four Seasons Hotel Boston has refurbished its lobby, front drive and new lobby restaurant. After years of ideation, Four Seasons Hotel Boston partnered with architectural designer Ken Fulk to reimagine the space. The design is fresh, striking and timeless, with elements that reflect the palette of the beautiful Public Garden complemented by the European influence seen in Beacon Hill's brownstones.



### **The Eliot Hotel**

Eliot Hotel, Boston

The Eliot Hotel, a Back Bay landmark since 1925, celebrated its centennial in April 2025 with a complete redesign of all 95 guestrooms and suites. Led by Boston-based designer Alix Keating, the renovation introduces a fresh, residential sensibility layered in quiet luxury. The updated interiors blend timeless elegance with modern comfort, offering guests a sophisticated retreat in the heart of Boston.



### **Omni Parker House**

Omni Parker House, Boston

Boston's oldest continuously operating hotel has completed a \$65 million renovation in 2025, ahead of its 170th anniversary. The 551 guest rooms and 57 suites now feature marble bathrooms, bespoke furnishings, and custom carpets, while the lobby and event spaces blend historic architecture with modern elegance. Iconic suites, including the Harvey Parker Presidential Suite and Freedom Trail Family Suite, honor Boston's storied past while welcoming a new generation of travelers.



### **Sheraton Boston Hotel**

Sheraton Boston Hotel, Boston

Sheraton Boston marks its 60th anniversary with a \$100 million renovation, updating guestrooms, public spaces, dining, and event areas with a modern, residential-inspired style. Henderson at Sheraton Boston offers globally inspired dishes and a lively bar, while the refreshed pool deck with cabanas and skyline views and 70,000 sq ft of event space create a contemporary retreat in the heart of Back Bay.

 **Renaissance Boston Seaport Hotel**

Renaissance Boston Seaport Hotel, Boston

Renaissance Boston Seaport District has completed a multi-million-dollar renovation, updating 471 guestrooms and suites with urban design, plush bedding, and waterfront or skyline views. The reimagined lobby and exclusive Club Lounge feature rich textures and modern finishes which has created a stylish retreat, steps from the Boston Convention Center and the Seaport's shops, restaurants, and cultural attractions.

 **Say It Loud: AAMARP, 1977 to Now at the ICA**

(February 12, 2025 - August 2, 2026)

The ICA/Boston debuts *Say It Loud: AAMARP, 1977 to Now*, the first museum survey dedicated to Boston's African American Master Artists-in-Residence Program. Featuring five decades of work by 39 artists, the exhibition celebrates AAMARP's enduring legacy of creative resistance, cultural memory, and Black artistic excellence. Spanning painting, collage, textiles, photography, and more, the show traces the program's evolution from its 1977 founding to today, accompanied by a new scholarly publication and related public programs.

 **Broadway in Boston 2025-2026**

(April 2025 - August 2026)

The Broadway in Boston 2025-26 season kicks off in April with 'Shucked.' The season includes hit favorites including 'The Book of Mormon,' 'Hamilton,' 'The Sound of Music,' 'Les Misérables,' 'Moulin Rouge!' and more.

 **An Indigenous Present at the ICA**

(October 9, 2025 - March 8, 2026)

The ICA/Boston presents *An Indigenous Present*, a nationally touring exhibition spanning 100 years of contemporary Indigenous art. Co-organized by Choctaw and Cherokee artist Jeffrey Gibson and curator Jenelle Porter, the show features 15 artists employing abstraction to explore personal and collective narratives, cultural traditions, and imagined places. On view from October 9, 2025, through March 8, 2026, with public programs and performances complementing the galleries.

 **American Repertory Theater**

(Opening Q1 2027)

The American Repertory Theater will begin a new era with the opening of its state-of-the-art home in Allston in early 2027. The new venue will feature flexible performance spaces designed to support innovative productions and expanded community engagement, reinforcing ART's role as a leader in contemporary theater and positioning Allston as a growing cultural hub.

 **Encore Boston Harbor Expansion Project**

Encore Boston Harbor is planning a major expansion in Everett that includes two new on-site hotels and a future MBTA Commuter Rail stop. The project is part of a development agreement with the City of Everett and is designed to increase hotel capacity and improve transit access to the resort and surrounding area.

 **Navy-Notre Dame Football Game**

Gillette Stadium on October 31, 2026.

 **Brazil-France International Friendly Match**

Gillette Stadium on March 26, 2026.

 **FIFA World Cup 2026**

Gillette Stadium - which will be renamed Boston Stadium - is set to host 7 FIFA World Cup matches in in the summer of 2025, including 4 Group Stage games, a knockout and quarterfinal. Group Stage matches will be announced in December of 2025.

 **National Women's Soccer League: Boston Legacy FC**

Boston will welcome professional women's soccer in 2026 with the inaugural season of Boston Legacy FC, the city's NWSL expansion team. The name, chosen in 2025, honors Boston's rich sports history while looking toward the future. Legacy FC will play home matches at Gillette Stadium and develop a \$27 million performance center. The inaugural match will take place on March 14, 2026.

 **Revolution Soccer Stadium**

Planning is underway for the Revolution's new stadium in Everett.



### **Agosto**

(Opening Spring 2026)

Chef George Mendes introduces Agosto in Boston's South End as an intimate, reservation-only tasting-menu restaurant inspired by Portuguese cuisine and global flavors. Built around a chef's counter, the minimalist space is designed for a highly personal dining experience focused on seasonality, technique, and narrative-driven courses.



### **Baby Sister**

(Opening Spring 2026)

Opening alongside Agosto in the South End, Baby Sister is a casual, daytime bakery-café from chef George Mendes. The concept centers on house-baked breads and pastries, breakfast and lunch offerings, and an approachable neighborhood vibe to contrast its fine-dining sibling.



### **Ci Siamo**

(Opening Spring 2026)

The beloved New York City Italian restaurant, Ci Siamo, expands to Boston, bringing its Roman-inspired menu and live-fire cooking to the Seaport. Expect handmade pastas, wood-fired pizzas, seasonal vegetables, and classic Italian flavors, served in a refined yet approachable setting.



### **Rosa y Marigold**

(Opening Spring 2026)

Back Bay will welcome its first in-city Peruvian restaurant from the acclaimed duo behind Celeste and La Royal. Located in the vibrant Lyrik development at the crossroads of Newbury Street and Massachusetts Avenue, the 100-seat space blends a sleek dining room with a moody bar, live music, and an open kitchen for an immersive, dinner-party vibe. Expect a bold menu of ceviche, tiradito, anticuchos, chifa-inspired dishes, and sándwiches for lunch, plus a Pisco cocktail program and weekend brunch. The name pays tribute to Nobel- and Pulitzer-winning poet Louise Glück, reflecting the founders' ethos of bringing people together through food and culture.



### **Ama at the Atlas**

(Opened January 2026)

Ama at the Atlas opens in Allston within the Atlas Hotel from the team behind Comfort Kitchen. The all-day restaurant draws inspiration from global comfort foods and family traditions. The menu evolves from breakfast through dinner in a warm, welcoming space where familiar flavors become uncommon bites.



### **My Girl**

(Opened Winter 2025)

Located near Post Office Square in Boston's Financial District, My Girl is a stylish cocktail bar designed for after-work crowds and late-night energy. The program emphasizes creative cocktails, a polished bar atmosphere, and a social setting that bridges downtown dining and nightlife.



### **Bonanza Bites**

(Opened Winter 2025)

Bonanza Bites brings bold Latin American flavors to Somerville, featuring a menu of shareable small plates and craft cocktails. The lively space is designed for social dining, blending casual energy with an elevated approach to street-inspired dishes.



### **Mesob**

(Opened Winter 2025)

Situated in Boston's South End, Mesob showcases Eritrean and Ethiopian cuisine, emphasizing communal dining and traditional preparation. The menu highlights slow-simmered stews, house-made injera, and richly spiced dishes served in a warm, hospitality-driven setting.



### **Acapella by X**

(Opened Fall 2025)

Acapella by X opens in Dorchester as a dinner and entertainment concept combining globally inspired cuisines and flavors, craft cocktails, and live music. Designed as a nightlife destination, the space pairs elevated dining with performances for a harmonious experience.



### **Cactus Club Cafe**

(Opened Fall 2025)

Cactus Club Cafe brings contemporary West Coast flair to the Back Bay as the brand's first-ever U.S. location. The menu highlights bold, ingredient-driven dishes, from fresh seafood and shareable plates to wood-fired specialties, all served in a sleek, art-filled environment. With an energetic bar program, weekend brunch, and a spacious patio overlooking Boylston Street, it's a perfect spot for lively lunches, upbeat dinners, and cocktails with a view.



### **Darte Brunch**

(Opened Fall 2025)

A chic new addition to Boston's brunch scene, Darte Brunch, serves globally inspired dishes, artisan pastries, and signature coffee creations in a bright, stylish space. With creative cocktails and a lively, social vibe, it's an elevated yet easygoing spot for weekend gatherings and all-day brunch fans.



### **SJ's**

(Opened Fall 2025)

From chef Sarah Wade (Stillwater, Sloane's) comes SJ's, a Leather District restaurant serving elevated comfort food with a global twist. Open daily with a lively bar, scratch-made plates, and a seasonal patio, SJ's brings Wade's signature "good food done well" to a stylish new neighborhood setting.



### **All'Antico Vinaio**

(Opened Fall 2025)

In Back Bay, Florence's famed sandwich shop All'Antico Vinaio brings its cult-favorite schiacciata to Boston. Known for Tuscan flatbread layered with prosciutto, truffle cream, and marinated vegetables, the eatery channels the spirit of Italy's street-food culture in a lively, fast-casual setting. The new Boylston Street outpost marks the brand's first in New England for a little taste of Florence in the heart of Boston.



### **Capricho Colombian Steakhouse**

(Opened Fall 2025)

In Brookline's Washington Square, Capricho Colombian Steakhouse offers a refined take on Colombian dining, pairing wood-grilled prime cuts with warm, modern design. Drawing on the flavors and spirit of Colombia, the menu highlights dishes like the signature punta de anca alongside cocktails and live music, bringing vibrant Latin energy to Boston's steakhouse scene.

 **Fallow Kin**

(Opened Fall 2025)

Fallow Kin arrives in Cambridge with a vegetable-forward ethos, fusing seasonal New England harvests with chef-driven technique. Founded by the team behind Talulla and chef Marcos Sanchez, the menu elevates local produce into star dishes, complemented by house-fermented cocktails and a sustainability-minded bar program.

 **Ghost Light Tavern**

(Opened Fall 2025)

Located in the Theater District, Ghost Light Tavern is a two-story high dive meets club from chef Jason Santos and the team behind Clock Tavern. Downstairs, guests can enjoy a laid-back vibe with affordable drinks, a pool table, and elevated comfort fare like smash burgers, hand-breaded tenders, and "chips & caviar," while upstairs the Club Room pulses with nightlife energy and DJ sets.

 **Lou's**

(Opened Fall 2025)

A new restaurant, cocktail bar, and live music venue in Harvard Square, offering nightly performances alongside a nostalgic menu of shared plates and comfort classics. Chef Jason Bond draws on New England and Boston culinary traditions, while the cocktail program highlights house made syrups, seasonal ingredients, and playful originals.

 **Mai**

(Opened Fall 2025)

In the Seaport, Mai is a modern izakaya blending the minimalist elegance of Japanese tradition with the flair of French technique. Tallied with a curated craft-sake program and sake-based cocktails, Mai channels its founders' many trips to Japan to reimagine what Asian cuisine can be.

 **Nine Winters Bakery**

(Opened Fall 2025)

In Cambridge, Nine Winters Bakery blends Korean and American baking in inventive ways. Highlighting playful staples like gochujang citrus sticky buns, black sesame chocolate chip cookies, milk-bread finger sandwiches, and clarified milk punch, all in a cozy, artful space rooted in cultural storytelling.

 **89 Charles**

(Opened Fall 2025)

Tucked beneath Beacon Hill, 89 Charles is an intimate Art Deco inspired cocktail lounge serving inventive drinks and indulgent small plates. With just 40 seats across its moody bar and lounge, the space pairs theatrical cocktails like whiskey washed in beef tallow and coconut-topped espresso martinis, with luxe bites like foie gras bratwurst and caviar latkes, making it a glamorous hideaway for late-night sipping.

 **Bubble Bath Bubble Bar**

(Opened Summer 2025)

Perched atop CitizenM on Newbury Street, this playful new Champagne and cocktail bar from chef Tiffani Faison's Big Heart Hospitality brings a sparkling twist to Back Bay. With chic bubble-themed décor, sweeping rooftop views, and a menu of inventive small bites—think luxe sandwiches, seafood, and an indulgent caviar cart—Bubble Bath is all about stylish sipping and celebratory snacking.

 **Capri**

(Opened Summer 2025)

From the team behind Prima and Capo comes this glamorous Italian steakhouse. Open for dinner nightly (with weekend lunch), Capri serves hand-rolled pastas, dry-aged steaks, and fresh seafood in a sweeping two-story space anchored by a 20-foot olive tree and grand piano. Outside, a lush patio with cabana bar, fire pits, striped umbrellas, and a fieldstone fireplace delivers dazzling al fresco dining right beside the SoWa Open Market.

 **The Block at Woods Hill**

(Opened Summer 2025)

A stylish new farm-to-table concept in Boston's Seaport, offering house-made charcuterie, inventive small plates, and biodynamic wines in a warm, woodland-inspired space. A more casual sister to Woods Hill Pier 4, it features in-house dry-aged meats, seasonal desserts, and a curated gourmet market. With communal seating, a waterfront patio, and upcoming culinary classes, it's a relaxed yet elevated destination for local flavor and craft cocktails.

 **Yoshida Omakase**

(Opened Summer 2025)

A refined sushi omakase experience in Back Bay opened by restaurateur Iverson Guo and led by Chef Tony Cao. The polished venue seats just 24 guests for an exquisite 18-course, Edomae-style tasting priced around \$300 per person.



### **Louis Corner**

(Opened Summer 2025)

This refreshing new 48-seat gastropub blends relaxed, elegant design with a menu of crave-able comfort. Shareable starters, hearty, and seafood favorites span lunch, brunch, and dinner. This is the latest addition to the MAZÍ Food Group-- creators of Desnuda Cocina & Bar, Gigi, Ilona, and Kava.



### **Daily Provisions**

(Opened Summer 2025)

Danny Meyer's acclaimed all-day café, part of New York's Union Square Hospitality Group, opened its first Boston-area location this summer at 1 Brattleboro Square in Harvard Square— the first Daily Provisions outside NYC metro.



### **Willow & Ivy**

(Opened Spring 2025)

The newest edition to The Lenox hotel offers New England-inspired cuisine with a modern twist. Spearheaded by chef Daniel Kenney, the menu aims to highlight culinary craftsmanship while celebrating regional flavors. Enjoy your meal in an inviting space filled with greenery and natural light.



### **Nine**

(Opened Summer 2025)

Taking over the former No. 9 Park space, Nine is an upscale yet approachable French-European restaurant. Nine will offer both tasting menus and a-la-carts menus. Notably it features Boston's first "gin palace" bar, inspired by the 19th century with an extensive gin and French wine list.

 **Holocaust Museum & Education Center**  
(Opening Q4 2026)

Slated to open in late 2026, the Holocaust Museum and Education Center will be located at 125 Tremont Street along Boston's Freedom Trail. Spanning 33,000 square feet, the museum will feature immersive exhibits and cutting-edge technology designed to foster critical thinking and remembrance. Founded by Jody Kipnis and Todd Ruderman, the institution aims to preserve and perpetuate the memory and lessons of the Holocaust for future generations.

 **Family Heritage Experience**  
(Opened Spring 2025)

This interactive new exhibition from American Ancestors invites all ages to explore family origins, cultural traditions, and genealogical curiosity. Located at 97 Newbury Street, the state-of-the-art space features engaging exhibits, heirloom displays, and ancestry-inspired prompts—all designed to spark a personal journey into your own family story

 **Dewey Square Mural**  
(Unveiled Q4 2024)

Jeffrey Gibson, the multidisciplinary artist who represented the United States at this year's Venice Biennale, has created the next mural at Dewey Square, the Rose Kennedy Greenway Conservancy. Gibson is scheduled to complete the mural, titled "your spirit whispering in my ear," this September. The project is a collaboration with the Massachusetts Museum of Contemporary Art, where Gibson is slated to open an immersive installation in late 2024.

## **Tall Ships Return - Sail Boston** (July 11-16, 2026)

Boston, known for its Visiting Ship Program, eagerly awaits the return of the tall ships for Sail Boston 2026®. The city, rich in American Revolution history, invites visitors to explore the Freedom Trail. This 2.5-mile path weaves past sixteen historic sites, from Boston Common to Bunker Hill and the Charlestown Navy Yard, home to the USS Constitution, the oldest commissioned ship still afloat.

### **March 17, 2026 Knox Trail 250**

Knox Trail 250 is a sequence of regional ceremonies retracing Henry Knox's legendary 1776 "Noble Train of Artillery" from Fort Ticonderoga to Dorchester Heights. This milestone highlights one of the American Revolutionary War's most epic logistical feats and a turning point that helped force the British evacuation of Boston. Key events wind through 33+ Massachusetts towns and culminates in Dorchester Heights in a ceremony on March 17, 2026.
