The Moravian Pottery & Tile Works is a 'working history' museum, built by Henry Mercer during the American Arts and Crafts Movement. Book a tour to see the tiles being made using Mercer's historic methods.

Stroll through a dazzling winter wonderland with colorful lights, 60+ unique shops, delicious food, 125 gingerbread displays and the famous 'tunnel of lights'!

GRUNDY MUSEUM VICTORIAN HOLIDAY HOUSE

Stop by The Grundy Museum, featuring Victorian-inspired decorations. Local designers and florists transform the space, offering festive stories and a special gift to take home.

PENNSBURY MANOR HOLLY NIGHT OR CANDLELIGHT TOUR

WASHINGTON CROSSING HISTORIC PARK FIRST CROSSING REENACTMENT

Witness the reenactment of George Washington's 1776 Christmas night river crossing with reenactors in Continental military dress rowing replica Durham boats along the Delaware River.

This event takes place each year on the second Sunday in December and on Christmas Day.

Day 1

WASHINGTON CROSSING HISTORIC PARK & CROSSING THE DELAWARE TOUR

Celebrate history with events including the Christmas Day Crossing, General Washington's Birthday, and the Fourth of July. Explore Taylorsville Village and outdoor recreation areas.

PENNSBURY MANOR

Pennsbury Manor is William Penn's 17th century country estate along the Delaware River. The reconstructed, 43-acre plantation features a manor house with period furnishings, outbuildings, livestock, gardens, special programs, workshops and demonstrations throughout the year.

SHOPPING IN BRISTOL

Explore the charming shops of historic Bristol Borough, offering unique boutiques, antiques, artisan goods, and local treasures.

DINNER AT HISTORIC KING GEORGE II INN

Established in 1681, it offers five dining rooms, a historic tavern, and a riverfront patio.

MOLAND HOUSE

The headquarters of General Washington and 11,000 troops camped nearby in August 1777, has been beautifully restored to its original appearance for group and private tours.

LUNCH AT THE HATTERY STOVE & STILL

This revived historic inn blends vintage treasures with antique-industrial décor.

MERCER MUSEUM

Step back in time at a castle showcasing more than 40,000 early American artifacts.

SHOPPING AT PEDDLER'S VILLAGE

A historic village with colonial-style buildings, award-winning gardens, and over 65 unique shops.

DINNER AT PEDDLER'S PUB

Offers a casual setting for delicious pub fare, refreshing beverages, and warm hospitality.

HISTORIC FALLSINGTON

Take a walk through historic Fallsington, a former Quaker town in lower Bucks County.

LUNCH AT THE LOGAN INN

The Logan Inn boasts 16 original rooms and 22 recently added rooms, each uniquely appointed and distinct but all sharing the enthusiasm for architecture, art, design and colorful luxury.

SHOPPING IN NEW HOPE

PARRY MANSION MUSEUM

Built in 1784 by Benjamin Parry, the Parry Mansion features 11 rooms with furnishings reflecting 125 years of history.

TRAVERSING THE TEN CRUCIAL DAYS BUS TOUR

Take a trip back to the American Revolution on a multi-stop bus tour. The Traversing the Ten Crucial Days Bus Tour begins and ends at Washington Crossing, PA. Spend the day retracing the December 25 crossing of the Delaware and the December 26, 1776 through January 3, 1777 American and British military engagements at Trenton, Princeton and areas in-between. Hear how the terrain, weaponry and weather influenced the ways the battles were fought and how the lives of the local people were disrupted by them. See where armies marched, fought and struggled to survive on an otherwise peaceful landscape, while the course of human history hung in the balance. guide to explore three centuries of living in Bucks County.
