STOP ONE: TRACK TOUR OF DAYTONA INTERNATIONAL SPEEDWAY, the “World Center of Racing,”

along with visit to the Motorsports Hall of Fame of America and gift shop

STOP TWO: DR. MARY MCLEOD BETHUNE STATUE AT RIVERFRONT ESPLANADE

The 13-foot-tall statue celebrates Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune, the founder of a small school in the early 1900s that evolved into Bethune-Cookman University, a civil rights and women's rights pioneer, and the champion of Black Daytona Beach residents who fought for their most basic needs and rights. The bronze sculpture is 829-pounds, and the granite pedestal base is 14,050-pounds. Recommended time: 30 minutes



STOP THREE: JACKIE ROBINSON BALLPARK AND STATUE

Relive history at this minor league baseball park where ground-breaking African-American baseball player Jackie Robinson played in the first integrated Major League Baseball spring training game in 1946. The ballpark, which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, features a statue of Robinson, historical markers and a museum and serves as the home to the Daytona Tortugas, a Cincinnati Reds affiliated minor league team. Recommended time: 30 minutes

STOP FIVE: TOMOKA STATE PARK AND THE LEGEND OF CHIEF TOMOKIE STATUE

Native Americans once dwelled in the Tomoka State Park area, living off fish-filled lagoons. Today, the waters surrounding the park are popular for canoeing, boating, and fishing. Tomoka State Park protects a variety of wildlife habitats and endangered species, such as the West Indian manatee, and is a bird watcher's paradise with over 160 species sighted. Visitors can stroll a one-half mile nature trail through a hardwood hammock that was once an indigo field for an 18th century British landowner. The memory of the Timucua is commemorated by a large statue in the park called the "Legend of Tomokie." Recommended time: 60 minutes



STOP SIX: THE CASEMENTS

The Casements, named for the large hand-cut casement windows that adorn the mansion, is the winter home of the late John D. Rockefeller, an American business magnate and philanthropist. Also known as "The Jewel of Ormond Beach," the Casements has been officially listed on the National Register of Historic Places and has been designated as a Florida Heritage Site. Learn how Rockefeller's influence and residency in Ormond Beach attracted visitors of wealth to visit and reside from New York City and Boston's socialite communities. Recommended time: 45 minutes
