Grapevine is centrally located between Dallas and Fort Worth, and home to **Dallas Fort Worth International (DFW) Airport**. With 20+ hotels, including boutique, luxury and select-service options, you'll find a comfortable place to stay.

Start your adventure in Grapevine's **Historic Main Street District**, where 19th-century brick buildings now house boutiques, galleries and winery tasting rooms. Grapevine strikes a perfect chord between Wild West heritage and creative spirit. From the infamous exploits of Bonnie and Clyde to the hometown roots of stars like Post Malone and Norah Jones, Grapevine is a stage for bold and unforgettable stories.

Take in spectacular views of Dallas, Fort Worth and the surrounding Grapevine area from the 150-foot tall **Grapevine Observation Tower**.

This evening, enjoy a glass of wine along the Grapevine Urban Wine Trail followed by dinner enjoyed at any number of local restaurants and bistros, featuring Texas favorites such as steaks, BBQ and Tex-Mex.

In the evening, catch live entertainment at the Historic **Palace Theatre**, where LeAnn Rimes began her career performing with the Grapevine Opry, and enjoy a variety of live music options available seven nights a week along Main Street.

Take in Grapevine's art and culture with a visit to working artist studios, including **Holder Dane Gallery**, **Vetro Glassblowing Studio & Gallery**, **The Grapevine Foundry** and more.

Enjoy an educational and savory tour with **Grapevine Food Tours**. This walking tour of the Historic Main Street District includes several stops that will be sure to satisfy your tastebuds!

Following your tour, enjoy shopping on **Historic Main Street** and head over to **Grapevine Mills** with more than 180 shops, restaurants and attractions to explore. Be sure to include a stop at **Cavender's** to pick-up your western attire.

Explore and uncover the unexpected at **Meow Wolf – The Real Unreal**, an interactive, immersive art experience.

This evening, enjoy one of Grapevine's fabulous steakhouses or one of our 200+ restaurants followed by live entertainment in the Historic Main Street District.

Overnight in Grapevine.



Enjoy a leisurely morning with coffee at one of our many local coffee shops followed by a stroll on the trails of Lake Grapevine or through the Grapevine Botanical Gardens. Another wonderful morning option is a visit to Historic Nash Farm, to experience what life was like for the early settlers on the Grapevine Prairie.

Following an early lunch, board Grapevine Vintage Railroad for the Historic Stockyards. This train runs on most weekends, with TEXRail available as the back-up option at other times.

Explore western shops, museums and saloons in the Historic Stockyards, and don't miss the live cattle drive.

This evening, back in Grapevine, enjoy a comical "who-dunnit" murder mystery at the **Texas Star Dinner Theater**, (Fridays & Saturdays most weeks of the year), or enjoy any one of the 200 restaurants followed by live entertainment along Historic Main Street.

Overnight in Grapevine

Depart from Grapevine (approx. 130 miles / 2 hours), enjoying the scenic transition from Texas landscapes to southern Oklahoma charm.

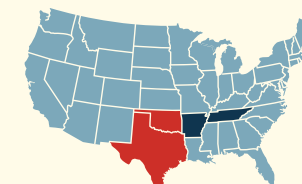
Arrive at **Reba's Place** for lunch, a restaurant and entertainment venue inspired by country music legend Reba McEntire, celebrating small-town roots and country music culture.

Continue to Tishomingo to explore the historic **Chickasaw National Capitol Building**, the original seat of government for the Chickasaw Nation, offering insight into tribal leadership and sovereignty.

Just steps away, enjoy the energy of **Ole Red**, a restaurant and live music venue by Blake Shelton, blending dining with Oklahoma's modern country scene.

In Sulphur, immerse yourself in Chickasaw Nation history at the **Chickasaw Cultural Center**, an award-winning destination featuring interactive exhibits, traditional storytelling and authentic architecture.

End the day in Duncan with dinner and overnight stay.

Begin your morning exploring the **Chisholm Trail Heritage Center**, where interactive exhibits and immersive theaters bring the legendary cattle drives to life.

In Chickasha, stop for a fun photo at the iconic “**Leg Lamp**,” a nod to the holiday classic *A Christmas Story* filmed in part in Oklahoma.

Arrive in Oklahoma City to experience the **National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum**, home to one of the world’s most comprehensive collections of Western art, rodeo history and Native American artifacts.

Continue the music theme at the **American Banjo Museum**, showcasing the banjo’s role in shaping American music from folk to jazz.

Wrap up the day in Bricktown with a **Water Taxi ride**, offering a relaxed look at the city’s entertainment district, followed by shopping in Stockyards City and a classic Oklahoma dining experience at **Cattlemen’s Steakhouse**, a historic favorite among ranchers and cowboys.

Begin with a moving visit to the **Oklahoma City National Memorial & Museum**, honoring the lives lost in 1995 through powerful exhibits and outdoor symbolism.

Travel to Krebs, known as “Little Italy” in Oklahoma, for lunch at **Pete’s** – famous for its hearty Italian cuisine and historic charm.

Then head into the hills of southeastern Oklahoma to **Robbers Cave State Park**, once a hideout for notorious outlaws like Jesse James and Belle Starr. Surrounded by rugged cliffs and forested trails, the park blends natural beauty with Wild West legend.

Enjoy an overnight stay at **Robbers Cave Lodge** or cabins.



Enjoy a scenic drive to Muskogee to visit the **Oklahoma Music Hall of Fame**, celebrating artists who shaped Oklahoma’s sound across genres.

In Tahlequah, explore the heart of the Cherokee Nation with visits to the **Cherokee National History Museum**, **Cherokee National Supreme Court Museum**, **Cherokee National Prison** —offering a deep dive into Cherokee history.

After lunch in Wagoner, continue to Tulsa – home to a rich musical legacy. Visit the **Woody Guthrie Center** and **Bob Dylan Center**, where the stories of two iconic songwriters come to life through immersive exhibits.

End the day at **The Church Studio**, a legendary recording space founded by Leon Russell, before dinner and an overnight stay in Tulsa.

Start with the elegant **Philbrook Museum of Art**, housed in a historic Italian Renaissance-style villa with expansive gardens and world-class collections.

Cruise historic Route 66 through Tulsa’s Meadow Gold District, known for vintage neon, public art and roadside giants.

Stop at the quirky and beloved **Blue Whale of Catoosa**, one of the most photographed landmarks along Route 66.

In Claremore, explore the **Will Rogers Memorial Museum**, honoring Oklahoma’s favorite humorist and cowboy philosopher, followed by the **J.M. Davis Arms & Historical Museum**, one of the largest firearms collections in the world.

Continue to the whimsical **Ed Galloway Totem Pole Park**, featuring the world’s largest concrete totem pole and folk-art structures.

Stop in Vinita at the **Cherokee Nation Anna Mitchell Cultural & Welcome Center** before ending the day in Miami.

Overnight in Miami.

Wrap up the journey with a guided tour of the stunning **Coleman Theatre**, a beautifully restored 1920s vaudeville theater known for its ornate architecture and rich performance history.

Depart for Bentonville, Arkansas, concluding a journey that blends music, culture and outlaw legends across Oklahoma.

Arrive in Bentonville (approx. 115 miles from Tulsa), where Northwest Arkansas blends art, outdoor adventure and a creative spirit rooted in the Ozarks.

Explore the scenic **Crystal Bridges Trails** or bike portions of the **Razorback Greenway**, with options ranging from leisurely rides to more advanced terrain at Coler Mountain Bike Preserve.

Visit the **Crystal Bridges Museum of American Art**, where world-class works are set among the natural beauty of the region or enjoy hands-on discovery at the **Scott Family Amazeum**.

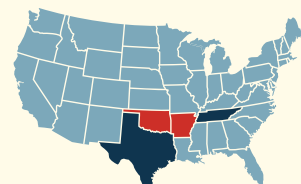
Continue to nearby Fayetteville to the historic downtown square and uncover the city's layered past, including stories of Ozark bootlegging and frontier life.

Stroll along **Dickson Street**, known for its lively atmosphere, music scene and long-standing reputation for pushing boundaries.

Enjoy live music at **George's Majestic Lounge**, one of the oldest continuously operating music venues in the country, reflecting the storytelling tradition of artists like Johnny Cash.

Return to Bentonville for the evening and unwind with live music and local flavor at spots like **The HUB Bike Lounge** or **Bike Rack Brewing Co.**

Overnight stay in Fayetteville.

Depart Bentonville (approx. 210 miles), traveling through Fort Smith en route to Hot Springs.

Stop near Fort Smith to visit the **U.S. Marshals Museum**, where the history of frontier justice, lawmen and outlaws comes to life.

Nearby, visit the **Chaffee Barbershop Museum at Fort Chaffee** where Elvis Presley received his iconic 1958 Army haircut.

Continue to Hot Springs, a destination known for its blend of natural beauty, history and a touch of outlaw lore. Explore **Hot Springs National Park**, including scenic trails and the **Thermal Springs Viewing Area**, or take in panoramic views from **Hot Springs Mountain Tower**.

Visit **Bathhouse Row** and the **Hot Springs National Park Museum** to learn about the city's historic spa culture.

Dive into the city's past at the **Gangster Museum of America**, highlighting its Prohibition-era reputation as a haven for notorious figures like Al Capone.

In the evening, enjoy live entertainment at **The Ohio Club** –Arkansas's oldest bar – or experience the energy of **Oaklawn Racing Casino Resort**.

Overnight stay in Hot Springs.



Depart Hot Springs for Little Rock (approx. 55 miles). Explore the **Arkansas River Trail** or take in scenic views from the **Big Dam Bridge**, one of the longest pedestrian bridges in North America.

For outdoor enthusiasts, visit **Pinnacle Mountain State Park** for hiking and biking or enjoy kayaking and cycling with Rock Town River Outfitters.

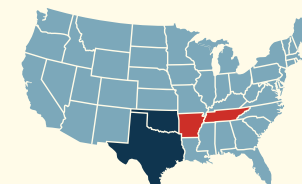
Discover the city's history at the **Little Rock Central High School National Historic Site** or explore cultural institutions like the **Mosaic Templars Cultural Center** and the **Clinton Presidential Center**.

Families can enjoy interactive exhibits at the **Museum of Discovery** or cheer on a local baseball game with the Arkansas Travelers.

In the evening, experience Little Rock's live music scene at venues like **White Water Tavern**, **Revolution Music Room**, **Stickyz Rock'n'Roll Chicken Shack** or **The Hall**.

Enjoy local craft beverages at **Rock Town Brewing Co.** or **Lost Forty Brewing** before exploring the Argenta Arts District's galleries and nightlife.

Overnight stay in Little Rock.

Depart Little Rock (approx. 225 miles) toward Memphis, traveling through the Arkansas Delta.

Stop in Wilson for lunch at the **Wilson Café**, known for its elevated farm-to-table Southern cuisine.

Visit **White's Mercantile**, a modern general store created by singer-songwriter Holly Williams, offering a curated selection of goods and gifts.

Continue to Dyess to visit **Johnny Cash's Boyhood Home**, part of a New Deal-era colony established in 1935. Learn how his upbringing here shaped his music and storytelling legacy.

Depart for Memphis, Tennessee, concluding this portion of the journey.

Overnight in Memphis



Begin your Memphis adventure by exploring a city known as the Home of the Blues, Soul & Rock'n'Roll that touches the cornerstone of American music history. Start your day at **Memphis Rock 'n' Soul Museum** to explore the powerful story of how music shaped the cultural and social fabric of the region.

Continue with the **True Crime Tour by Backbeat Bus Tour**. A 90-minute, twilight bus excursion exploring Memphis darker history, featuring scandalous unsolved mysteries of notorious figures like Georgia Tann and Machine Gun Kelly or Explore **MOJO Tour** which is a high-energy musical tour of Memphis, a city that's given the world three great genres of popular music: blues, soul & rock'n'roll, and led by a professional Beale Street musician with storytelling that brings famed musical heritage to life on the nation's only music bus.

Enjoy lunch at a local favorite Memphis-style BBQ, followed by a stroll along **Beale Street**, one of the most iconic streets in America, filled with live music venues, shops and historic landmarks.

Continue to **Sun Studio**, often called the "Birthplace of Rock 'n' Roll," where legends like Elvis Presley, Johnny Cash, Jerry Lee Lewis and B.B. King launched their careers.

**Graceland**, the iconic home of Elvis Presley, where exhibits and tours showcase his life, career and lasting cultural impact.

In the evening, experience live blues, soul and rock performances along **Beale Street**, where the city's musical legacy comes alive.

Overnight stay in Memphis.



Begin your day at **Arcade Restaurant** for Breakfast where Elvis, B.B. King and Martin Luther King dined during the 1950's & 1960's. Built in 1919, this is the oldest running family-owned restaurant, and the menu has not changed as the story continued to the Civil-Rights era.

Cross the street and experience the **National Civil Rights Museum** and **New Legacy Museum** at the Lorraine Motel, a powerful and moving experience that chronicles the American Civil Rights Movement.

Meet with **Heritage Tours** or **A Tour of Possibilities** both are different but give you up close perspective on the U.S. Civil Rights Trail in Memphis as your private escort to explore the history that you cannot get anywhere else like **Clayborn Temple**, **Withers Collection Museum**, **Beale Street** and hear the last speech of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. by visiting **Mason Temple**.

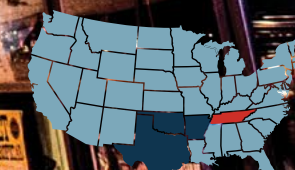
Visit the **Stax Museum of American Soul Music**, celebrating the legacy of soul legends and Memphis' influence on the genre.

Enjoy lunch at **4 Way Grill** around the corner from Stax or South Main.

In the afternoon, visit the **Memphis Art Museum** or **Metal Museum** and take time to explore local shops and cultural attractions.

Wrap up the day with dinner at **Overton Square** and Live Performance at **Hattiloo Theatre**.

Overnight stay in Memphis.





Depart Memphis (approx. 210 miles / 3 – 3.5 hours) and travel east toward Nashville, continuing through the heart of Tennessee’s rich musical landscape.

Before leaving Memphis, consider a final stop at Tom Lee Park with breathtaking views of the Mississippi River and walk along to newest attraction **The Flyway Observation Deck**, one of the best Memphis urban parks in the country, offering scenic trails, bike lanes and music performances.

Along the way, enjoy the changing scenery of Tennessee’s countryside, dotted with small towns and rolling landscapes that have helped shape the region’s musical heritage.

Arrive in Nashville, widely known as “Music City,” and a global hub for music and songwriting.

On arrival in Nashville, experience over two centuries of hospitality at the **Belle Meade Historic Site & Winery**. Explore the beautifully preserved estate, learn about Tennessee’s Victorian architecture and equestrian legacy and enjoy award-winning wines or discover the origins of Belle Meade Bourbon.

On your way downtown, visit to **The Parthenon in Centennial Park**, a full-scale replica of the original in Athens and a nod to Nashville’s nickname, the “Athens of the South.”

Enjoy dinner at the **Listening Room Café**, where dinner and drinks are paired with performances from both rising artists and the hitmakers behind Nashville’s biggest songs.

Overnight stay in Nashville.



Begin your musical journey on **Music Row** with a visit to **RCA Studio B**, famously known as the “Home of a Thousand Hits,” where over 1,000 top ten songs were recorded, including more than 200 by Elvis Presley.

Continue to the **Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum** in downtown Nashville, where exhibits and programs explore the origins, traditions and influential voices that shaped country music.

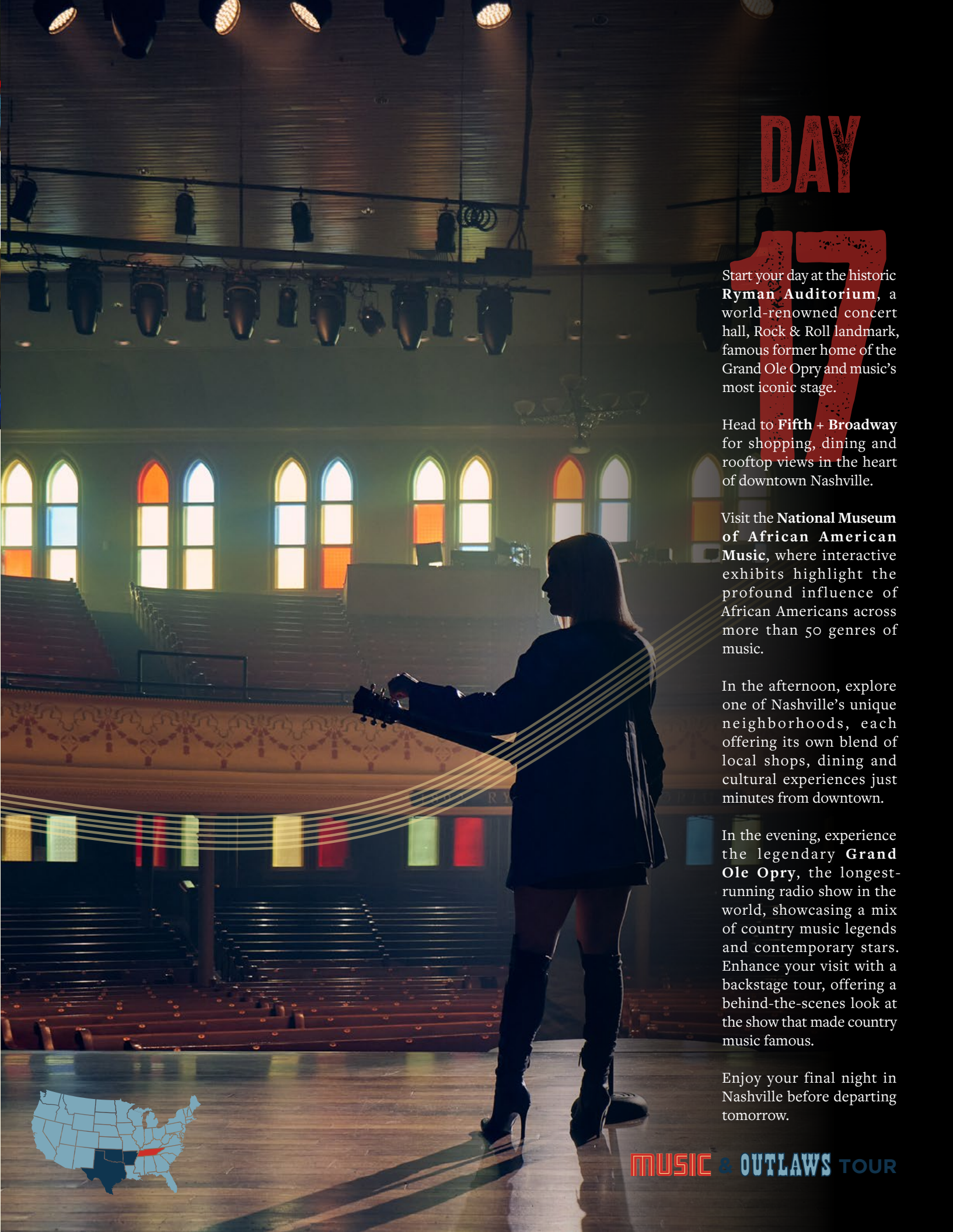
Enjoy a sweet stop at the **Goo Goo Shop & Dessert Bar**, where you can create a custom Goo Goo Cluster and learn the story behind America’s first combination candy bar.

Spend the afternoon exploring Nashville’s famous **Honky Tonk Highway** along Lower Broadway, lined with legendary venues, shops and nonstop live music.

In the evening, enjoy live performances at iconic spots like **Tootsie’s Orchid Lounge** and **Robert’s Western World**, where music is played 365 days a year.

Overnight stay in Nashville.

Start your day at the historic **Ryman Auditorium**, a world-renowned concert hall, Rock & Roll landmark, famous former home of the Grand Ole Opry and music’s most iconic stage.



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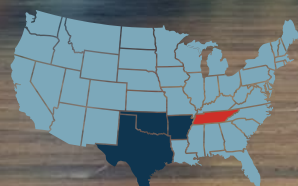
Head to **Fifth + Broadway** for shopping, dining and rooftop views in the heart of downtown Nashville.

Visit the **National Museum of African American Music**, where interactive exhibits highlight the profound influence of African Americans across more than 50 genres of music.

In the afternoon, explore one of Nashville’s unique neighborhoods, each offering its own blend of local shops, dining and cultural experiences just minutes from downtown.

In the evening, experience the legendary **Grand Ole Opry**, the longest-running radio show in the world, showcasing a mix of country music legends and contemporary stars. Enhance your visit with a backstage tour, offering a behind-the-scenes look at the show that made country music famous.

Enjoy your final night in Nashville before departing tomorrow.





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
