In 1859, Nash Farm was established when Thomas Jefferson Nash and his wife Elizabeth purchased 110 acres of farmland in Grapevine. Today, it's the oldest farmstead in Tarrant County exploring the life of Grapevine's earliest settlers.



### Did you know?

Thomas and Elizabeth Nash raised five daughters and a son. In 1869, a mere ten years after purchasing the land, the Nash Family built the green Farmhouse.

## 2026 FIRST FRIDAYS on the Farm

10 a.m. - Noon

Tickets \$5 advance admission or \$10 day of event

### March 6 – Spring Cleaning

Step back in time for a fun, hands-on day at the Farm, where guests learn how spring cleaning was done long ago. Children will make their own bar of soap and try the chores families from long ago completed in the Spring season. Some of these may include rug beating, airing out bedding and preparing the soil beds for Spring planting.

### May 1 – Pickles & Preserves

Help the Farmhands “put up” produce from the garden while it’s fresh and make some pickles to take home.

### Sept. 4 – Gadgets & Gears

Discover the gadgets and gears used to make farm work easier in the 1800s. You’ll take a spin on the hand-crank sewing machine, help make chicken feed with the corn-grinder, create your own buzz saw toy to take home and much more!

### Oct. 2 – Cowboy Cooking

Come make a tasty treat on the cattle trail and learn what a cowboy’s life was like in the 19th century. Practice your roping skills and stamp your own leather keychain to take home.

### Nov. 6 – Little House on the Grape Vine Prairie

Read excerpts from the classic children’s book series, *The Little House on the Prairie* and then bring them to life through hands-on activities. Taste johnny cakes hot off the griddle and make a tin-can lantern to take home. Each story-inspired activity lets the children experience the chores, crafts and fun of pioneer life.

### Dec. 4 – Prairie Christmas Prep

Help the Farmhands prepare for the Christmas season! Guests will make popcorn garland and paper chains to decorate the Farm. Plus create your own old-fashioned ornament to take home.

### Jan. 17 – Crocheting

Discover the heritage craft of crochet in this beginner-friendly class where you’ll learn how wool is transformed into yarn and then into beautiful handmade pieces. With step-by-step instruction, you’ll create your own project to take home, complete with all the supplies you need to keep stitching with confidence. \$30, tickets must be purchased in advance.

### Feb. 7 – Bacon and Sausage Making
