

Grapevine, Dallas and Fort Worth – Where the West and East Collide

Day 1 - Grapevine

Upon arrival, let us welcome you at the Grapevine Convention & Visitors Bureau's World Headquarters. This building was built to look like the grand hotels of the late 1800's. While at the Visitors Bureau, check out two galleries, which host revolving exhibits throughout the year. Then explore the Settlement to City Museums to learn the history of Grapevine, which was settled one year before Texas became a state.

Next, check out Grapevine's beautiful local galleries and working artisans including Giddens Gallery of Fine Art, Holder Dane Gallery and Vetro Glassblowing Studio & Gallery, just to name a few, located nearby.

Lunch can be arranged at one of a variety of family-owned eateries in Grapevine's Historic Main Street District or at Harvest Hall, with nine international kitchens to choose from. While at Harvest Hall, be sure to visit the Grapevine Observation Tower for amazing 360-degree views of the surrounding Grapevine area.

This afternoon, explore the Grapevine Urban Wine Trail. Did you know Texas is the 5th largest producer of wine in the USA? Tour one or multiple winery tasting rooms, and learn about grape growing and winemaking in Texas as you savor the flavor of Texas wines!

- Grapevine Food Tours or Wine Tours of Grapevine both offer guided tours that highlight Grapevine's history, wines and local cuisines.

Dinner may be arranged at a winery complete with entertainment or at any one of a variety of steakhouses and group friendly restaurants.

Day 2 – Fort Worth

This morning, depart for the Fort Worth Cultural District, where your group can tour up to five wonderful museums in a park-like setting. One museum you will not want to miss is the National Cowgirl Museum & Hall of Fame.

For lunch, depart for the Fort Worth Stockyards where you can enjoy Texas Barbeque. At the Fort Worth Stockyards, see Texas longhorn, shop Stockyards Station and visit the Texas Cowboy Hall of Fame before your return to Grapevine.

Ditch the motorcoach and return to Grapevine aboard the Grapevine Vintage Railroad where you can experience the rails of nostalgia. The train operates a seasonal round-trip excursion from Grapevine to the Historic Stockyards. *(Available weekends only)*

Tonight, enjoy dinner and entertainment at the Texas Star Dinner Theater. This fun murder-mystery dinner theater performance set in the 1880s of the wild west of Texas will have your group laughing all night long.

Day 3 - Dallas

Your tour would not be complete without a visit to the Sixth Floor Museum at Dealey Plaza in Dallas. Here a permanent exhibit examines the life, times, death and legacy of President John F. Kennedy through photographs, artifacts and videos.

Just a short drive up the road you will find Pioneer Plaza, home of the largest bronze monument of its kind in the world. The sculpture highlights the old cattle drives with a growing number of bronze, larger-than-life steer and their cowboy escorts.

This afternoon, tour Southfork Ranch, the famous home of the Ewing family in the hit television show "Dallas."

Dinner tonight may be arranged at a variety of Grapevine restaurants or plan a private dinner with live entertainment through the Grapevine Convention & Visitors Bureau. After dinner, enjoy a wide variety of complimentary, live musical entertainment options up and down Historic Main Street.

Day 4

Before heading home, make one final stop to Grapevine Mills and Bass Pro Shops Outdoor World to pick up those final items on your "take-home" list.
