

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the monarch butterfly is an iconic North American species whose multigenerational migration and metamorphosis from caterpillar to butterfly has captured the imagination of millions of Americans; and

WHEREAS, despite ongoing efforts to preserve their migration, monarchs across North America face significant challenges, including habitat destruction, pesticide exposure, and extreme weather exacerbated by climate change; and

WHEREAS, cities, towns and counties have a critical role to play to help save the monarch butterfly, and the City of Grapevine has played a leadership role by providing a habitat at public parks, median strips, community gardens and municipal buildings; and

WHEREAS, every resident of Grapevine can make a difference for the monarch by planting native milkweed and nectar plants to provide habitat for the monarch and pollinators in locations where people live, work, learn, play and worship; and

WHEREAS, on behalf of the people of the City of Grapevine who have already joined me in creating healthy habitat for these magnificent butterflies, I am honored to join other Mayors by signing the National Wildlife Federation's Mayors' Monarch Pledge.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, William D. Tate, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Grapevine, Texas, do hereby proclaim October 2025 as
