## CLEVELAND PARK

Head to Greenville's largest park with nature trails, playgrounds, workout stations, picnic shelters, green spaces, the Greenville Zoo, sports facilities, Rock Quarry Garden, and the Vietnam Veterans Memorial. You can sign up to feed the Giraffes at the Zoo! Make a U-turn & head back to Falls Park.

## FALLS PARK ON THE REEDY

This is Greenville's most iconic and picturesque park featuring the Reedy River, beautiful waterfalls & the 345-foot Liberty Bridge, which is designed to immerse you into the surrounding nature. Falls Park also features the Grand Bohemian Lodge with views of the falls, a luxurious spa, art collections, and outdoor dining at Between the Trees and Spirit & Bower.

## UNITY PARK

This 60-acre park with basketball courts, four state-of-the-art playgrounds, a 4,100-square-foot splash pad, two expansive green spaces, covered picnic tables, a 10,000-square-foot welcome center with restrooms, a first aid station, and an event space is the perfect stop on your tour.

## THE COMMONS

The Commons includes tenants like Automatic Taco, GB&D, The Community Tap, Methodical Coffee, Billiam, Greenville Bike & Tri Company, Gruffy Goat and Pangaea Brewing with more restaurants and businesses opening soon. It's designed as a pedestrian- and family-friendly gathering space where downtown energy meets relaxed entertainment and recreation.

### Have an extra 30 minutes?

Add Hampton Station to your tour by taking the Orange line of the SRT. Located in an abandoned cotton warehouse, it features a unique complex of locally owned businesses, food, drink, and games. Highlights include Craft Axe Throwing, Due South Coffee, Keipi, HOLLOWED EARTH Pottery, Pedego Bikes, and White Duck Taco Shop.

## SWAMP RABBIT CAFÉ & GROCERY
