- 79. Take a pic of one of Kenosha's most recognized landmarks: the North Pier Lighthouse. FREE
- 80. Visiting Wisconsin for the first time? Take a picture with the "Welcome to Wisconsin" sign at our Wisconsin Welcome Center Kenosha. Then go inside for another fun photo op! FREE
- 81. Visiting Kenosha for the first time? Ride an authentic Electric Streetcar to restaurants, shops, museums, historic districts, and more in Downtown Kenosha. \$1 & under
- 82. Come see our castle! Enjoy one-of-a-kind FREE photo spots and samples at Mars Cheese Castle.
- 83. Walk, bike, or drive through Kenosha's four historic districts. Explore and appreciate the architecture and history of the buildings. FREE
- 84. In the Library Park Historic District, view a plaque that notes the birthplace of acclaimed actor, writer, director, and producer Orson Welles. FREE
- 85. There's so much public art to enjoy in Kenosha including the Sculpture Walk HarborPark. Stroll through the outdoor "art gallery". FREE

- 87. Visit the sculpture that commemorates the second stop on the Winter Dance Party Tour (Buddy Holly, Ritchie Valens, The Big Bopper, and Dion and the Belmonts). The concert took place in Kenosha on January 24, 1959. FREE
- 88. Kenosha to Cosenza: Sister Cities Mural is a new mural on the side of the Italian American Supper Club. This collaborative mural celebrates the vibrant cultural connection between Kenosha and one of its sister cities: Cosenza, Italy. FREE
- 89. Get your picture taken with the Greetings From Kenosha mural by artist Kelly Witte in Downtown Kenosha. FREE
- 90. At the Kenosha harbor, take time to stop and reflect at the Veterans Memorial Fountain and Lone Soldier Memorial at Veterans Memorial Park. FREE
- 91. West of I-94, stop by the Kenosha County Veterans Memorial Park Honor Plaza, which serves as a tribute to veterans. FREE
- 92. Check out the Starry Night over Kenosha mural by artist Eric Houghton on the side of DeBerge's Framing & Gallery in the Uptown neighborhood. FREE
- 93. Kenosha is a Wisconsin Harbor Town! Relax and watch the sun rise over Lake Michigan. No matter the season, the sun still rises! FREE

- 94. Cheer on the Firebirds! Carthage College is a NCAA Division III program. Sports include football, cross country, basketball, volleyball, wrestling, soccer, and more. Ticket prices vary
- 95. Shop at Kenosha HarborMarket on Saturdays. It's outdoors at 2nd Avenue and 56th Street through October. Then it's inside the Woman's Club of Kenosha, November 8 through April (excluding December 13 & 27). FREE to browse
- 96. On Saturdays, shop at Kenosha Public Market. It's outdoors near Veterans Memorial Park through October, then inside the Kemper Center Simmons Auditorium through April (closed January 3). FREE to browse
- 97. Meet the makers at the Kenosha Art Market in the Union Park Arts District on October 19. FREE to browse
- 98. October is the last month of the year to climb the 1866 Southport Lighthouse tower for an amazing view (must be 8 or older)! The seasonal attraction re-opens in May. \$10 & under
- 99. Wilmot Flea Market happens at the Kenosha County Fairgrounds on Sundays through October 12. \$2 & under admission
- 100. Find fresh greens in the middle of winter at Grow Space Vertical Farms. Order your fresh, local, clean produce online and pick up in person. \$3 and up
- 101. Watch for this annual sign that winter is coming to an end: Big Star Drive-In re-opens around March 1. Prices vary
