LIFE BY THE LAKE

- 1. Ride an authentic Electric Streetcar along the lakefront and to museums, shops, restaurants, events, and more in Downtown Kenosha. \$1 & under for one loop
- 2. Lounge on a beach. Kenosha has five beaches on the Lake Michigan shore! FREE
- 3. Watch for fun events all summer long at the Kenosha Beach House on Simmons Island. The calendar includes the Ultimate Battle of Everything: A Performing Arts Showdown of Music, Dance & Talent, May 24-26, the Simmons Island Luau on June 28, and LakeFest on August 23. FREE admission
- 4. The Kenosha Beach House on Simmons Island also features Friday Bonfire Nights, each week from Memorial Day Weekend to Halloween. FREE; s'more kits for sale
- 5. Watching a beautiful sunrise over Lake Michigan needs to be at the top of your itinerary while visiting Kenosha! FREE
- 6. Hunt for sea glass / beach glass along the lake. FREE
- 7. Climb 72 steps to the top of the 1866 Southport Lighthouse tower for an amazing view of Lake Michigan. Open May through October (must be at least 8 years old). \$10 & under
- 8. Kids can cool off on a hot summer day at the splash pad near HarborPark. FREE
- 9. Take a pic of one of Kenosha's most recognized landmarks: the North Pier Lighthouse. FREE
- 10. Ride the historic Lakefront Trolley through Downtown Kenosha and along Lake Michigan. This rubber-wheel trolley operates seasonally. \$1 & under
- 11. At Simmons Island Beach, stroll along the boardwalk at Lake Michigan. This beach also features portable mobility mats on the sand during the summer days. FREE

NATURE BREAK

- 12. Get your 10,000 steps in while sightseeing in Kenosha! Find some suggested routes at VisitKenosha.com/Steps. Most of the routes are FREE to access
- 13. Bring your pooch to play at one of our many off-leash dog parks. Up to \$6 daily fee depending on park

- 14. At Hawthorn Hollow Nature Sanctuary and Arboretum, there are nearly five miles of trails with upland and floodplain forests, prairies, wetlands, flower gardens, historic buildings, a wildlife blind, a scenic boardwalk, a forest canopy overlook, and Hawthorn Hollow's Heritage Farmstead. FREE
- 15. Play disc golf at Fox River Park, Lincoln Park, Silver Lake Park, or the UW-Parkside campus. FREE
- 16. There are more than 150 miles of dedicated bike lanes and signed routes in Kenosha County, including the Kenosha County Bike Trail, the Pike Bike Trail, and mountain bike trails at Silver Lake Park. FREE
- 17. Go Fish! Fish anywhere in Wisconsin without a license on Free Fishing Weekend, June 7-8. FREE
- 18. Chiwaukee Prairie State Natural Area is a 482-acre remnant lake plain wet prairie, an ecological gem. Enjoy nature study, birding, photography, and hiking here. FREE
- 19. Play at Kenosha's inclusive, 100% accessible playground: the Dream Playground at Petzke Park. FREE
- 20. Go "over the river and through the woods" at Petrifying Springs Park a hiking and biking destination. FREE
- 21. Pringle Nature Center offers many tools to explore Bristol Woods Park including GPS units that are pre-programmed with the known geocaches and ecocaches located in the park. \$6 per unit for general public

MEET AT THE MARKET

- 22. Open year-round on Saturdays, the outdoor season of Kenosha Public Market begins May 10 near Veterans Memorial Park. It's inside Kemper Center through April. FREE admission
- 23. Kenosha HarborMarket® begins its outdoor season on May 10 at 2nd Avenue and 56th Street. Open year-round on Saturdays; its indoor season concludes April 26 at the Woman's Club of Kenosha. FREE admission
- 24. Meet the makers at the Kenosha Art Market in the Union Park Arts District on the third Sunday of the month, June through October. FREE admission
- 25. Search for treasures at Wilmot Flea Market. It takes place on Sundays, April 27 through October 12 (excluding August 10 and 17) at the Kenosha County Fairgrounds. Admission \$2 & under
- 26. On select days of the week, Farmers Markets occur at various City of Kenosha parks. They are open based on produce availability. FREE admission

FREE OUTDOOR CONCERT SERIES

- 27. Enjoy the Music at Twilight concert series on the lawn of Anderson Arts Center: June 3, June 17, July 1, July 15, July 29, August 12, and August 26. FREE
- 28. Tuesdays At The Shell happens at the Sesquicentennial Bandshell in Pennoyer Park along Lake Michigan, July 8 through August 26. FREE
- 29. It's a tradition! Spend Wednesday evenings with the Kenosha Pops Concert Band at the Sesquicentennial Bandshell, June 18 through August 6. FREE
- 30. Bristol Woods Park is the setting for Bristol Woodstock. The concert series happens on Wednesday evenings from June 11 through August 13. FREE
- 31. Lincoln Park Live happens at picturesque Lincoln Park on select Wednesdays: July 16, July 23, August 6, and August 20. FREE
- 32. Enjoy the Rhythm on the Lake Concert Series on Thursday evenings at Old Settlers Park, June 12 through August 21 (with the exception of July 3). FREE
- 33. Enjoy a serving of PB&J! Peanut Butter & Jam is a concert series on Thursdays, July 10 through August 28, at Veterans Memorial Park. FREE

PRESERVING HISTORY

- 34. Visit the Pritzker Military Museum & Library and go behind the stories that created history. \$5 & under
- 35. Tour a maritime museum! At the seasonal Southport Light Station Museum, learn about 40+ shipwrecks buried near Kenosha and see a model of the SS Wisconsin, which sank in Lake Michigan in 1929. FREE
- 36. On select weekends, the 1860s Durkee Mansion on the historic Kemper Center grounds is open to tour. FREE
- 37. Travel back in time 237 million years ago to the present at the Dinosaur Discovery Museum. FREE
- 38. Walk, bike, or drive through Kenosha's four historic districts. Explore and appreciate the architecture and history of the buildings. FREE
- 39. Book your spot on a Kenosha History Center historic walking tour. On select dates, three different historian-led tours are available: Old Northside, Third Avenue, and Library Park. \$10
- 40. At the Civil War Museum, the special exhibit "Civil War Innovation & Technology" explores the groundbreaking developments that reshaped medicine, transportation, communication, daily life, and warfare. FREE

- 41. West of I-94, stop by the Kenosha County Veterans Memorial Park Honor Plaza, which serves as a tribute to veterans. FREE
- 42. At the Kenosha Public Museum, visit the mammoths that were excavated right here in Kenosha County. FREE
- 43. Two special exhibits open August 16 at the Kenosha Public Museum. These are "Ancestral Women: Portraits of Elders from the 12 Tribes of Wisconsin" and "Women and Water: Woven Portraits from Around the World". FREE

- 44. Calling all made-in-Kenosha cars! The Kenosha Homecoming Car Show, produced by the Kenosha History Center, will be held July 22-27. A series of events will take place at various locations. The big car show is at Kennedy Park on Saturday, July 26. Car Show: FREE for spectators
- 45. Come show off your classic car at the Cruise-in Nights that take place outside the Kenosha History Center on May 30, August 29, and September 26. FREE
- 46. Bring your classic car to Cruise-in Nights at Bristol 45 Diner on the first, third, fifth Mondays of the month, May through September. FREE
- 47. On May 17, the Twin Lakes Area Chamber & Business Association produces Business In The Park and Car Show. FREE for spectators
- 48. The Father's Day Car Show at Baker Park is hosted by the Kenosha Classic Street Machine and the Vintage Auto Group. The date is June 15. FREE for spectators
- 49. Watch for the Kenosha Car Club Car Show to happen in June. FREE for spectators
- 50. The Port of Kenosha Beverage House hosts the 5th Annual Port Grand Prix (Hot Wheels tournament) on July 13. This is a fundraiser to place a bronze Al Molinaro statue outside the business. FREE for spectators
- 51. Are you a Volkswagen / Audi enthusiast? You won't want to miss the Kooler by the Lake show at Kennedy Park on August 9. FREE for spectators
- 52. The Art of the Car Car Show is August 23 at Kemper Center. FREE for spectators
- 53. Show off your car and see what Downtown Kenosha has to offer during the Kenosha Classic Cruise-In on August 30. FREE
- 54. August 31 is the Southern Wisconsin All Airborne Chapter Car Show at Petrifying Springs Park. This event benefits wounded veterans. FREE for spectators

- 90. Pick up some cheese curds at Brat Stop's Cheese Mart. Prices vary
- 91. Carhop service continues to this day in Kenosha! Get a taste of nostalgia with your order. The Spot Drive-In opened 80 years ago and is open year-round. Big Star Drive-In is seasonal; get there before Labor Day. Prices vary
- 92. Are you a first-time visitor to our state? You must get your pic with the Welcome to Wisconsin sign at the Wisconsin Welcome Center Kenosha! FREE
- 93. Stroll through the Sculpture Walk HarborPark, a biennial outdoor art exhibit that runs along the harbor. FREE
- 94. Fly down the 200-foot-long water slides at Washington Park Pool and Anderson Park Pool this summer. Prices varv
- 95. On the third Tuesday of every month, seniors (60 & over) can enjoy the Kenosha YMCA at no cost (photo ID required). FREE
- 96. Visit a local art gallery to be inspired. FREE to browse
- 97. Exhibits opening this summer at the Anderson Arts Center include the Wisconsin Visual Artists Exhibit and the Southport Quilters Guild Quilt Show. FREE
