

BRIDGE SPANS



The bridge spans feature a truss bridge structure now richly encrusted with macroalgae and soft corals. During deployment, road panels staked, creating small openings that allow divers limited views beneath the span, though the sunk structural elements prevent full penetration. While the structure itself is engaging, its thriving marine life is the main attraction. Schools of tomtate grunts, along with jacks and snapper, move through the trusses, while grey triggerfish, Atlantic spadefish, and barracuda are frequent visitors. The roadway hosts soft corals that shelter smaller species such as damselfish, blennies, and butterflyfish. Divers can also expect to spot queen and French angelfish cruising in pairs, with white spotted soapfish hiding along the railings.
