

ST. ANDREW'S JETTIES

The St. Andrews Jetty is the most popular shore dive in the Panama City Beach area, known for easy beach access and outstanding marine biodiversity. It's a great training ground for new divers, while still offering plenty of action for advanced divers who want to interact with a wide variety of fish in a dynamic environment.

The jetty's granite rocks closely mimic natural reef substrate, creating excellent habitat that functions much like a true reef. These rocks support dense marine life, including damselfish, sergeant majors, butterflyfish, snapper, grouper, angelfish, and many other reef species. Divers often spot octopus, seahorses, and batfish hiding among the rocks, while stingrays and flounder rest along the sand and spotted eagle rays cruise the channel. With depths ranging from shallow entry areas to deeper sections approaching 75 feet, the jetty offers a flexible, exciting dive that rewards careful exploration at every skill level.
