Stewart asked for a motion to approve the Consent Agenda as presented. On a motion from Board member Herb Gears and a second from Board member Karen Cooperstein the motion passed unanimously.

INDIVIDUAL CONSIDERATION

Resolution in Support of Opportunities for the City of Irving at Planned Unit Development 6.

A copy of the resolution recommended by the Destination Development Committee was distributed and included in the Board packet. Committee Chair Colvin Gibson entered a motion to approve the recommended Resolution as presented; with a second from Cooperstein, the motion passed unanimously.

BOARD CHAIR REPORT

- The new Board Member Orientation materials are in the Board portal and a link is also included in the Board packet. Stewart added the materials are useful information and a great resource for all Board members.
- Stewart referenced a Texas gambling legislative article in *The Dallas Morning News*. Considering
 the two meetings last week regarding the topic, he encouraged Board members to attend any
 related upcoming meetings.
- The next Board meeting is scheduled for March 24, 2025 at the Hotel Indigo Las Colinas.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Board and Business Development

Committee Chair Michael Basoco reported:

- A Board Development topics survey was distributed. Board members were encouraged to complete the survey to provide feedback to the Committee.
- The next Committee meeting is scheduled for March 14.

Community Engagement Committee

Committee Vice Chair Cambria Jones reported:

• The next meeting is April 15.

Destination Development Committee

Committee Chair Colvin Gibson reported:

- The Committee met on February 18 with a special panel discussion on transformational development. The panel included representatives from three distinctly different destinations and each panel member was asked to discuss outcomes from challenges in their city. Dialogue was centered on strategic positioning through business and leisure travel while enhancing the visitor experience.
- The next meeting is May 13.

CITY REPORTS

Mayor Rick Stopfer reported:

- Thanked Executive Director Maura Gast, the ICVB team and Board for bringing together discussions on destination resorts. He heard great feedback from the meeting. Destination development is happening all around us. He added 70% of the tax base in Irving is from Commercial/Retail business and 100% of sales tax is Retail. Hotel Occupancy Tax covers almost 1/3 of the City's debt. He understands there are reservations and beliefs that should be respected, but as a City it is important to continue to grow and be invested.
- Since the first of the year, there has been a groundbreaking for the new Fox News studio and a data warehouse center. Today is the groundbreaking for the new indoor Senter Park swimming pool in South Irving.
- Election season leads to misinformation, and he encouraged everyone to look at what has
 happened over the last few years in Irving with the Toyota Music Factory, Irving Golf Club, hotels
 and 650 restaurants. Irving needs to be competitive to be successful. The City is in better shape
 today with more opportunities than ever before.

City Manager Chris Hillman reported:

- Thanked the ICVB, Greater Irving-Las Colinas Chamber of Commerce, and Board for hosting discussion meetings with panelists and the Sands Corporation.
- Senter Park pool groundbreaking today represents a \$25 million investment for the indoor pool. It is replacing a 70-year-old pool and will now be a year-round facility for South Irving.
- Let's Play Irving project includes plans for Lee and Senter Park pools, as well a multi-generational Mustang Park Recreation and Aquatic Center. Replacing a 17,000 square foot facility with a new 125,000 square foot senior facility and indoor aquatic center. Construction will begin this summer and will be completed in the summer of 2027.



• The budget process is beginning. Looking forward to good budget conversations with Council in May and August.

BUREAU MANAGEMENT AND STAFF REPORTS

Bureau Management:

- Gast thanked everyone who attended the meetings last week at the Convention Center. It was a busy start to 2025.
- Gast announced ICC General Manager Tom Meehan's promotion to Regional Vice President of the Convention Center Group for ASM. Meehan will still manage the ICC, as well as a large geographically spread region. The Board congratulated Meehan on his promotion.
- Gast asked Senior Assistant City Attorney Christina Weber for any update on the two Hotel Occupancy Tax delinquent hotels. Weber noted there has been no update. A judgment will be entered soon.

Assistant Executive Director Sales and Services Lori Fojtasek reported:

- The Sales and Services complete report is included in the packet.
- Upcoming larger groups include the returning Southern Baptists of Texas Convention, Texas Steel
 Guitar Association at the Marriott DFW returning for over 20 years, Tri Delta with rooms at the
 Westin and Marriott Las Colinas.
- In April at the ICC, first-time group WeebCon with rooms at three hotels will be held welcoming 2,000 attendees.

Assistant Executive Director Marketing and Communications Diana Pfaff reported:

- The Marketing and Communications report is included in the packet.
- Headshots will be taken at the April 28 Board meeting. Proofs from the most recent shoot will be available to Board members at the March meeting.
- Holding an internal kickoff meeting this week for Red Bull Flugtag event and Pfaff thanked the Las Colinas Association for hosting.
- January saw 125,330 total website sessions, 6,561 blog pageviews, and gained 2,080 new social media followers.

Assistant Executive Director Finance and Administration Susan Rose reported:

- Budget and Accounting Director Marianne Lauda gave an update on two budget service hotels that were discussed at the Executive Committee meeting.
 - The OYO Hotel/DFW Airport North has paid HOT through December and is now current.
 The LaQuinta Inn & Suites DFW North is delinquent for October, November, and December.
 - The Wingate Inn by Wyndham DFW Airport North is delinquent for October only and City Finance has contacted them, but it appears the payment was lost in the mail. November and December have been paid. Lauda will keep the Executive Committee updated on these properties.
- Rose noted the complete Hotel Performance and Short-Term Rental Report is included in the packet.
- STR Hotel Performance Data for December 2024:
 - Hotel Occupancy rate was 53.5%, a decrease of 0.7% from last year.



- Average Daily Rate was \$116.43, an increase of 2.3% from last year.
- RevPAR was \$62.34, an increase of 1.6% from last year.
- Hotel Occupancy for Texas was 52.4%, and the U.S. was 53.2%, an increase of 1.1% from last year.
- Short term rental data shows there were 602 available listings in Irving. Occupancy was 50.5%, down 5.6% from last year and ADR was \$221.97, an increase of 25.6% over last year.
- Comparable hotel subset, the Occupancy rate was 50.1%, a decrease of 1.3% from last year and the Average Daily Rate was \$65.01, an increase of 3.7% from last year.
- The Finance and Administration team:
 - Employee surveys for ICVB and ICC have been completed for the upcoming Fired Up! training. The session focuses on our work culture and continuing to move the organization forward.
 - o IT is optimizing online security settings across all platforms.
 - o ICVB and ICC participated in a School Supply Drive for Irving ISD in February.

Gast added the Boards and Commissions dinner will be held on March 6 at the Convention Center. RSVPs should be returned to the City Secretary's Office.

CONVENTION CENTER MANAGEMENT

General Manager Tom Meehan reported:

- Meehan will still be involved in the ICC operations. He added this is one of the most special Convention Centers he has ever been around, and it is very close to him.
- Introduced Director of Sales Casey Villasenor and Regional Director of Operations Tony Watson.

Villasenõr reported:

- The full ICC Financial reports and General Manager's report for January 2025 is included in the packet.
- January had 12 events, and 7,263 visitors. YTD there were 47 events and 44,831 visitors.
- Future guest rooms booked were 1,506 for the month and 10,335 YTD.
- Customer Satisfaction Survey score for the month is 93.3%. and 94.4% YTD.
- Industry bookings in January include CareFlite Annual Meeting for October 2025 and Rhapsody Health in June 2025.
- February and March at-a-glance: first time for Southern Association of Agricultural Scientists 2025, Southern Baptists of Texas Convention with a full in-house event. Omnilife USA is an annual event to launch new products; WeebCon is hosting events at the Westin ICC Hotel and Texican Court; and a K-Pop event.

Watson reported:

- ICC projects include roof repairs, but a start date has not been set. Roof will add 20 years to the current warranty.
- First round of delivery for new lobby furniture will be on March 5.

- Occupancy reporting 60.4%, down 11.3% compared to last year.

- RevPAR of \$68.48, down 11.6% from comp set.
- January was slow due to the storms. February looks better and rate is up.

- Announcement of promotion for Irving Chamber of Commerce Lauren Campbell to Vice President
 of Investor Relations. Her expertise and passion to serve the Irving-Las Colinas community is
 unmatched.
- Love reminded the Board to vote in the Best of Irving by the end of February. Voting is available on the Chamber's website.

Embassy Channel Drainage Project Reaches Final Stages, Rochelle Road Bridge to Reopen in Early April



The Rochelle Road bridge, located between Fairbrook and Stonebrook Streets, is expected to reopen in early April, weather permitting. The bridge was reconstructed over the past 13 months as part of the Embassy Channel Drainage project.

Work on the Rochelle Road bridge includes the full demolition and reconstruction of the 63-year-old bridge, installation of a 10-by-7-foot concrete drainage structure under the roadway, and repaving the roadway from Stonebrook Street to N. MacArthur Boulevard.

Additional construction on the \$15.2 million Embassy Channel Drainage project, which spans

What is a 100-Year Flood?

100-year floods do not necessarily occur once every 100 years. Rather, a "100-year flood" refers to a flooding event that has a 1% chance (1 in 100) of occurring in a given year. This is why, though it is statistically unlikely, it is possible for a 100-year flood to occur more than once every 100 years.

While the City of Irving has not yet recorded a 100-year flood, it has experienced two 50-year flood events – one in 1990 and again in 2015.

from State Highway 183 to Rochelle Road, included widening the channel by 9 feet, deepening the channel by 5 feet, lowering sewer and water lines, and reconstructing the Weathered Street bridge. Embassy Channel improvements, which began in February 2023, significantly reduce the flood risk in the surrounding area, removing nearly 300 homes and businesses from

the 100-year flood risk.

Remaining work on the Embassy Channel Drainage project includes sodding and fencing replacement along the channel.

one long, hot, dry summer can change everything. So now is the perfect time to make water conservation a habit. Making small changes can help keep the water supply steady all year long.

Simple Ways to Save Water Outdoor Watering

Outdoor Watering Water early in the

- Water early in the morning or late in the evening to reduce evaporation.
- Follow twice-per-week and time-of-day watering instructions to limit water waste.
- Use native or drought-tolerant plants that need less water.
- Turn off sprinklers when rain is in the forecast.
- Remember: Time-of-day watering restrictions begin April 1 and go through Oct. 31. Watering is prohibited between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. and is limited to twice per week per the chart below.



Aggregated Weekly Definite Volume of 200+ DMOs



Aggregated Website Sessions of 200+ DMOs







Old and New Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex Venues That Set the Stage for Group Success

Once, the entire North Texas region was tall-grass prairie land inhabited by Native American tribes. The last remnant from that era is preserved as Blackland Prairie Park in Arlington. From settlement in the 1840s to the arrival of the railroads starting in the 1870s, a dramatic transformation was on.


In 1971, local civic leaders formed the North Texas Commission "to maximize the visibility of the area as an excellent place to live and do business" and in 1972 copyrighted "Southwest Metroplex" to identify the area's loose alliance of communities.

Expansion of the Metroplex has been meteoric ever since as billions of dollars continue to pour into new and expanded hotels, convention centers, sports venues and other group infrastructure, alongside commercial, community and Fortune 500-driven corporate growth.

Amid modernization's relentless advance, old guard landmarks stand their ground. Mixing the old with the new, here are some of the many group connections with the Metroplex's past, present and future.

Irving

In 1972, millionaire rancher Ben Carpenter began transforming his El Ranchito de Las Colinas ("the Little Ranch of the Hills") in Irving into one of America's first master-planned communities. Centrally located between Dallas and Fort Worth and close to DFW International Airport and Love Field, his 12,000-acre development, named Las Colinas, attracted 130-plus corporate firms in its first seven years.

Today, Las Colinas is the "Headquarters of Headquarters" of North Texas with more than 27 million square feet of office space and more corporate headquarters per capita than any other city, including a host of Fortune 500 and Fortune 1000 companies.

Irving has also been a magnet for hotel growth, offering nearly 13,000 rooms in 85-plus properties. Crown jewels include the former Four Seasons Club and Resort Dallas at Las Colinas.

Last year, the legendary luxury resort was relaunched as The Ritz-Carlton Dallas, Las Colinas following a \$55 million refresh. Integrating a 427-room hotel, 84,000 square feet of renovated meeting space, new lobby bar and other fetching elements, the property will play host to our three-day **Meetings Today LIVE! National event this April**.

The 2011 debut of the striking Irving Convention Center at Las Colinas, championed by Visit Irving Executive Director Maura Gast, laid the foundation for development of an integrated visitor district that today includes the 350-room Westin Convention Center Hotel and \$173 million Toyota Music Factory entertainment complex, anchored by an 8,000-seat indoor/outdoor amphitheater operated by Live Nation.

Irving's original soundtrack was the sound of steel wheels. In 1902, Otis Brown and J.O. Schulze of the Chicago, Rock Island & Gulf Railway founded Irving as a link between Dallas and Fort Worth. Brown's wife Netta loved legendary writer Washington Irving, Schulze belonged to the Washington Irving Literary Society, and thus Irving got its name.

The Irving Heritage District features a charming Main Street and Heritage Park attractions include the 1887 Caster Cabin and replica of the 1903 Rock Island Depot.

Other draws include the Mustangs of Las Colinas--the world's largest equestrian sculpture features nine bronze wild mustangs galloping across a lake--and Las Colinas Flower Clock, a working 20-foot-diameter clock made up of 10,000-plus flowers.

Hotel Performance

Irving's hotel occupancy rate for January was 58.9%, a decrease of 1.8% from last year. The Average Daily Rate (ADR) was \$128.35 an increase of 2.7% from last year and Revenue Per Available Room (RevPAR) was \$75.57 an increase of 0.9% from last year.

The hotel occupancy for Texas was 53.0%, a decrease of 3.4% from the previous year and the hotel occupancy for the US was 52.5%, which was an increase of 1.0% from the previous year.

Short Term Rental

For the month of January, there were 563 available listings in Irving. The occupancy rate was 39.8%, down 7.9% from last year and the ADR was \$209.08, an increase of 13.8% over last year.

For the hotel comparable subset, the occupancy rate was 41.1%, a decrease of 15.3% from last year and the ADR was \$66.73, a decrease of 4.6% from last year.








Last Six Months Performance vs. Previous Year










